In accordance with Board Policy 9324, Board Minutes, all Regular School Board Meetings will be audio recorded.

II. INSTRUCTIONS FOR PRESENTATIONS TO THE BOARD BY PARENTS AND CITIZENS PRESENT AT THIS MEETING

We are pleased you can be with us at this meeting, and we hope you will return often. Your visit assures us of continuing community interest in our schools.

The members of the Board of Trustees of this District are locally elected state officials, who serve four-year terms of office, and who are responsible for the educational program of our community from grades kindergarten through twelve. They are required to conduct programs of the schools in accordance with the State of California Constitution, the State Education Code, and other laws relating to schools enacted by the Legislature, and policies and procedures which this Board adopts.

The Board is a policy-making body whose actions are guided by the school district's Mission and Goals. Administration of the District is delegated to a professional administrative staff headed by the Superintendent.

The agenda and its extensive background material are studied by each member of the Board for at least two days preceding the meeting. Board Members can call the administrative staff for clarification on any item, and many of the items on the agenda were discussed by the Board during previous meetings. These procedures enable the Board to act more effectively on agenda items than would otherwise be possible.

WHAT TO DO IF YOU WISH TO ADDRESS THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

ITEMS ON THE AGENDA. Any person may address the Board concerning any item on the agenda and may, at the discretion of the Board, be granted three (3) minutes to make a presentation to the Board at the time a specific item is under discussion. However, the time assigned for individual presentations could be fewer than three (3) minutes depending upon the total number of speakers who wish to address a specific agenda topic. Prior to the opening of the meeting, a Request to Address the Board card (located in the foyer) should be completed and submitted to the Secretary of the Board. The total time devoted to presentations to the Board shall not exceed twenty (20) minutes, unless additional time is granted by the Board. All presentations shall be heard by the Board prior to the formal discussion of the agenda topic under consideration. Once an agenda item has been opened for public comment, no additional "Request to Address the Board of Trustees" cards shall be accepted for that topic.

ORAL COMMUNICATIONS (Non-Agenda Items). Citizens may address the Board on any item not appearing on the agenda. Individual presentations are limited to three (3) minutes per individual, with twenty (20) minutes in total being devoted for this purpose, but could be less if there are a large number of Oral Communication speakers. Legally, the Board may not take action on items raised by speakers under Oral Communications. However, at its discretion, the Board may refer items to the administration for follow-up or place topics on a future Board agenda.

PUBLIC HEARINGS. Anytime the Board schedules a separate public hearing on any given topic, it shall not hear speakers on that topic before the public hearing, except as to the scheduling of the hearing, nor shall it hear speakers after the hearing, except as to changes in the policy or recommended actions which are directed at the time of the hearing.

CLOSED SESSION. In accordance with Education Code Section 35146 and Government Code Section 54957, the Board may recess to Closed Session to discuss personnel matters which they consider inadvisable to take up in a public meeting.

REASONABLE ACCOMMODATION

In order to help ensure participation in the meeting of disabled individuals, appropriate disability-related accommodations or modifications shall be provided by the Board, upon request, in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). Persons with a disability who require a disability-related accommodation or modification, including auxiliary aids and services in order to participate in a Board meeting, shall contact the Superintendent or designee in writing by noon on the Friday before the scheduled meeting. Such notification shall provide school district personnel time to make reasonable arrangements to assure accessibility to the meeting.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Each year the Capistrano Unified School District applies for and receives a contract through the California Department of Education Child Development Division for the continued funding of preschool services. State preschools are a comprehensive developmental program for three-to-five year old children from low-income families. The program emphasizes parent education and involvement. In addition to preschool education activities, other components include health, nutrition, social services, and staff development.

To achieve its goal of making early childhood education accessible to disadvantaged children, the district is scheduled to continue the operation of state funded preschool programs for the 2009/10 school year at Concordia, Crown Valley, Don Juan Avila, R.H. Dana, Hankey, Hidden Hills, Kinoshita, Las Palmas, Lobo, Palisades, San Juan, Viejo, and Wood Canyon Elementary Schools. Within these schools, approximately 650 children will receive early education/intervention services.

CURRENT CONSIDERATIONS

This agenda item requests Board approval of Resolution No. 0910-05, Exhibit A, to accept state preschool funds, which permit the continued operation of the program.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The state funded preschool contract provides a maximum reimbursable amount of \$2,799,507 for a minimum of 245 days of operation during the 2009/10 school year. There is no adverse impact on the general fund.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

It is respectfully recommended that the Board approve Resolution No. 0910-05, Exhibit A, to accept contract funding for CUSD's state funded preschool program for the 2009/2010 school year.

WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF REHABILITATION

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Transition services to prepare high school students with disabilities for self sufficiency and employment are mandated by the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) 2004 legislation.

The Capistrano Unified School District's (CUSD) Board of Trustees has approved and supported collaborative contracts between the Department of Rehabilitation and CUSD since 1992. These contracts have included the Transition Partnership Project (TPP), Bridges to Youth Self Sufficiency, and other specialized funding programs. These programs have represented cutting edge transition practices for students with disabilities.

CURRENT CONSIDERATIONS

Recently, funds have been made available to agencies pursuant to the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009. The California Department of Rehabilitation has received a portion of the federal stimulus funds for its programs. Collaborative transition programs sponsored by the Department of Rehabilitation, including TPP, have been identified to receive additional funding to enhance and expand transition services for the period of July 1, 2009, to September 30, 2010. The final ARRA contract budgets may be increased based on the number of Department of Rehabilitation cooperative programs accepting ARRA contracts.

This agenda item requests Board approval of these ARRA funds, which will provide new program services including the expansion of community business connections and employment development programs, as well as providing additional support for students/clients in work environments, and authorizes Education Division staff to sign the agreement on behalf of the District. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The District has been offered funding during the five fiscal quarters of this program. During the period of July 1, 2009, to June 30, 2010, the District has been allocated \$109,226 for development of the new business/community connections, employment programs, employment development, and support services. An additional \$26,847 has been allocated for the period of July 1, 2010, to September 30, 2010.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

It is respectfully recommended the Board of Trustees approve implementation of the interagency agreement with the Department of Rehabilitation for the period of July 1, 2009, through September 30, 2010.

PROGRAM STUDENT PARTICIPATION IN MISSION HOSPITAL

PROJECT SEARCH

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) of 2004 mandates life-skill training and employment transition services for high school students with disabilities so that they can become self-sufficient adults.

In 2003, Capistrano Unified School District (CUSD) elected to participate in a national study sponsored by the Social Security Administration and administered by the California Department of Rehabilitation. The Bridges to Youth Self Sufficiency study was undertaken to identify strategies to increase employment and enhance benefit planning. In the six years of the Bridges Project, CUSD demonstrated that 65% of persons with severe disabilities could be employed.

One of the initiatives undertaken as a result of the Bridges Project was a CUSD/Mission Hospital partnership with the goal of developing the social and employment skills of students with severe disabilities. This partnership, Mission Hospital Project SEARCH, provides rotating internship sites throughout Mission Hospital designed to teach students these skills. Project SEARCH is now in its third year. Over 15 CUSD students have participated in the hospital program, and two of those students have become employees of Mission Hospital—one as the front office receptionist to the Mission Hospital CEO! Through Project SEARCH, Mission Hospital staff has demonstrated dedication to their values: dignity, excellence, justice, and commitment. In 2008-09 and 2009-10, CUSD's Adult Transition and Transition Programs have received offers of funding support to provide additional student employment training in the hospital setting.

CURRENT CONSIDERATIONS

CUSD Transition Program staff wrote a proposal in response to the 2009-10 St. Joseph Health System Foundation's Wellness and Prevention Initiative with the following goals:

- · to include more students
- to increase student job readiness
- to expand social and employment skill instruction

- to increase hospital job sites
- to develop alternative employment sites and
- to develop skill measurements for students

The CUSD proposal was accepted by the Health System Foundation Initiative review committee, and funding has been allocated to address the areas outlined in the proposal.

This agenda item requests Board approval to accept the sum of \$23,000 to support and expand Adult Transition Program student participation in Mission Hospital Project SEARCH.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

Mission Hospital has offered the sum of \$23,000 to CUSD to support and expand Adult Transition Program student participation in Mission Hospital Project SEARCH. There is no adverse impact on the general fund.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

It is respectfully recommended the Board of Trustees approve acceptance of St. Joseph Health System funding to support and expand the services and capacity of Mission Hospital Project SEARCH as outlined in the CUSD 2009-10 Mission Hospital Wellness and Prevention Initiative proposal. COMMUTE PROGRAM (JARC)

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act of 2004 (IDEA) recognizes the importance of preparing students with disabilities for employment and self sufficiency in the community through transition activities. IDEA has placed significant unfunded requirements on school districts to provide effective services in this area. Beginning in 1992, CUSD staff developed several grant funded programs such as the Transition Partnership Project (TPP), Workability I, Projects With Industry (PWI), and the Bridges to Work Self-Sufficiency Social Security Administration grants/contracts that address these federal requirements.

Demands for services have increased with student numbers and transition requirements. Transition activities must be addressed in the Individual Education Plan (IEP) of each student (ages 16-22) in Special Education and best practice dictates beginning at age 14. Major barriers to student skill training, employment, and community integration are the lack of transportation-to-work training and job sites.

CURRENT CONSIDERATIONS

Federal funding through the Job Access and Reverse Commute Program and New Freedom programs have been awarded through the Orange County Transit Authority to Irvine Unified School District in collaboration with Capistrano Unified School District and Saddleback Valley Unified School District. The federal New Freedom Program seeks to expand transportation options for persons with disabilities to facilitate workforce integration and full participation in the community. The grant has been issued for a two-year period.

A part-time transportation coordinator for CUSD will be funded through this agreement to collaborate with all three districts to provide transportation through a contracted transportation carrier selected through a bid process.

CUSD / IUSD Memorandum of Understanding Job Access and Reverse Commute August 10, 2009 Page 2

This agenda item requests Board approval of a Memorandum of Understanding with Irvine Unified School District for the two-year period 2009-2011 and authorizes Education Division staff to sign the agreement for the District. The Memorandum of Understanding and additional supporting information is available for review upon request through the Special Education Department.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The District will receive from Irvine Unified School District approximately \$28,871 per year during the two year grant period. These funds will be disbursed to CUSD on a monthly prorated basis.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

It is respectfully recommended the Board of Trustees approve the Memorandum of Understanding with Irvine Unified School District for the two-year period 2009-2011.

IB SECONDARY MATH TEXTBOOK

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The State does not review or recommend specific textbooks for high schools. Individual school districts determine appropriate standards-based programs. In CUSD, math department chairs and teacher committees reviewed available materials at vendor fairs and decided which books to pilot in the classrooms. This process began in spring 2008 for Algebra II, AP Statistics, Pre-Calculus, Personal Finance, and IB Mathematics SL. In September 2008, 13 high school math teachers piloted selected textbooks for these courses.

All pilot teachers used potential materials in their classrooms from September 2008 to December 2008. In January 2009 the committee selected the following textbooks to recommend to the Board of Trustees for adoption:

- Algebra 2, California/Pearson/Prentice Hall 2008
- Precalculus W/Limits: Graphing Approach/Houghton Mifflin 2008
- Stats: Modeling the World/Pearson/Addison-Wesley 2010
- Mathematics for Business & Personal Finance/Glencoe/McGraw 2010

On April 13, 2009, the Board of Trustees approved those mathematics textbooks.

CURRENT CONSIDERATIONS

This agenda item proposes Board adoption of an additional mathematics textbook, *Standard Level Mathematics*, Pearson Education, for use in IB Mathematics SL. This textbook will also be used at Capistrano Valley High School for ATMS Honors Pre-Calculus. A copy of the proposed textbook is on display in the Board Room this evening and has been available for review at the Instructional Media Center. This textbook has been reviewed and compared to the Math Framework for California Public Schools 6-12 and is aligned with state standards, meeting the criteria set forth in the Education Code. Following Board approval, textbooks may be purchased as funding becomes available.

Instructional Materials Recommended for Adoption: IB Secondary Math Textbook August 10, 2009 Page 2

The proposed materials have been reviewed by the Instructional Materials Review Committee and, by a vote of 8-0, the committee recommended adoption of this textbook.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The California Department of Education provides textbook funding through the Instructional Materials Funding Realignment Program (IMFRP). IMFRP funds are classified as Tier III as part of the flexibility given to categorical funds. \$5,000 has been budgeted to purchase these textbooks.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

It is respectfully recommended that the Board approve the recommendation of the Instructional Materials Review Committee and authorize the purchase of *Standard Level Mathematics*, Exhibit A.

GENERAL OVERVIEW/BACKGROUND

District Overview

- 7. **Originality of Services:** CONSULTANT agrees that all technologies, formulae, procedures, processes, methods, writings, and ideas, dialogue, compositions, recordings, teleplays and video productions prepared for, written for, submitted to the DISTRICT and/or used in connection with this AGREEMENT, shall be wholly original to CONSULTANT and shall not be copied in whole or in part from any other source, except that submitted to CONSULTANT by DISTRICT as basis for such services.
- 8. **Copyright/Trademark/Patent:** CONSULTANT understands and agrees that all matters produced under this AGREEMENT shall become the property of DISTRICT and cannot be used without DISTRICT's express written permission. DISTRICT shall have all right,

Notice shall be deemed given when received by the CONSULTANT or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

DISTRICT may terminate this AGREEMENT upon written notice of intention to terminate for cause. Cause shall include: (a) material violation of the AGREEMENT by the CONSULTANT; or (b) any act by CONSULTANT exposing the DISTRICT to liability to others for personal injury or property damage; or (c) CONSULTANT is adjudged bankrupt, CONSULTANT makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors or a receiver is appointed due to CONSULTANT's insolvency. Written notice by DISTRICT shall contain the reasons for such intention to terminate and unless within ten (10) days after service of such notice the condition or violation shall cease, or satisfactory arrangements for the correction thereof be made, this AGREEMENT shall, upon the expiration of ten (10) days cease and terminate. In the event of such termination, the DISTRICT may secure the required services from another contractor. If the cost to the DISTRICT exceeds the cost of providing the service pursuant to this AGREEMENT, the excess cost shall be charged to and collected from the CONSULTANT. The foregoing provisions are in addition to, and not a limitation of, any other rights or remedies available to the DISTRICT. Written notice by DISTRICT shall be deemed given when received by the other party, or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

10. **Hold Harmless:** CONSULTANT agrees to and shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the DISTRICT, its Governing Board, officers, agents, employees and volunteers from all claims, including active and passive claims, losses, costs, attorney fees and expenses arising out of any liability or claim of liability for personal injury, bodily injury to persons or death, furnishing or use of any copyrighted or uncopyrighted matter or patented or unpatented

invention, contractual liability, and damage to property sustained or claimed to have been sustained arising out of activities/services provided by CONSULTANT or its subcontractors,

whether authorized by this Agreement or not. CONSULTANT further agrees to waive all rights of subrogation against the DISTRICT. The provisions of this article do not apply to any damage or losses caused solely by the negligence or willful misconduct of DISTRICT or any of its agents or employees.

- 11. **Insurance:** Pursuant to Section 10, CONSULTANT agrees to carry a commercial general liability insurance and automobile liability insurance with limits of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage in a form mutually acceptable to both parties to protect CONSULTANT and DISTRICT against liability or claims of liability, which may arise out of the AGREEMENT. In addition, CONSULTANT agrees to provide an endorsement to this policy stating, "Such insurance as is afforded by this policy shall be primary, and any insurance carried by DISTRICT shall be excess and noncontributory." No later than the actual start date, CONSULTANT shall provide DISTRICT with certificates of insurance evidencing all coverages and endorsements required hereunder including a thirty (30) day written notice of cancellation or reduction in coverage. CONSULTANT agrees to name DISTRICT and its officers, agents and employees as additional insured's by separate endorsement under said policy.
- 12. **Assignment:** The obligations of the CONSULTANT pursuant to this AGREEMENT shall not be assigned by the CONSULTANT.
- 13. Compliance with Applicable Laws: The services completed herein must meet the approval of the DISTRICT and shall be subject to the DISTRICT's general right of inspection to secure the satisfactory completion thereof. CONSULTANT agrees to comply with all federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances that are now or may in the future become applicable to CONSULTANT, CONSULTANT's business, and personnel engaged in operations covered by this AGREEMENT or accruing out of the performance of such operations.

PURPOSES

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Capistrano Unified School District (CUSD) was contacted by representatives with Pacific Bell Telephone Company regarding their desire to add underground communications equipment within a section of street frontage at Arroyo Vista School on District property. The proposed addition consists of fiber-optic equipment to enhance the communications capabilities for the immediate community. Specifically, the equipment includes a second utility cabinet to be placed immediately adjacent to an existing cabinet installed in 1989. CUSD staff recently met with the Pacific Bell representatives at the site to ensure there would be no "line-of-site" safety issues for students walking to school and drivers exiting the school dropoff area.

In Pacific Bell's review of the property's legal description, it was discovered that an easement for the existing cabinet and conduit was never recorded. Therefore, Pacific Bell is now seeking a "Grant of Easement" from the District for both the existing and proposed equipment. On July 13, 2009, the Board approved Resolution 0910-03 – a resolution of intention to convey an easement and call a public hearing. The next step in the process is to hold a public hearing and approve a resolution to convey the easement. If approved, Pacific Bell representatives will coordinate with District staff on the least intrusive timing of the installation.

CURRENT CONSIDERATIONS

This agenda item pertains to the Board of Trustees holding a public hearing and approving Resolution No. 0910-06 - Resolution of the Board of Trustees of the Capistrano Unified School District Conveying and Easement for Public Utility Purposes – attached as Exhibit A.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The execution of the Grant of Easement and the construction of the communications equipment will not have a financial impact on the District. All construction and equipment costs will be paid by Pacific Bell.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

It is respectfully requested that the Board of Trustees hold a public hearing and approve Resolution No. 0910-06 - Resolution of the Board of Trustees of the Capistrano Unified School District Conveying and Easement for Public Utility Purposes.

RESOLUTION NO. 0910-06

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CAPISTRANO UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT CONVEYING AN EASEMENT FOR PUBLIC UTILITY PURPOSES

WHEREAS, Section 17556 et seq. of the Education Code authorizes the Capistrano Unified School District ("District") to convey an easement on District's real property to the State of California or to a political subdivision or municipal corporation of the State of California for public street or highway purposes, either with or without consideration and without a vote of the electors of the District first being taken or to convey an easement on District's real property to any public corporation or private corporation engaged in the public utility business without a vote of the electors of the District first being taken for public utility purposes; and

WHEREAS, on July 13, 2009, the Board of Trustees ("Board") declared its intention to convey an easement over a small portion of District's real property located at Arroyo Vista School to the Pacific Bell Telephone Company dba AT&T California ("Company") for public utility purposes to enable the Company to construct, operate, maintain, replace, remove and renew the facilities and appurtenances together with the right of ingress thereto and egress therefrom over, under, and across the real property as described on the map and legal description attached to this Resolution as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, all statutorily required notices were given, and on August 10, 2009, the Board of the District held a Public Hearing on the question of conveying the easement, at which hearing all persons so desiring were afforded an opportunity to be heard and no opposition was presented at the Public Hearing.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Trustees does hereby resolve as follows:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct.

Section 2. Approval of Conveyance of Easement. The Board of the District hereby approves the easement conveyance, as described in the Resolution of Intention to Convey an Easement adopted on July 13, 2009 and as described on the map and legal description attached to this Resolution as Exhibit A. The President of the Board or any other member of the Board or the Secretary of the Board is hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver to the Pacific Bell Telephone Company dba AT&T California for recordation the Grant of Easement attached hereto as Exhibit A. Upon delivery and acceptance by the Pacific Bell Telephone Company dba AT&T California, the Grant of Easement shall be fully effective.



SUBJECT: LIMITED USE LICENSE AGREEMENT BETWEEN CUSD AND SAMLARC

FOR USE OF ARROYO VISTA PARK

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Arroyo Vista School is located adjacent to Arroyo Vista Park in the City of Rancho Santa Margarita. The park is owned and maintained by the Rancho Santa Margarita Landscape and Recreation Corporation (SAMLARC), a non-profit homeowners association. Over the last several years, students from Arroyo Vista School have been using the adjacent park field for various activities, operating under a Limited Use License Agreement. The additional field space benefits the students with greater recreational and physical education opportunities.

CURRENT CONSIDERATIONS

This agenda item pertains to the approval of the renewal of the Limited Use License Agreement between Capistrano Unified School District and SAMLARC. Exhibit A, attached, is a copy of the Limited Use License Agreement for student use of Arroyo Vista Park.

The Limited Use License Agreement was developed to provide general provisions defining each agency's responsibilities. The agreement also defines the terms and conditions for the district's use of park, fees to cover maintenance of the field space, as well as insurance and liability provisions. School personnel have provided their input regarding the anticipated type and amount of student use of the park for the upcoming school year. The Limited Use License Agreement has been reviewed and approved by legal counsels with the school district and SAMLARC.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

This agenda item will have an impact on the district's General Fund. Fees for use of the park are \$5,000 for the entire 2009-2010 school year. SAMLARC will be responsible for all on-going maintenance of the park fields.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

It is respectfully recommended the Board of Trustees approve the Limited Use License Agreement (Exhibit A attached) between Capistrano Unified School District and SAMLARC, for district use of Arroyo Vista Park during the 2009-2010 school year.

RECITALS

- A. SAMLARC is the owner of certain real property located in the County of Orange, State of California, described as Lot 4, Tract No. 13084, as per map filed in Book 618, Pages 43 48, inclusive, of Miscellaneous Maps, located in the records of the County of Orange (hereinafter the "Park") and more commonly known as Arroyo Vista Park (See Exhibit "A").
- B. The Park is located within a planned community known as Rancho Santa Margarita and is maintained by SAMLARC. Members of the planned community pay monthly assessments to SAMLARC which are used in part for the upkeep, repair, improvements and maintenance of the Park.
- C. The members and property of SAMLARC (including the Park) are subject to the Amended and Restated Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions recorded on April 24, 1986, as Instrument No. 86-162928 in the office of the Orange County Recorder (hereinafter "Declaration"). The Declaration provides that SAMLARC has the authority and the duty to maintain and manage the Park.
- D. CUSD which defines "Elementary School" as Kindergarten through Fifth Grade, owns and operates an Elementary School, known as Arroyo Vista School ("School") adjacent to the Park. CUSD is desirous of utilizing the Park for limited Elementary School related Activities as set forth on Exhibit "B".
- E. SAMLARC is willing to grant CUSD the right to use that portion of the Park shown on Exhibit "C" for limited Elementary School (K-5) related Activities, in accordance with the terms of this License.

IT IS HEREBY AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES AS FOLLOWS:

- 1.00 <u>Recitals Incorporated</u>. The above RECITALS are an integral part of the License and are incorporated herein by this reference.
- 1.01 <u>CUSD License to Enter and Use the Park</u>. SAMLARC hereby grants to CUSD a non-exclusive license to enter upon and use, as limited and described herein the area of the Park shown on Exhibit "C", for the limited activity purposes set forth herein and for no other purpose, subject to CUSD's strict compliance with all the terms of this License; provided, that CUSD's use of the Park shall not unreasonably interfere with the reasonable use and enjoyment thereof by SAMLARC or any persons claiming the right to use the Park through, by or under SAMLARC. All such use of the Park pursuant to this License shall also be in accord with the Detailed Use Guidelines as shown on Exhibit "D" instituted by SAMLARC.
- 1.02 Purpose of CUSD License Use. It is hereby understood and agreed that CUSD shall have the limited right to enter upon and use the Park, for Elementary School related Activities, as shown and described on Exhibit "B", which are compatible and consistent with the improvements located upon those areas of the Park shown on Exhibit "C". Such use shall not include Physical Education classes, team sports practice and/or games, whether intramural or interschool, nor any special events beyond those shown on Exhibit "B" without the prior written approval of SAMLARC.
- Limitations on CUSD Right to Enter and Use. The limited rights of entry and use granted by this License to CUSD are: (a) limited to the specific purposes provided for herein; and (b) non-exclusive to the extent that other persons also have or will acquire non-exclusive rights for the use and enjoyment of the Park; (c) shall occur during the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. on Regular School Days only as described in Section 4.01 hereinbelow; (d) conditioned upon the obligation of CUSD to inspect the area(s) of the Park to be used by the Elementary School, prior to each use, to assure its suitability for such use; and (e) given with the understanding that in addition to the limitations shown on Exhibit "C", such use shall not take place on Lot F of Tract 13084. For purposes of this License, "Regular School Days" shall mean only those days when classes are held during the normal school year. "Regular School Days" shall not include: Federal and State holidays; in-service days; nor summer, winter or other vacation or break days. SAMLARC, except as otherwise specifically set forth herein, shall continue to exclusively control the management, improvements, maintenance, repair and restoration of the Park, which include the right to temporarily restrict access to the Park by CUSD, in the reasonable performance of such activities.
- 1.03.1 <u>Nuisance</u>. No activity within the Park allowed/sponsored/supported by CUSD, whether supervised by CUSD or not, may be or become a nuisance to other Park users, neighboring property owners or SAMLARC.

- 1.03.2 <u>Vehicles</u>. No vehicle access on, upon, over or into the Park is granted to CUSD by this License.
- 1.03.3 <u>Animals</u>. No right or permission to bring an animal or animals of any kind or type, on, upon, over or into the Park is granted to CUSD by this License.
- 1.03.4 <u>Construction</u>. No right or permission to construct, install, or erect any structure, device or other item, regardless of size, use or function, whether temporary or permanent on, upon, over or in the Park is granted to CUSD by this License.
- 1.04 <u>Management</u>. SAMLARC will retain the exclusive right to make management decisions concerning the use of the Park. This management right will include the right to establish, amend, implement and enforce reasonable rules and regulations for the use of the Park by its own members of the planned community, and CUSD. This management right includes but is not limited to the right to establish the level of maintenance of the Park.
- 2.01 <u>Term.</u> This License shall begin September 8, 2009 and end on June 23, 2010. SAMLARC covenants and agrees not to sooner terminate the license granted hereby prior to the ending date specified herein provided CUSD has complied and continues to comply with all of the terms of this License, and is not in default under any of the terms and conditions hereof.
 - 3.01 (Intentionally Left Blank)
- 3.02 <u>Sharing of Expenses</u>. CUSD hereby promises, covenants, agrees and commits to pay to SAMLARC the following expenses as a portion of the consideration for the grant of this license:
- (a) A proportion of the annual costs and expense of operation and maintenance of the Park. This proportion of the cost will represent a share of the normal and regular operation, maintenance and repair expenses incurred by SAMLARC relative to the Park. These expenses specifically include the cost of operation and maintenance and repair of the CUSD use area shown on Exhibit "C" which are part of the license granted to CUSD. During the term of this License the amount of these normal costs and expenses payable by CUSD is agreed to be Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00).
- (b) During the term of this License, CUSD shall be responsible for and pay any extraordinary expenses incurred and/or for any abnormal damage done to the Park by CUSD beyond the normal wear and tear experienced from everyday use by members of the planned community. In determining the nature and the extent of any abnormal damage to the Park, SAMLARC's landscape contractor whose services are utilized by SAMLARC, shall make the final decision in determining the nature and extent of the abnormal damage. Any and all repair work occasioned by abnormal damage done to the Park by CUSD shall be done by SAMLARC's landscape contractor and shall be billed to CUSD. CUSD shall pay such billing within thirty (30) days of receipt.

- (c) Such other expenses and costs as are mutually agreed upon in writing from time to time by SAMLARC and CUSD.
- 3.03 <u>Payment Schedule Period</u>. For this term, the CUSD share of annual costs and expenses under this License shall be billed to CUSD. Payment in full shall be due no later than September 30, 2009.
- 3.04 <u>Late Charges and Interest</u>. Any payment due hereunder which is paid more than fifteen (15) days after the due date, shall be subject to a 15% late charge which shall be due when levied. Additionally, any payment, including late charges, which is not paid within thirty (30) days of its due date shall be subject to interest at the rate of 12% per annum from the 30th day until the amount shall be paid in full.
- Bliminating Damage to the Park. When an activity of CUSD is causing excessive damage to the Park, CUSD shall, at the written request of SAMLARC, discontinue such activity. In the alternative, CUSD may within thirty (30) days of any such request to discontinue by SAMLARC provide sufficient cash to repair the existing damage and to periodically repair the damage caused by the activity complained of together with a discontinuance of the activity periodically for a sufficient length of time for the repairs to be made by SAMLARC to the damaged areas of the Park. The amount of such cash and the frequency of such repair shall be set by SAMLARC. SAMLARC agrees to give CUSD five (5) days written notice of such repair work and the need for CUSD to discontinue use of a portion of the Park prior to the repair commencing. Notwithstanding the above, should an emergency arise which requires immediate repair and/or restoration SAMLARC may make such repair and/or restoration with shorter notice or no notice at all to CUSD prior to commencing the repairs. SAMLARC agrees to use its best efforts to accommodate the School schedule in making such repairs.
- 4.01 <u>Priority of Use</u>. During all Regular School Days, and so long as CUSD is current in the payment of its obligations under this License and not otherwise in breach of this License, CUSD shall be entitled to a priority of use of the Park for the limited Elementary School related Activities, as shown and described on Exhibit "B", during the within specified times: 8:00 a.m. 2:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, on Regular School Days. The District shall incorporate the Elementary School related Activities on the list of activities in the Monthly Calendar of Use specifying thereon the date, time and activity.

For purposes of this License, "Priority of Use" shall mean that:

(a) SAMLARC will not on Regular School Days schedule nor allow any other individual and/or group to reserve use of the Park as described in Sections 1.01 and 4.01 hereinabove as available for CUSD use, during the specified times set out in this Section; and,

- (b) SAMLARC may notify the members of the planned community in writing of the times of the CUSD use of the Park and advise its members that CUSD is entitled to a priority of use. Such written notice need not be a direct mail notification to the owners/residents but may be included in the SAMLARC newsletter or on the SAMLARC website.
- (c) It is understood and agreed that no use of the Park by CUSD shall change the ownership or nature of the Park to school property.

This language shall not require nor imply that SAMLARC can, nor will, patrol the Park nor remove its members, who may also be using the Park during CUSD's priority of use. CUSD shall have no right to use the Park for any purpose other than those Elementary School related Activities as shown and described on Exhibit "B", nor outside the Regular School Days and the times specifically provided herein unless they have secured the prior written consent from SAMLARC for a special event.

5.01 Special Events. Should CUSD desire to utilize the Park outside the Regular School Days and times specified herein, for a special event and/or in preparation for a special event, which is not listed on Exhibit "B" and which will necessitate the exclusive or priority use of the Park by CUSD in preparation and/or in the holding of the special event, then CUSD must secure the issuance of a Facilities Use Permit from SAMLARC for such extra use. If a Facilities Use Permit is issued/granted by SAMLARC, the provisions of this License will apply to such special event and/or preparation for a special event.

Any additional charge to CUSD for the preparation for and/or the holding of the special event shall be set forth in the written Facilities Use Permit granted by SAMLARC to CUSD and shall be due and payable prior to holding of the special event. The utilization and/or reservation of the Park by CUSD for the preparation, and/or the holding, of any such special event, shall be CUSD's agreement to the payment of the special event charge and an acknowledgment of its reasonableness.

- 6.01 <u>Capital Improvements to Park.</u> Should CUSD desire to make any capital improvements to the Park, CUSD may do so only after having secured the prior written consent of the Board of Directors of SAMLARC. All expenses associated with the capital improvement must be borne by CUSD exclusively unless SAMLARC agrees to share in the expense. Any such agreement to share in the expense for a capital improvement desired by CUSD must be in writing and signed by SAMLARC.
- 6.02 <u>Limitation on Repairs</u>. CUSD shall make no repair(s) to the Park without the prior written consent of SAMLARC except and unless such repairs are of an emergency nature.
- 7.01 <u>Vandalism</u>. Where vandalism occurs in, on or to the Park during the Regular School Day or during a special event the cost of the repair and restoration necessitated by the vandalism shall be borne by CUSD exclusively if the perpetrators are known to be employees, staff, or students of CUSD or their

guests, invitees and/or agents. Otherwise, the cost of the repair and restoration necessitated by the vandalism shall be shared by CUSD and SAMLARC.

7.02 <u>Liability Insurance</u>. CUSD shall provide a policy of general liability insurance with respect to the CUSD use of the Park in a form, and on such terms as approved by SAMLARC.

This liability policy shall provide coverage for any property damage, bodily injury, personal injury and/or death which occurs or is occasioned due in whole or in part to negligence by CUSD.

This insurance policy will be primary and non-contributory as to any SAMLARC owned policies, and SAMLARC requests the right to be notified if there is any termination, cancellation, or non-renewal of that policy.

This policy shall name SAMLARC (including all of its corporate directors, officers and volunteers) and Merit Property Management, Inc. (herein "Merit") as additional insureds. This liability policy shall not permit nor require any contribution from SAMLARC nor any SAMLARC policy of insurance which might also cover the Park. The policy limits shall be at least \$3,000,000 per person, per occurrence in its limits.

- 7.03 <u>Proof of Insurance</u>. CUSD shall provide written evidence of current insurance to SAMLARC no later than September 30, 2009. Any insurance renewal shall meet the requirements of this License. Proof of such insurance shall be sent to SAMLARC c/o Merit Property Management, Inc., 22342A Avenida Empresa, Suite 102A, Rancho Santa Margarita, CA 92688.
- 7.04 <u>Indemnification</u>. CUSD hereby agrees to indemnify and hold SAMLARC and Merit, their agents, employees, directors, officers, and volunteers free and harmless from all liability from whatever source for any and all injuries, damages, suits, actions, claims, liens, losses and/or demands arising from or as a result of the negligence of CUSD in the use of the Park pursuant to this License. This indemnity will not extend to claims arising from the sole negligence or sole willful misconduct or gross negligence of SAMLARC.

SAMLARC hereby expressly agrees to indemnify and hold CUSD free and harmless from all liability from whatever source for any and all injuries, damages, suits, actions, claims, liens, losses and/or demands arising from or as a result of the sole negligence, willful misconduct or gross negligence of SAMLARC in connection with the management, operation and maintenance of the Park. This indemnity will not extend to claims arising from the sole negligence or sole willful misconduct or gross negligence of CUSD.

These indemnity provisions shall extend to claims occurring after this License is terminated as well as while it is in force. CUSD and SAMLARC agree that if any action is brought by one against the other to enforce the terms of this License, then the prevailing party in such action shall be entitled to

recover from the other party thereto all reasonable attorney's fees and costs of such suit, as determined and ordered by the court.

- 8.01 <u>Supervision</u>. CUSD agrees to provide the same standard and level of supervision of the students within the Park as is provided within the School grounds. CUSD shall exercise such control as is necessary to avoid damage to the Park, its landscaping and improvements and/or injury to persons using the Park.
- 8.02 <u>Rest Room Use</u>. The Park rest rooms are to remain locked at all times and are not to be used by CUSD.
- 8.03 (a) <u>Field Use</u>. CUSD shall be allowed use of one field only for Elementary School related Activities as stated in Exhibit "B" described on the Monthly Calendar of Use. The field may rotate between Field 1 and Field 2 at the discretion of SAMLARC.
- (b) <u>Park Use Closure Due to Inclement Weather</u>. SAMLARC reserves the right to close any SAMLARC field due to inclement weather. During inclement weather, CUSD shall be responsible for obtaining, and abiding by, the Open or Closed decision as posted on the SAMLARC "Mud Line". SAMLARC will make the final decision regarding closures, in its sole and absolute discretion.

The Mud Line number is (949) 448-6217. Park conditions will be posted on this line no later than 7:30 a.m. of the applicable Regular School Day, Monday through Friday. Conditions will be posted earlier as the nature of the inclement weather dictates.

- 9.01 <u>CUSD Contact Person</u>. CUSD shall provide the name, address and phone number of an individual who will act as the contact person on behalf of CUSD. This contact person must have the authority to act and make decisions on behalf of CUSD for all purposes relating to the usage of the Park. The information about the contact person shall be updated as necessary by written notice to SAMLARC. The initial CUSD contact person is: Cary Brockman, Director of Facilities Planning, 33122 Valle Road, San Juan Capistrano, CA. 92675-4792, (949) 234-9449.
- 9.02 <u>SAMLARC Contact Person</u>. SAMLARC shall provide the name, address and phone number of a person for CUSD to contact in order to make inquires and provide information and assurances. The information about the contact person shall be updated as necessary by written notice to CUSD. The initial SAMLARC contact person is: Candice Fullenkamp, Executive Director, Merit Property Management, 22342A Avenida Empresa, Suite 102A, Rancho Santa Margarita, CA 92688, (949) 209-5085.
- 9.03 <u>Communication</u>. In recognition of the need to resolve problems quickly and because of the proximity of the Park, the School and the homes of the SAMLARC members, CUSD and SAMLARC agree to promptly respond to all communications (whether written, or oral, by mail or electronic) within

- twenty (20) calendar days of sending by the other party. Should follow-up (whether written or oral) communication be required, such follow-up will be completed within thirty (30) calendar days of the other parties' prior communication. Both party's to this License agree to use their best efforts to resolve any problems which arise (whether related to this License or otherwise) as quickly as possible. Failure by either party to promptly communicate with one another shall be a breach of this License.
- 10.01 <u>Breach</u>. In addition to causes or reasons described hereinabove, the following shall be deemed a breach of the within License.
 - (a) The failure to pay any sum levied by SAMLARC within thirty (30) days of its due date;
- (b) The late payment of any two billings within any twelve (12) month period. This Section is intended to include levied annual costs, expenses, late charges, and/or unpaid interest that may be late from a prior and/or subsequent License period as well as any of those which may be levied during the terms of this License.
- (c) The failure by SAMLARC or CUSD to fulfill any non-monetary obligation and/or promise made and/or undertaken hereunder where such failure continues more than thirty (30) days after written notice thereof is given.
- (d) The failure of SAMLARC to provide priority use of that portion of the Park covered by this License.
- 11.01 <u>Assignability</u>. Neither SAMLARC nor CUSD may assign this License nor any of the rights or obligations hereunder without the express written consent of both of the parties to this License.
- 11.02 <u>Waiver of Rights and Obligations</u>. No waiver of any right or obligation, provided or required under this License, may be effective unless executed in writing by the party relinquishing the right or excusing the obligation. Any such waiver of a right or obligation under this License shall be limited to the specific right or obligation set out in the written waiver and shall not be considered to have waived any other section or sections of this License that are not specifically set forth in the written waiver.
- 11.03 <u>Applicable Laws</u>. This License shall be interpreted, construed, enforced and governed by the laws of the State of California.

- 11.07 <u>Attorney's Fees</u>. Should it be necessary to file an action at law or in equity to interpret and/or enforce the provisions of this License, the prevailing party shall be entitled to reasonable attorney's fees together with the costs of the suit, if so ordered by the Court.





No. 8 – Preventive Maintenance – Soccer/Football Practices Rev B2

This Guideline describes the permit holder's obligation and responsibility for practicing preventative maintenance at all practice sessions held on SAMLARC soccer or football sportsfields.

- 1. The permanent game goals must not be used during practices in order to prevent goal mount turf destruction.
- 2. Alternate goal systems must be employed in other non-game goal-mount areas. Alternate systems include cones, portable goals, etc.
- 3. Set drills must be practiced both in different, alternating areas and, purposely away from visibly "worn" turf areas.
- 4. No vehicles or other heavy equipment of any type is allowed on park turf surfaces.
- 5. The Use Guideline No. 9 Inclement Weather Park Shut Down must be adhered to for inclement weather conditions.

SAMLARC reserves the right to close any SAMLARC Park Area and/or Park Sportsfield due to inclement weather. The SAMLARC Parks Use & Sports Field Manager will make the final decision regarding closures, in his/or her sole and absolute discretion.

The following sportsfield closure policy and criteria will be used, and must be followed by any and all organizations using SAMLARC Parks and Sports Fields. The purpose of this policy and criteria is to encourage each organization and it's members to develop a sense of responsibility towards protecting the sportsfields.

- SAMLARC has established a phone-call-in "Mud Line" for posting information regarding sportsfield playability. Field closure status should not be obtained from any other source.
 - a. The "Mud Line" number is: 949-448-6217
 - b. Field conditions will be posted no later than 7:30 AM of each day, Monday through Friday.
 - c. Weekend conditions will be posted no later than 5pm on Friday.
- 2. It will be the Parks Use & Sports Field Manager's duty to inspect the sports field(s) during, after, or pending inclement weather.
- 3. If it is determined that the sports field(s) should be closed and is so posted on the "Mud Line", "Field Closed" signs will be placed on the closed field(s). It then becomes the user's responsibility to obtain, disseminate, and assure compliance with the Mud Line-posted playability instructions.
- 4. Field closures shall result in the following:
 - a. No practices or games may take place while rain is in progress. Use can be resumed at the discretion of the on-site official in charge.

- c. Each facility will be considered independently for the purposes of closure due to inclement weather at the sole and exclusive discretion of the SAMLARC Parks Use & Sports Field Manager.
- d. Sports fields may be closed for multiple days as deemed necessary by current inclement weather conditions.
- e. Closure of specific sports field types shall be determined using (principally but not exclusively) the following criteria:
 - (1) Brick dust ball diamonds (softball or baseball). If the brick dust is muddy and/or slippery, preventing sure-footed running or proper consistent ball bounce, then the diamond will be closed for play.

 The determining factor: Infield play integrity and safety.
 - (2) Grass/Turf field- (soccer or football). If the water has collected on established grass, or if bare ground is muddy and slippery, or if partially established grass is soft due to rains the grass field will be closed for play. The determining factor: Destruction of turf, and safe play integrity.
 - (3) Rule of Thumb. If a brick dust ball diamond is not playable due to the criteria listed above, the outfield grass of that diamond (used for soccer or football) is not playable.
- 5. The above policy and criteria does not preclude any user organization from discontuing use on their own during inclement weather conditions. If the weather conditions do not warrant a "Field Closed" decision prior to the "Mud Line" posting times (1:00 PM weekdays, 5:00 PM Fridays), the user organization has the ability and responsibility to subsequently make decisions based on the criteria above. Failure to do so may result in loss of permit use authorization.

This especially applies to weekend use where posting is done Friday evenings. User organizations are encouraged to develop their own weekend game-day rainout procedures for closing fields.

No. 16 – One-Time Use of Sports Fields Rev A

This Guideline provides the specific instructions to follow for Priority IV groups when using SAMLARC sports field facilities. These include baseball, softball, and soccer fields, as well as basketball and volleyball courts. All detailed guidelines are ancillary to the general SAMLARC Policies and Guidelines, Section IV.

- 1. Use of a snack bar or amplified sound is not permitted.
- No additional equipment, modifications, staging, signage, banner postings, dugout covers, bleachers, platforms, etc., are to made, kept, displayed, or brought on to the park sports fields or courts. The permitted area must be used as is.
- 3. The permit holder is responsible for insuring that all sports equipment used during in conjunction with this permit is used as instructed by the equipment manufacturer.
- 4. No cars or trucks are allowed on the park.
- 5. Hitting baseballs or softballs against any backstop or side fencing is not allowed.
- 6. If night lighting is permitted, SAMLARC shall be solely responsible for setting of lights ON and OFF.
- 7. It is the responsibility of permit holder to call the "Mud Line" (949-448-6217) to determine if the fields are open for use during inclement weather conditions. Permit holder must abide by the decision posted.
- 8. Any in-use malfunctions (lights, circuit breakers, and sprinklers) must be reported to SAMLARC immediately and handled as determined by SAMLARC personnel. Permit holder shall not attempt to correct the malfunction.
- 9. Any sportsfield irregularities such as loose bases, exposed plate edges, etc., should be reported to the SAMLARC Park Use & Sports Field Manager immediately.

FOR USE OF TIJERAS CREEK PARK

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Tijeras Creek Elementary School is located adjacent to Tijeras Creek Park in the City of Rancho Santa Margarita. The park is owned and maintained by the Rancho Santa Margarita Landscape and Recreation Corporation (SAMLARC), a non-profit homeowners association. Over the last several years, students from Tijeras Creek Elementary School have been using the adjacent park field for various activities, operating under a Limited Use License Agreement. The additional field space benefits the students with greater recreational and physical education opportunities.

CURRENT CONSIDERATIONS

This agenda item pertains to the approval of the renewal of the Limited Use License Agreement between Capistrano Unified School District and SAMLARC. Exhibit A, attached, is a copy of the Limited Use License Agreement for student use of Tijeras Creek Park.

The Limited Use License Agreement was developed to provide general provisions defining each agency's responsibilities. The agreement also defines the terms and conditions for the district's use of park, fees to cover maintenance of the field space, as well as insurance and liability provisions. School personnel have provided their input regarding the anticipated type and amount of student use of the park for the upcoming school year. The Limited Use License Agreement has been reviewed and approved by legal counsels with the school district and SAMLARC.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

This agenda item will have an impact on the district's General Fund. Fees for use of the park are \$5,000 for the entire 2009-2010 school year. SAMLARC will be responsible for all on-going maintenance of the park fields.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

It is respectfully recommended the Board of Trustees approve the Limited Use License Agreement (Exhibit A attached) between Capistrano Unified School District and the SAMLARC, for district use of Tijeras Creek Park during the 2009-2010 school year.

RECITALS

- A. SAMLARC is the owner of certain real property located in the County of Orange, State of California, described as Parcel 2 of LL 99-039, Tract No. 15869, filed for record as Instrument 2000-0639174 in the Official Records of the County of Orange (hereinafter the "Park") and more commonly known as Tijeras Creek Park (See Exhibit "A").
- B. The Park is located within a planned community known as Rancho Santa Margarita and is maintained by SAMLARC. Members of the planned community pay monthly assessments to SAMLARC which are used in part for the upkeep, repair, improvements and maintenance of the Park.
- C. The members and property of SAMLARC (including the Park) are subject to the Amended and Restated Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions recorded on April 24, 1986, as Instrument No. 86-162928 in the office of the Orange County Recorder (hereinafter "Declaration"). The Declaration provides that SAMLARC has the authority and the duty to maintain and manage the Park.
- D. CUSD which defines "Elementary School" as Kindergarten through Fifth Grade, owns and operates an Elementary School, known as Tijeras Creek Elementary School ("School") adjacent to the Park. CUSD is desirous of utilizing the Park for limited Elementary School related Activities as set forth on Exhibit "B".
- E. SAMLARC is willing to grant CUSD the right to use that portion of the Park shown on Exhibit "C" for limited Elementary School (K-5) related Activities, in accordance with the terms of this License.

THEREFORE, in order to provide limited access and use of the Park for Elementary School related Activities by CUSD and to establish the mechanism and procedures for the CUSD to pay a fair and reasonable expense associated with its use of the Park,

IT IS HEREBY AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES AS FOLLOWS:

- 1.00 <u>Recitals Incorporated</u>. The above RECITALS are an integral part of the License and are incorporated herein by this reference.
- 1.01 <u>CUSD License to Enter and Use the Park.</u> SAMLARC hereby grants to CUSD a non-exclusive license to enter upon and use, as limited and described herein the area of the Park shown on Exhibit "C", for the limited activity purposes set forth herein and for no other purpose, subject to CUSD's strict compliance with all the terms of this License; provided, that CUSD's use of the Park shall not unreasonably interfere with the reasonable use and enjoyment thereof by SAMLARC or any persons claiming the right to use the Park through, by or under SAMLARC. All such use of the Park pursuant to this License shall also be in accord with the Detailed Use Guidelines as shown on Exhibit "D" instituted by SAMLARC.
- 1.02 <u>Purpose of CUSD License Use</u>. It is hereby understood and agreed that CUSD shall have the limited right to enter upon and use the Park, for Elementary School related Activities, as shown and described on Exhibit "B", which are compatible and consistent with the improvements located upon those areas of the Park shown on Exhibit "C". Such use shall not include Physical Education classes, team sports practice and/or games, whether intramural or interschool, nor any special events beyond those shown on Exhibit "B" without the prior written approval of SAMLARC.
- Limitations on CUSD Right to Enter and Use. The limited rights of entry and use granted by this License to CUSD are: (a) limited to the specific purposes provided for herein; and (b) non-exclusive to the extent that other persons also have or will acquire non-exclusive rights for the use and enjoyment of the Park; (c) shall occur during the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. on Regular School Days only as described in Section 4.01 hereinbelow; and, (d) conditioned upon the obligation of CUSD to inspect the area(s) of the Park to be used by the Elementary School, prior to every use, to assure its suitability for such use. For purposes of this License, "Regular School Days" shall mean only those days when classes are held during the normal school year. "Regular School Days" shall not include: Federal and State holidays; in-service days; nor summer, winter or other vacation or break days. SAMLARC, except as otherwise specifically set forth herein, shall continue to exclusively control the management, improvements, maintenance, repair and restoration of the Park, which include the right to temporarily restrict access to the Park by CUSD, in the reasonable performance of such activities.
- 1.03.1 <u>Nuisance</u>. No activity within the Park allowed/sponsored/supported by CUSD, whether supervised by CUSD or not, may be or become a nuisance to other Park users, neighboring property owners or SAMLARC.

- 1.03.2 <u>Vehicles</u>. No vehicle access on, upon, over or into the Park is granted to CUSD by this License.
- 1.03.3 <u>Animals</u>. No right or permission to bring an animal or animals of any kind or type, on, upon, over or into the Park is granted to CUSD by this License.
- 1.03.4 <u>Construction</u>. No right or permission to construct, install, or erect any structure, device or other item, regardless of size, use or function, whether temporary or permanent on, upon, over or in the Park is granted to CUSD by this License.
- 1.04 <u>Management</u>. SAMLARC will retain the exclusive right to make management decisions concerning the use of the Park. This management right will include the right to establish, amend, implement and enforce reasonable rules and regulations for the use of the Park by its own members of the planned community, and CUSD. This management right includes but is not limited to the right to establish the level of maintenance of the Park.
- 2.01 <u>Term.</u> This License shall begin September 8, 2009 and end on June 23, 2010. SAMLARC covenants and agrees not to sooner terminate the license granted hereby prior to the ending date specified herein provided CUSD has complied and continues to comply with all of the terms of this License, and is not in default under any of the terms and conditions hereof.
 - 3.01 (Intentionally Left Blank)
- 3.02 <u>Sharing of Expenses</u>. CUSD hereby promises, covenants, agrees and commits to pay to SAMLARC the following expenses as a portion of the consideration for the grant of this license:
- (a) A proportion of the annual costs and expense of operation and maintenance of the Park. This proportion of the cost will represent a share of the normal and regular operation, maintenance and repair expenses incurred by SAMLARC relative to the Park. These expenses specifically include the cost of operation and maintenance and repair of the CUSD use area shown on Exhibit "C" which are part of the license granted to CUSD. During the term of this License the amount of these normal costs and expenses payable by CUSD is agreed to be Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00).
- (b) During the term of this License, CUSD shall be responsible for and pay any extraordinary expenses incurred and/or for any abnormal damage done to the Park by CUSD beyond the normal wear and tear experienced from everyday use by members of the planned community. In determining the nature and the extent of any abnormal damage to the Park, SAMLARC's landscape contractor whose services are utilized by SAMLARC, shall make the final decision in determining the nature and extent of the abnormal damage. Any and all repair work occasioned by abnormal damage done to the Park by

CUSD shall be done by SAMLARC's landscape contractor and shall be billed to CUSD. CUSD shall pay such billing within thirty (30) days of receipt.

- (c) Such other expenses and costs as are mutually agreed upon in writing from time to time by SAMLARC and CUSD.
- 3.03 <u>Payment Schedule Period</u>. For this term, the CUSD share of annual costs and expenses under this License shall be billed to CUSD. Payment in full shall be due no later than September 30, 2009.
- 3.04 <u>Late Charges and Interest</u>. Any payment due hereunder which is paid more than fifteen (15) days after the due date, shall be subject to a 15% late charge which shall be due when levied. Additionally, any payment, including late charges, which is not paid within thirty (30) days of its due date shall be subject to interest at the rate of 12% per annum from the 30th day until the amount shall be paid in full.
- 3.05 Eliminating Damage to the Park. When an activity of CUSD is causing excessive damage to the Park, CUSD shall, at the written request of SAMLARC, discontinue such activity. In the alternative, CUSD may within thirty (30) days of any such request to discontinue by SAMLARC provide sufficient cash to repair the existing damage and to periodically repair the damage caused by the activity complained of together with a discontinuance of the activity periodically for a sufficient length of time for the repairs to be made by SAMLARC to the damaged areas of the Park. The amount of such cash and the frequency of such repairs shall be set by SAMLARC. SAMLARC agrees to give CUSD five (5) days written notice of such repair work and the need for CUSD to discontinue use of a portion of the Park prior to the repair commencing. Notwithstanding the above, should an emergency arise which requires immediate repair and/or restoration SAMLARC may make such repair and/or restoration with shorter notice or no notice at all to CUSD prior to commencing the repairs. SAMLARC agrees to use its best efforts to accommodate the School schedule in making such repairs.
- 4.01 <u>Priority of Use</u>. During all Regular School Days, and so long as CUSD is current in the payment of its obligations under this License and not otherwise in breach of this License, CUSD shall be entitled to a priority of use of the Park for the limited Elementary School related Activities, as shown and described on Exhibit "B", during the within specified times: 8:00 a.m. 2:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, on Regular School Days. The District shall incorporate the Elementary School related Activities on the list of activities in the Monthly Calendar of Use specifying thereon the date, time and activity.

For purposes of this License, "Priority of Use" shall mean that:

(a) SAMLARC will not on Regular School Days schedule nor allow any other individual and/or group to reserve use of the Park as described in Sections 1.01 and 4.01 hereinabove as available for CUSD use, during the specified times set out in this Section; and,

- (b) SAMLARC may notify the members of the planned community in writing of the times of the CUSD use of the Park and advise its members that CUSD is entitled to a priority of use. Such written notice need not be a direct mail notification to the owners/residents but may be included in the SAMLARC newsletter or on the SAMLARC website.
- (c) It is understood and agreed that no use of the Park by CUSD shall change the ownership or nature of the Park to school property.

This language shall not require nor imply that SAMLARC can, nor will, patrol the Park nor remove its members, who may also be using the Park during CUSD's priority of use. CUSD shall have no right to use the Park for any purpose other than those Elementary School related Activities as shown and described on Exhibit "B", nor outside the Regular School Days and the times specifically provided herein unless they have secured the prior written consent from SAMLARC for a special event.

5.01 <u>Special Events.</u> Should CUSD desire to utilize the Park outside the Regular School Days and times specified herein, for a special event and/or in preparation for a special event, which is not listed on Exhibit "B" and which will necessitate the exclusive or priority use of the Park by CUSD in preparation and/or in the holding of the special event, then CUSD must secure the issuance of a Facilities Use Permit from SAMLARC for such extra use. If a Facilities Use Permit is issued/granted by SAMLARC, the provisions of this License will apply to such special event and/or preparation for a special event.

All special events and/or additional charges for the preparation for and/or the holding of the special event shall be set forth in the written permission granted by SAMLARC to CUSD and shall be due and payable prior to holding of the special event. The utilization of the Park by CUSD for the preparation and/or the holding, of any such special event, shall be CUSD's agreement to the payment of the special event charge and an acknowledgment of its reasonableness.

- 6.01 <u>Capital Improvements to Park.</u> Should CUSD desire to make any capital improvements to the Park, CUSD may do so only after having secured the prior written consent of the Board of Directors of SAMLARC. All expenses associated with the capital improvement must be borne by CUSD exclusively unless SAMLARC agrees to share in the expense. Any such agreement to share in the expense for a capital improvement desired by CUSD must be in writing and signed by SAMLARC.
- 6.02 <u>Limitation on Repairs</u>. CUSD shall make no repair(s) to the Park without the prior written consent of SAMLARC except and unless such repairs are of an emergency nature.
- 7.01 <u>Vandalism</u>. Where vandalism occurs in, on or to the Park during the Regular School Day or during a special event the cost of the repair and restoration necessitated by the vandalism shall be borne by CUSD exclusively if the perpetrators are known to be employees, staff, or students of CUSD or their

guests, invitees and/or agents. Otherwise, the cost of the repair and restoration necessitated by the vandalism shall be shared by CUSD and SAMLARC.

7.02 <u>Liability Insurance</u>. CUSD shall provide a policy of general liability insurance with respect to the CUSD use of the Park in a form, and on such terms as approved by SAMLARC.

This liability policy shall provide coverage for any property damage, bodily injury, personal injury and/or death which occurs or is occasioned due in whole or in part to negligence by CUSD.

This insurance policy will be primary and non-contributory as to any SAMLARC owned policies, and SAMLARC requests the right to be notified if there is any termination, cancellation, or non-renewal of that policy.

This policy shall name SAMLARC (including all of its corporate directors, officers and volunteers) and Merit Property Management, Inc. (herein "Merit") as additional insureds. This liability policy shall not permit nor require any contribution from SAMLARC nor any SAMLARC policy of insurance which might also cover the Park. The policy limits shall be at least \$3,000,000 per person, per occurrence in its limits.

- 7.03 <u>Proof of Insurance</u>. CUSD shall provide written evidence of current insurance to SAMLARC no later than September 30, 2009. Any insurance renewal shall meet the requirements of this License. Proof of such insurance shall be sent to SAMLARC c/o Merit Property Management, Inc., 22342A Avenida Empresa, Suite 102A, Rancho Santa Margarita, CA 92688.
- 7.04 <u>Indemnification</u>. CUSD hereby agrees to indemnify and hold SAMLARC and Merit, their agents, employees, directors, officers, and volunteers free and harmless from all liability from whatever source for any and all injuries, damages, suits, actions, claims, liens, losses and/or demands arising from or as a result of the negligence of CUSD in the use of the Park pursuant to this License. This indemnity will not extend to claims arising from the sole negligence or sole willful misconduct or gross negligence of SAMLARC.

SAMLARC hereby expressly agrees to indemnify and hold CUSD free and harmless from all liability from whatever source for any and all injuries, damages, suits, actions, claims, liens, losses and/or demands arising from or as a result of the sole negligence, willful misconduct or gross negligence of SAMLARC in connection with the management, operation and maintenance of the Park. This indemnity will not extend to claims arising from the sole negligence or sole willful misconduct or gross negligence of CUSD.

These indemnity provisions shall extend to claims occurring after this License is terminated as well as while it is in force. CUSD and SAMLARC agree that if any action is brought by one against the other to enforce the terms of this License, then the prevailing party in such action shall be entitled to

recover from the other party thereto all reasonable attorney's fees and costs of such suit, as determined and ordered by the court.

- 8.01 <u>Supervision</u>. CUSD agrees to provide the same standard and level of supervision of the students within the Park as is provided within the School grounds. CUSD shall exercise such control as is necessary to avoid damage to the Park, its landscaping and improvements and/or injury to persons using the Park.
- 8.02 <u>Rest Room Use</u>. The Park rest rooms are to remain locked at all times and are not to be used by CUSD.
 - 8.03 (a) (Intentionally Left Blank)
- (b) <u>Park Use Closure Due to Inclement Weather</u>. SAMLARC reserves the right to close any SAMLARC field due to inclement weather. During inclement weather, CUSD shall be responsible for obtaining, and abiding by, the Open or Closed decision as posted on the SAMLARC "Mud Line". SAMLARC will make the final decision regarding closures, in its sole and absolute discretion.

The Mud Line number is (949) 448-6217. Park conditions will be posted on this line no later than 7:30 a.m. of the applicable Regular School Day, Monday through Friday. Conditions will be posted earlier as the nature of the inclement weather dictates.

- 9.01 <u>CUSD Contact Person</u>. CUSD shall provide the name, address and phone number of an individual who will act as the contact person on behalf of CUSD. This contact person must have the authority to act and make decisions on behalf of CUSD for all purposes relating to the usage of the Park. The information about the contact person shall be updated as necessary by written notice to SAMLARC. The initial CUSD contact person is: Cary Brockman, Director of Facilities Planning, 33122 Valle Road, San Juan Capistrano, CA. 92675-4792, (949) 234-9449.
- 9.02 <u>SAMLARC Contact Person</u>. SAMLARC shall provide the name, address and phone number of a person for CUSD to contact in order to make inquires and provide information and assurances. The information about the contact person shall be updated as necessary by written notice to CUSD. The initial SAMLARC contact person is: Candice Fullenkamp, Executive Director, Merit Property Management, 22342A Avenida Empresa, Suite 102A, Rancho Santa Margarita, CA 92688, (949) 209-5085.
- 9.03 <u>Communication</u>. In recognition of the need to resolve problems quickly and because of the proximity of the Park, the School and the homes of the SAMLARC members, CUSD and SAMLARC agree to promptly respond to all communications (whether written, or oral, by mail or electronic) within twenty (20) calendar days of sending by the other party. Should follow-up (whether written or oral) communication be required, such follow-up will be completed within thirty (30) calendar days of the

other parties' prior communication. Both party's to this License agree to use their best efforts to resolve any problems which arise (whether related to this License or otherwise) as quickly as possible. Failure by either party to promptly communicate with one another shall be a breach of this License.

- 10.01 <u>Breach</u>. In addition to causes or reasons described hereinabove, the following shall be deemed a breach of the within License.
 - (a) The failure to pay any sum levied by SAMLARC within thirty (30) days of its due date;
- (b) The late payment of any two billings within any twelve (12) month period. This Section is intended to include levied annual costs, expenses, late charges, and/or unpaid interest that may be late from a prior and/or subsequent License period as well as any of those which may be levied during the terms of this License.
- (c) The failure by SAMLARC or CUSD to fulfill any non-monetary obligation and/or promise made and/or undertaken hereunder where such failure continues more than thirty (30) days after written notice thereof is given.
- (d) The failure of SAMLARC to provide priority use of that portion of the Park covered by this License.
- 11.01 <u>Assignability</u>. Neither SAMLARC nor CUSD may assign this License nor any of the rights or obligations hereunder without the express written consent of both of the parties to this License.
- Maiver of Rights and Obligations. No waiver of any right or obligation, provided or required under this License, may be effective unless executed in writing by the party relinquishing the right or excusing the obligation. Any such waiver of a right or obligation under this License shall be limited to the specific right or obligation set out in the written waiver and shall not be considered to have waived any other section or sections of this License that are not specifically set forth in the written waiver.
- 11.03 <u>Applicable Laws</u>. This License shall be interpreted, construed, enforced and governed by the laws of the State of California.
- 11.04 <u>Recording Not Permitted</u>. Neither party to this License may record either this document or a purported summary of this document without the express written consent of the other.
- 11.05 <u>Entire Agreement</u>. The written expression of this License contains the entire understanding of the parties hereto with respect to this License. No statements, promises or understandings of any kind not contained herein were made to or by either of the parties thereto unless

expressly set forth within this License. All exhibits which are referenced herein (Exhibits "A" through "D") are hereby incorporated into this License as though fully set forth herein.

- 11.06 <u>Modification</u>. No supplement, modification or amendment to this License may be made unless contained within a written expression of such modification, supplement or amendment signed by both of the parties to this License.
- 11.07 <u>Attorney's Fees</u>. Should it be necessary to file an action at law or in equity to interpret and/or enforce the provisions of this License, the prevailing party shall be entitled to reasonable attorney's fees together with the costs of the suit, if so ordered by the Court.
- 11.08 <u>Representation of Authority.</u> Each party hereto warrants and represents that all of the actions, steps and/or resolutions necessary to empower the signer to make and enter into this License by and on behalf of each of the parties hereto has been fully and faithfully taken so as to authorize and bind each of the respective parties to this License.
- 11.09 <u>Mediation Prior to Litigation</u>. Each party to this License agrees that prior to any litigation brought to enforce any term of this License, the Parties will first make a reasonable attempt to mediate the dispute through non-binding mediation.





No. 8 - Preventive Maintenance - Soccer/Football Practices

This section describes the permit holder's obligation and responsibility for practicing preventative maintenance at all practice sessions held on SAMLARC soccer or football sports fields.

- 1. The permanent game goals must not be used during practices in order to prevent goal mount turf destruction.
- 2. Alternate goal systems must be employed in other non-game goal-mount areas. Alternate systems include cones, portable goals, etc.
- 3. Set drills must be practiced both in different, alternating areas and, purposely away from visibly "worn" turf areas.
- 4. No vehicles or other heavy equipment of any type is allowed on park turf surfaces.
- 5. The Use Guideline No. 9 Inclement Weather Park Shut Down must be adhered to for inclement weather conditions.

Detailed Use Guidelines - Sportsfields

No. 9 - Inclement Weather - Sportsfield Closures

SAMLARC reserves the right to close any SAMLARC Park Area and/or Park Sportsfield due to inclement weather. The SAMLARC Parks Use Manager will make the final decision regarding closures, in his/or hers sole and absolute discretion..

The following sportsfield closure policy and criteria will be used, and must be followed by any and all organizations using SAMLARC Parks and Parks Sportsfields. The purpose of this policy and criteria is to encourage each organization and it's members to develop a sense of responsibility towards protecting the sportsfields.

- 1. SAMLARC has established a phone-call-in "Mud Line" for posting information regarding sportsfield playability. Field closure status should not be obtained from any other source. However, the "message" will be sent to all those affected. Also, the "message" will be posted on the SAMLARC web site.
 - a. The "Mud Line" number is: 949-448-6217
 - b. Field conditions will be posted no later than 1PM of each day, Monday through Friday.
 - c. Weekend conditions will be posted no later than 5pm on Friday.
- 2. It will be the Parks Use Manager's duty to inspect sportsfield during, after, or pending inclement weather.
- 3. If it is determined that sportsfield(s) should be closed and is so posted on the "Mud Line", "Field Closed" signs will be put on closed field(s). It then becomes the user's responsibility to obtain, disseminate, and assure compliance with, the Mud Line-posted playability instructions.
- 4. Field closures decisions shall be based on the following:
 - a. No practices or games may take place while rain is in progress. Use can be resumed at the discretion of the on-site official in charge.

No. 9 - Inclement Weather - Sportsfield Closures

- b. There is no automatic hours-of-rain shut down. Each day, each park, each field will be considered separately in the sole and exclusive discretion of the SAMLARC Parks Use Manager with inputs from Landscape Contractor.
- c. Sportsfields may be closed for multiple days as deemed necessary by current inclement weather conditions.
- d. Closure of specific sportsfield types shall be determined using (principally but not exclusively) the following criteria:
 - (1) Brick dust ball diamonds (softball or baseball). If the brick dust is muddy and/or slippery, preventing sure-footed running or proper consistent ball bounce, then the diamond will be closed for play.

 The determining factor: Infield play integrity and safety.
 - (2) Grass/Turf field- (soccer or football). If the water has collected on established grass, or if bare ground is muddy and slippery, or if partially established grass is soft due to rains the grass field will be closed for play.

 The determining factor: Destruction of turf, and safe play integrity.
 - (3) Rule of Thumb. If a brick dust ball diamond is not playable due to the criteria listed above, the outfield grass of that diamond (used for soccer or football) is not playable.
- 5. The above policy and criteria does not preclude any user organization from discontinuing use on their own during inclement weather conditions. If the weather conditions do not warrant a "Field Closed" decision prior to the "mud Line" posting times (1:00pm weekdays, 5:00pm Fridays), the user organization has the ability and responsibility to subsequently make decisions based on the criteria above. Failure to do so may result in loss of permit use authorization.

This especially applies to weekend use where posting is done Friday evenings. User organizations are encouraged to develop their own weekend game-day rainout procedures for closing fields.

No. 16 - One-Time Use of Sports Fields

This Guideline provides the specific instructions to follow for Priority IV groups when using SAMLARC sports field facilities. These include baseball, softball, and soccer fields; and, basketball and volleyball courts. All detailed guidelines are ancillary to the general SAMLARC Policies and Guidelines, Section IV.

- 1. Use of a snack bar or amplified sound is not permitted.
- 2. No additional equipment, modifications, prepping, signage, banner postings, dugout covers, bleachers, platforms, etc., are to made, kept, displayed, or brought on, to the park sports fields or courts. The permitted area must be used as is.
- 3. The person who obtained the permit is responsible for insuring that all sports equipment used during the use of this permit is used as instructed by the equipment manufacturer.
- 4. No cars or trucks are allowed on the park.
- 5. Hitting baseballs or softballs against any backstop or side fencing is not allowed.
- 6. If night lighting is permitted, SAMLARC shall be solely responsible for setting of lights ON and OFF.
- 7. It is the responsibility of the person who obtained the permit to call "Mud Line" (949-448-6217) to determine if fields are open for use during inclement weather conditions. The person who obtained the permit must abide by the decision posted.
- 8. Any in-use malfunctions (lights, circuit breakers, and sprinklers) must be reported to SAMLARC immediately and handled as determined by SAMLARC personnel. The person who obtained the permit shall not attempt to correct the malfunction.
- 9. Any sports field irregularities such as loose bases, exposed plate edges, etc., should be reported to the SAMLARC Manager of Parks Use immediately

- 10. Any unusual problem that requires immediate notification of police or fire department is the responsibility of the person who obtained the permit. The SAMLARC Parks Use Manager should be notified within 24 hours.
- 11. At the conclusion of use, the area used must be cleaned up. The criteria is that the park must look as though no one had been there.
- 12. All trash must be deposited in the trash receptacles located throughout the park site.
- 13. If receptacles are full, trash is to be put in tightly secured trash bags to be supplied by the person who obtained the permit and placed next to any trash receptacle for pickup.

MATERIALS

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Capistrano Unified School District continually accumulates obsolete and unusable materials, such as furniture, school music, athletic and food service equipment, etc. All usable components are then auctioned via an internet-based e-Surplus Auction (eSa).

At the March 9, 2009, Board meeting, the Board of Trustees approved a one year pilot program with Interscholastic Trading Company, LLC (InterSchola), to manage the surplus auction process for the District.

CURRENT CONSIDERATIONS

This agenda item pertains to the approval to sell obsolete and unusable District materials, which are of no further use to the District. Upon Board approval of these surplus items, Exhibit A, the District will proceed to auction these items. InterSchola and Capistrano Unified School District's current auction website will each sell an equal portion of these items via the internet. After each internet auction is completed, a determination will be made as to the most lucrative option for disposing of surplus items by the District. A recommendation will then be made to the Board for an ongoing approach to disposing of District surplus.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

All proceeds generated by the sale of these surplus items, less auction fees, will be deposited in the District's General Fund.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

It is respectfully recommended that the Board of Trustees authorize the sale of obsolete and unusable District materials as shown in Exhibit A.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

At the June 8, 2009, Board meeting, the Board of Trustees authorized advertising for bids for bakery products. This bid was properly advertised and bid documents were distributed to six vendors, three of whom submitted bids. All required documents were submitted properly. This bid was based on a select list of items and estimated usage. The bid was awarded on an all or none basis to the single low vendor meeting all the terms and specifications of the bid. Exhibit A shows the recap of bids received.

CURRENT CONSIDERATIONS

This agenda item seeks the award of Bid No. 0910-06 Bakery Products to David Castaneda Distributing. The contract will commence on August 11, 2009 through August 10, 2010, with two (2) one-year renewal periods at the option of the Board of Trustees.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

It is estimated that the annual expenditure for bakery products using this bid would be approximately \$155,000. Food and Nutrition Services remains self-funded with no direct impact on the District's General Fund.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

At the August 11, 2008, Board meeting, the Board of Trustees awarded Bid No. 0809-03 – Pizza Service to PJ of Orange County One dba Papa John's Pizza for districtwide service for the 2008/09 school year. This bid called for an original contract term of August 12, 2008 through August 11, 2009. At the November 3, 2008 Board meeting, the Board approved staff recommendation to rescind the elementary portion of the contract with Papa John's Pizza and award it to Amore Pizza, Ball Park Pizza, JoJo's Pizza Kitchen, and Pizza Hut, by their "preferred service sites". This contract term commenced on November 4, 2008 through August 11, 2009, with two (2) one-year renewal periods, at the option of the Board of Trustees. The renewal period may not exceed 24 months as allowed by California Education Code 17596.

The approximate expenditures to date under this contract for pizza service districtwide total \$697,307.76, for the 2008/09 fiscal year.

CURRENT CONSIDERATIONS

This agenda item seeks approval to extend Bid No. 0809-03 Pizza Service for the period August 12, 2009 through August 11, 2010.

In light of the current fiscal crisis, a letter was sent to the contractors along with their current prices requesting the company submit reduced costs for the 2009/10 renewal period as shown in Exhibit A.

JoJo's Pizza Kitchen submitted reduced pricing on their personal pan pizza and offered the same pricing on their whole pizza. Amore Pizza, Ball Park Pizza, PJ of Orange County One dba Papa John's Pizza and Pizza Hut will extend the contract at the same pricing for the next 12 month, with the same terms and conditions as the original agreement, Exhibit B.

Upon Board approval, Exhibit C shows the Extension Agreements between Capistrano Unified School District and Amore Pizza, Ball Park Pizza, JoJo's Pizza Kitchen, Papa John's Pizza, and Pizza Hut for the period August 12, 2009 through August 11, 2010.



This special tax will be used to pay debt service, CFD administrative expenses, and facilities costs for the fiscal year 2009-10 for the Capistrano Unified School District Mello-Roos bonds that are outstanding in Community Facilities District 90-2. In order to collect special taxes to satisfy the debt service required to pay for the principal, interest, CFD administrative expenses, and facilities costs with respect to district bonds, CUSD must apply for the levy of special taxes for fiscal year 2009-10 through the Orange County Treasurer-Tax Collector's Office.

Failure to levy the annual tax would be a breach of the contract with bondholders of CFD 94-1 and would cause a draw on the reserve fund for the bonds, with ultimate default on the bonds if not cured

WHEREAS, the Capistrano Unified School District (the "District") previously established Community Facilities District No. 98-1A of the Capistrano Unified School District (Pacifica San Juan) ("CFD No. 98-1A") pursuant to the terms and provisions of the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982, as amended; and

WHEREAS, the Board, acting as the legislative body of CFD No. 98-1A pursuant to the Act has adopted its Resolution No. 03-04-77 calling for a public hearing and such public hearing was duly held on June 14, 2004 to consider certain amendments to the District (the "Amendments"), as described in Resolution No. 03-04-77; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees called and duly held an election on June 14, 2004 regarding the Amendments in Community Facilities District No. 98-1A for the purpose of presenting to the qualified electors within the District Propositions A, B and C authorizing the levy of an amended special tax within the District and to incur an indebtedness and issue bonds in the maximum principal amount of \$45,000,000, with interest at a rate or rates not to exceed the maximum interest rate permitted by law, to finance the Facilities and the Incidental Expenses described in Resolution No. 0304-77, which Propositions were approved by more than two-thirds of the votes cast at said election, thereby authorizing the Board to levy on the District the special taxes described in Propositions A and B, respectively, for the purposes described therein and to take the necessary steps to levy the special taxes authorized by Propositions A and B.

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the District acting as the legislative body of CFD No. 98-1A is authorized pursuant to Resolutions Nos. 03-04-77, 03-04-91 and Amendment to Ordinance No. 98-1A-1 adopted on June 28, 2004 (the "Ordinance") to levy a special tax on property in CFD No. 98-1A, which shall be sufficient to pay principal, interest and administrative expenses with respect to all bonds of CFD No. 98-1A (the "Bonds"), to pay for the construction, acquisition and rehabilitation of certain public facilities authorized to be financed by the levy of special taxes of CFD No. 98-1A pursuant to Resolution No. 03-03-91 and to pay all expenses incidental thereto; and

WHEREAS, it is now necessary and appropriate that this Board levy and collect the special taxes for Fiscal Year 2009-10 for the purpose specified in the Ordinance, by the adoption of a resolution as specified by the Act and the Ordinance;

WHEREAS, the special taxes being levied hereunder are at the same rate or at a lower rate than provided by the Ordinance;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CAPISTRANO UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT, ACTING IN ITS CAPACITY AS THE LEGISLATIVE BODY OF COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO. 98-1A, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The above recitals are true and correct.

Section 2. The special tax ("Special Tax") is imposed without regard to property valuation and is levied in compliance with the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982, as amended, commencing with Government Code Section 53111 (the "Act") and the Ordinance.

Section 3. In accordance with the Act and the Ordinance, there is hereby levied upon the parcels within the District which are not otherwise exempt from taxation under the Act or the Ordinance the special taxes for Fiscal Year 2009-10 at the tax rates set forth in the report prepared by David Taussig and Associates for CFD No. 98-1A entitled "Annual Levy of Special Tax For Fiscal Year 2009-10" (the "Report") submitted herewith, which rates do not exceed the maximum rates set forth in the Ordinance. After adoption of this Resolution, the Deputy Superintendent, Business and Support Services of the District, or his designee, may make any necessary modifications to these special taxes to correct any errors, omissions or inconsistencies in the listing or categorization of parcels to be taxed or in the amount to be charged to any category of parcels; provided, however, that any such modifications shall not result in an increase in the tax applicable to any category of parcels and can only be made prior to the submission of the tax rolls to the Orange County Auditor.

Section 4. All of the collections of the special tax shall be used only as provided for in the Act and Resolution No. 03-04-91. The special tax shall be levied only so long as needed to accomplish the purposes described in Resolution No. 03-04-91.

Section 5. The special tax shall be collected in the same manner as ordinary ad valorem taxes are collected and shall be subject to the same penalties and the same procedure and sale in cases of delinquency as provided for ad valorem taxes as such procedure may be modified by law or this Board from time to time.

Section 6. As a cumulative remedy, if any amount levied as a special tax for payment of bond interest or principal, together with any penalties and other charges accruing under this Resolution, are not paid when due, the Board of Trustees may, not later than four years after the due date of the last installment of principal on the Bonds, order that the same be collected by an action brought in the superior court to foreclose the lien of such special tax.

Section 7. The actions of District staff heretofore taken in order to obtain consent from the Orange County Auditor to a later filing date are hereby ratified and the Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to transmit a certified copy of this Resolution and the Report to the Orange County Auditor, together with other supporting documentation as may be required to place said special taxes on the secured property tax roll for Fiscal Year 2009-10 on or before August 20, 2009, and to perform all other acts which are required by the Act, the Ordinance, or by law in order to accomplish the purpose of this Resolution.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

On December 13, 2004, the Board of Trustees adopted Ordinance No. 2004-1-1, which authorized the levy and collection of special taxes within Community Facilities District No. 2004-1, Rancho Madrina.

One local capital revenue source available to the district is the establishment of a community facilities district (Mello-Roos) which has an annual obligation to pay debt services on bonds.

The California Government Code Section 53311 (the Act) requires the annual levy of Mello-Roos special taxes in Community Facilities Districts (CFD) formed under the terms of the Act. The resolution establishing CFD 2004-1 of the Capistrano Unified School District provides that the legislative body shall, by annual resolution, levy the special tax for CFD 2004-1 at the rates applicable to each parcel. The district's special tax consultant calculates the annual levy and prepares the report setting forth the special taxes required to be levied on each parcel in CFD 2004-1 to pay the Special Tax Requirement. The Special Tax Requirement includes the amount needed to pay the debt service on the bonds in the current fiscal year, costs of administering the CFD and any other facilities, reserve replenishment, or incidental costs authorized under the Act.

Failure to levy the annual tax would be a breach of the contract with bondholders of CFD 2004-1 and would cause a draw on the reserve fund for the bonds, with ultimate default on the bonds if not cured

CURRENT CONSIDERATIONS

This agenda item pertains to the approval of Resolution No. 0910-15, authorizing the levy of a special tax within Community Facilities District 2004-1, Rancho Madrina, for fiscal year 2009-10, Exhibit A.

Provided under separate cover is a report that contains the tax rates for each taxable parcel of land located in Community Facilities District 2004-1, Rancho Madrina, Exhibit B.

In order to secure the tax roll for the Community Facilities District 2004-1 in fiscal year 2009-10, the district must notify the County of Orange Treasurer-Tax Collector no later than August 17, 2009, with a certified copy of Resolution No. 0910-15, along with a copy of the annual levy of special taxes for the fiscal year 2009-10. Special Tax Consultant, David Taussig & Associates will deliver the required documents on the district's behalf to the County of Orange.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

This special tax will be used to pay debt service, CFD administrative expenses, and facilities costs for the fiscal year 2009-10 for the Capistrano Unified School District Mello-Roos bonds that are outstanding in Community Facilities District 2004-1. In order to collect special taxes to satisfy the debt service required to pay for the principal, interest, CFD administrative expenses, and facilities costs with respect to district bonds, CUSD must apply for the levy of special taxes for fiscal year 2009-10 through the Orange County Treasurer-Tax Collector's Office.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

It is respectfully recommended that the Board of Trustees approve Resolution No. 0910-15, authorizing and providing for the levy of special taxes within Community Facilities District 2004-1, Rancho Madrina, for the fiscal year 2009-10, Exhibit A.

BOARD DETERMINATION OF WHETHER TO INITIATE THE PROCESS FOR SEEKING A WAIVER OF SEVERAL EDUCATION CODE SECTIONS IN ORDER TO AVOID THE EXPENSE OF A SPECIAL ELECTION IF THE ORANGE COUNTY COMMITTEE ON SCHOOL DISTRICT ORGANIZATION APPROVES THE PENDING PETITION TO CHANGE THE DISTRICT'S ELECTION

METHODOLOGY TO TRUSTEE AREA ELECTIONS

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The following information was provided by Warren S. Kinsler, Esq., General Counsel for the Capistrano Unified School District.

There is now pending before the Orange County Committee on School District Organization a Petition seeking to change the method by which Board Members are currently elected. Currently, Board Members are required to reside in the trustee area they represent, but are elected by the registered voters of the entire District. See, Education Code Section 5030(c). The Petition requests that the election methodology be changed so that Members of the Board are elected by the registered voters of the area in which they reside. Education Code Section 5030(b).

If the County Committee approves the change in election methodology as sought in the Petition, the County Committee's approval would constitute an order of election, and would require that the proposed change in election methodology be submitted to the voters not later than the next succeeding election for members of the Governing Board. Education Code Section 5020(a). The next election for Governing Board members is November 2010.

The cost of an election on the question of whether to change the method of election is very expensive, and depending on whether the election is a stand-alone special election or combined with the next regular election for Board Members, the costs could be in the range of \$500,000.

The expense of an election can be avoided by obtaining a waiver of certain Education Code Sections from the State Board of Education ("SBE"), prior to final action by the County Committee calling for an election. Education Code Section 33050 authorizes school district governing boards to seek a waiver of all or part of any section of the Education Code, except for certain enumerated sections not relevant to this issue. Education Code Sections 33050 and 33051 require compliance with certain procedures before the waiver will be approved by the State Board of Education. These procedures include the following:

- 1. The holding of a public hearing on the waiver request. Section 33050(a).
- 2. The waiver request must include a written statement as to whether the exclusive representative of employees participated in the development of the waiver and the position of the exclusive representative regarding the waiver.

Pursuant to Education Code Section 33051(a) the State Board of Education must approve a governing board request for a waiver unless the State Board of Education finds one of the exceptions to be present. The State Board of Education may, for example, deny a waiver request if the exclusive representative of employees in the district was not a participant in the development of the waiver. Education Code Section 33051(a)(7).

In order to avoid the expense of an election resulting from the County Committee's approval of the Petition it will be necessary to seek the waiver of at least portions of Education Code Sections 5019, all of Section 5020, portions of Section 5021 and 5030. The SBE has consistently granted such waivers in the past, especially when districts are facing challenges based on the State and Federal voting rights laws.

CURRENT CONSIDERATIONS

At this time it is our understanding that the County Committee has scheduled the hearing that it is required to hold for September 30, 2009. Irrespective of the Board's position on the pending Petition, the Board must decide whether to initiate the waiver process before the State Board of Education now in order to preserve the option of avoiding the costs of an election if the County Committee approves the proposal.

The waiver request must be submitted for analysis and recommendation by the California Department of Education (CDE) before the SBE considers the waiver at a regular meeting. The SBE meets every two months. The CDE publishes a "waiver calendar" on its website at http://www.cde.ca.gov/re/lr/wr/calendar2009.asp. According to this waiver calendar, for a waiver request to be considered at the State Board's regular meeting on November 18-19, 2009, it must be initially submitted to CDE no later than August 31, 2009.

While it will be difficult to meet this deadline, it is possible to do so. The preparation or pendency of a waiver request may also influence the decision making of the County Committee which should permit the completion of the waiver process prior to making its final decision on the pending Petition in order to permit the District to achieve the desired cost savings.



FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The actual costs of preparing the waiver form itself will be fairly minimal; however, considerable amounts of staff, consultant and attorney time will be associated with preparation for the public hearing on the waiver, the hearing or hearings before the County Committee and before the State Board of Education. Early in this process it is important to receive the analysis of a qualified demographer with respect to whether current trustee areas comply with State and Federal law, or whether in conjunction with the change in methodology new or revised trustee areas must be drawn. This limited amount of work should not exceed the range of \$3,000-\$5,000. If the waiver request is successful, the savings to the District will be substantial. If the implementation of the new or revised trustee areas can be delayed until the District's regular 2012 election, following receipt of the results of the 2010 census, additional savings can be recognized.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

The question of whether to initiate the waiver request is uniquely a matter for the Governing Board to determine, and one on which the administration should remain neutral, especially since the underlying question relates to whether the methodology for the election of Board members should change

FOR CONSIDERATION AND ACTION

The Board is respectfully requested to consider action on the following suggested motion. While the suggested motion is stated in the affirmative, such statement does not reflect the administration's position on this issue. Approval of the language which follows would authorize staff, consultants and counsel to do all things necessary to initiate the process of obtaining a waiver of various Education Code Sections in order to avoid the costs of an election on the conversion to elections by trustee areas. The Board may amend the language which follows, or may disapprove the option of seeking a waiver.

Motion:

In light of the Petition pending before the Orange County Committee on School District Organization to change the method of electing Board Members to a trustee area system, the Board hereby directs staff, consultants and counsel to initiate the process of preparing and presenting a waiver request to the State Board of Education which seeks the waiver of those portions of Education Code Section 5019, all of Section 5020, portions of Section 5021 and 5030 necessary to avoid the significant expense of an election on the change to elections by trustee area. By approving this Motion, the Board authorizes staff, consultants and counsel to take all steps necessary and appropriate to the accomplishment of the purposes of this motion.

BOARD MEMBER ELECTION

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The following information was provided by Warren S. Kinsler, Esq., General Counsel for the Capistrano Unified School District.

As addressed in conjunction with Item 35 on this Agenda, there is now pending before the Orange County Committee on School District Organization a Petition seeking to change the method by which Board Members are currently elected. Currently, Board Members are required to reside in the trustee area they represent, but are elected by the registered voters of the entire District. See, Education Code Section 5030(c). The Petition requests that the election methodology be changed so that Members of the Board are elected by the registered voters of the area in which they reside. Education Code Section 5030(b). The Petition does not state the date of the election at which the voters would determine whether to change the District's methodology for electing Board Members.

If the County Committee approves the change in election methodology as sought in the Petition, the County Committee's approval would constitute an order of election, and would require the proposed change in election methodology be submitted to the voters not later than the next succeeding election for members of the Governing Board. Education Code Section 5020(a). The next election for Governing Board members is November 2010.

The cost of an election on the question of whether to change the method of election is very expensive, and depending on whether the election is a stand-alone special election or combined with the next regular election for Board Members, the costs could be in the range of \$500,000. According to the County Registrar of Voters, the cost of holding an election on this issue if combined with the November 2010 regular District election would be approximately \$8,500.

As an alternative to the waiver process addressed in Item 35, and without depriving the District's voters of the right to vote on the change in election methodology, the Board may minimize the cost of changing to a by trustee area election method by presenting to the County Committee its own Resolution proposing the change in methodology and asking that the election be held in conjunction with the Board's regular November 2010 election pursuant to Education Code Section 5019(c)(1).

CURRENT CONSIDERATIONS

At this time it is our understanding that the County Committee has scheduled its required hearing for September 30, 2009. The accompany Resolution is presented as a more specific alternative to the pending Petition, and would allow the District's voters to decide whether to change election methodologies at a considerable cost savings.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

Significant amounts of staff, consultant and attorney time will be associated with preparation for the public hearing before the County Committee on either the pending Petition or the Board's proposal if the accompanying resolution is adopted. However, if the County Committee adopts the Board's proposal as set forth in the accompanying resolution, before it is necessary to file the election waiver with the State Board of Education, then some of the expenses associated with the waiver process can be avoided. As stated with respect to Item 35, early in this process it is important to receive the analysis of a qualified demographer with respect to whether current trustee areas comply with State and Federal law, or whether in conjunction with the change in methodology new or revised trustee areas must be drawn. This limited amount of work should not exceed the range of \$3,000-\$5,000. If the Board's proposal is adopted, and the implementation of the new or revised trustee areas can occur at the District's regular 2012 election rather than the District's regular 2010 election, additional savings can be achieved.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

The question of whether the Board should present its own proposal to the County Committee is, as with the waiver issue, uniquely a matter for the Governing Board to determine, and one on which the administration should remain neutral, especially since the underlying question relates to whether the methodology for the election of Board members should change. Of course, the substantial savings that would result from the adoption of the attached resolution in these difficult fiscal times certainly mitigates in favor of adoption.

DISCUSSION/ ACTION

RESOLUTION NO. 0910-16

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE CAPISTRANO UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT RECOMMENDING THAT THE ORANGE COUNTY COMMITTEE ON SCHOOL DISTRICT ORGANIZATION APPROVE A TRANSITION TO A "BY TRUSTEE" AREA ELECTION PROCESS FOR THE NOVEMBER 2012 GENERAL BOARD MEMBER ELECTION

WHEREAS, the Capistrano Unified School District ("District") currently uses an "at large" system of electing its governing board members from trustee areas within the District; and

WHEREAS, the expense borne by candidates for governing board member positions in running for office on an at-large basis is significant and may preclude the meaningful participation of many would-be candidates with fewer financial resources; and

WHEREAS, at-large electoral systems such as the District's are subject to challenge under the California Voting Rights Act of 2001, codified at Sections 14025-14032 of the California Elections Code ("CVRA"); and

WHEREAS, "by trustee" area electoral systems are not vulnerable to challenge under the CVRA; and

WHEREAS, in a by trustee area system of election, candidates for the District's governing board (the "Board") must reside within a specific geographic subarea of the District called a "trustee area" and candidates are elected only by the voters of that trustee area; and

WHEREAS, one method of transitioning from an at large electoral system to a by trustee area electoral system is for a school district to propose such a change by the adoption of a resolution pursuant to California Education Code Section 5019(c)(1) (the "District Proposal"); and

WHEREAS, following receipt of the District Proposal by the Orange County Committee on School District Organization ("Committee"), the Committee must hold a public hearing within the District's boundaries and after such hearing, must approve or disapprove the District Proposal by resolution; and

WHEREAS, the Committee's approval of the District's Proposal constitutes an order of election under Education Code Section 5020(a), whereby the District's electors, no later than the District's next succeeding election, must vote on whether or not to approve the District Proposal; and

WHEREAS, the District's next succeeding election is scheduled to occur in November of 2010; and

WHEREAS, the cost to the District for including the District Proposal on the November 2010 ballot is estimated by the Registrar of Voters to be approximately \$8,500; and

WHEREAS, the cost to the District for including the District Proposal in an earlier special election is estimated to be as high as \$496,000; and

WHEREAS, given that District has not been immune to the financial challenges faced by school districts in California at this time, District has a strong preference for conducting an election on the District Proposal at the November 2010 election, rather than at an earlier special election; and

WHEREAS, transitioning to a by trustee area electoral process without modifying the existing trustee areas could subject the District to liability under the CVRA and Federal Voting Rights Act; and

WHEREAS, Education Code Section 5019.5 requires that districts that have adopted a by trustee area electoral process update the specific trustee area boundaries following every decennial census; and

WHEREAS, the next decennial census will occur in 2010, with results released in 2011; and

WHEREAS, the District can transition to a by trustee area electoral process utilizing the 2010 census data in time for the November 2012 District governing board member election; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds it to be in the best interests of the District to transition to a by trustee area electoral system after the existing trustee areas are modified following the 2010 census and prior to the November 2012 election.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of Education of the Capistrano Unified School District as follows:

- 1. That the above recitals are true and correct.
- 2. That the Board by this resolution proposes that the County Committee at its next meeting approve the District Proposal which is as follows:

That the current election method utilized by the District for the election of its governing board members be changed from a "from trustee area" process whereby candidates for the District's governing board must reside within a specific trustee area but are voted upon "at large" by all of the voters of the District, to a "by trustee area" process where candidates for the District's governing board must reside within a specific trustee area and are voted upon only by the voters that reside in the same trustee area.

That the District's proposed transition to a by trustee area election method be voted upon by all of the District's voters at the next general election scheduled to occur in November of 2010.

That should the District's proposed transition to a by trustee area election method by approved by the voters at the November 2010 general election, the District revise

its existing trustee areas utilizing census data from the 2010 decennial census and conduct the first governing board member election utilizing the by trustee area election method for the revised trustee areas at the November 2012 general election.

3. That the Superintendent and/or her designees take all actions necessary to notify the County Committee of the Board's determination forthwith and provide whatever assistance may be required by the County Committee to complete the process.

SECOND READING: BOARD BYLAW 9320, MEETINGS

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The California School Boards Association (CSBA) recommends that local school boards establish meeting dates and times for general meetings that are accessible to the public where school boards can conduct official business in a public setting. In an effort to align our meeting dates with other school districts and allow the opportunity for all Trustees and Cabinet staff members to attend, we are recommending that the day for general meetings be changed from Mondays to Tuesdays.

CURRENT CONSIDERATIONS

The purpose of this item is to change the week night that Board meetings are conducted according to Board Bylaw 9320, *Meetings*, Exhibit A. Changing the meeting day to Tuesdays will avoid conflicts with scheduling Board meetings on holidays, and allow all Trustees and necessary Cabinet staff members to participate in Board meetings. The proposed Board Bylaw reflects the change in day that meetings are held. Changes are underlined; deletions are struck through.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

There are no fiscal implications to this agenda item.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

It is respectfully recommended that the Board adopt revised Board Bylaw 9320, *Meetings*, Exhibit A.

DISCUSSION/ ACTION

Bylaws of the Board BB 9320(a)

MEETINGS

Meetings and Notices

Meetings of the Governing Board are conducted for the purpose of accomplishing district business. A Board meeting exists whenever a majority of Board members gather at the same time and place to hear, discuss, or deliberate upon any item within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board or district. (Government Code 54952.2)

In accordance with state open meeting laws (Brown Act), the Board shall hold its meetings in public and shall conduct closed sessions during such meetings only as authorized by law. To encourage community involvement in the schools, Board meetings shall provide opportunities for questions and comments by members of the public and shall be conducted in accordance with law and Board procedures.

Except as authorized by law, direct communication, personal intermediaries, and technological devices shall not be used by a majority of Board members to develop a collective concurrence as to an action to be taken by the Board on any item of district business. (Government Code 54952.2)

Regular Meetings

By June of each school year the Board of Trustees shall adopt a yearly calendar specifying the date, time and place of each scheduled meeting of the Board for the upcoming fiscal/school year. The Board shall hold at least one regular meeting per month and will schedule other meetings as needed.

All regular meetings of the Board shall be held at 7 p.m. on selected <u>Mondays Tuesdays</u> in the Board Room of the Education Center. If at any time a regular meeting of the Board falls on a holiday, such meeting shall be held on the next business day.

All meetings of the Board shall be open to the public, with the exception of closed sessions. (Government Code 54953)

(cf. 9100 - Organization)

(cf. 9321.1 – Closed Session Actions and Reports)
(cf. 9322 - Agenda/Meeting Materials)
(cf. 9323 - Meeting Conduct)
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At least 72 hours prior to a regular meeting, the agenda shall be posted at one or more locations freely accessible to members of the public. Effective July 1, 2008 SB 343 expands the public's right to inspect documents that are distributed to board members less than 72 hours before a regular meeting. If these documents relate to an open session item at a regular meeting, they must be made available for public inspection at the time they are distributed to governing board members (Government Code 54957.5.). No action shall be taken on any item not appearing on the posted agenda, except as allowed by law. (Government Code 54954.2) Agendas shall be posted at the Education Center, 33122 Valle Road, San Juan Capistrano, California and at all school sites.

(cf. 9323.2 - Actions of the Board)

MEETINGS (continued)

Agendas for Board meetings shall be available to any person who has filed with the Board a written request. Requests are valid for one year from the date filed unless renewed. (Government Code 54954.1)

Persons requesting agendas may be required to pay an annual fee as determined by Board Policy.

(cf. 1340 - Access to District Records)

In order to help ensure participation in the meeting of disabled individuals, appropriate disability-related accommodations or modifications shall be provided by the Board, upon request, in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). (Government Code 54953.2, 54954.1)

In accordance with the ADA, persons with a disability who require a disability-related accommodation or modification, including auxiliary aids and services in order to participate in a Board meeting, shall contact the Superintendent or designee in writing by noon on the Friday before the scheduled meeting. Such notification shall provide school district personnel time to make reasonable arrangements to assure accessibility to the meeting.

Special Meetings

Special meetings of the Board may be called by the presiding officer, the Superintendent in consultation with the Board President or a majority of the Board members.

Notice of special meetings shall be received at least 24 hours before the meeting by all Board members, the Superintendent, and by the local media who have requested such notice in writing. This notice also shall be posted at least 24 hours before the meeting in a location freely accessible to the public. This notice shall specify the time and place of the meeting and the business to be transacted; no other business shall be considered at these meetings. (Education Code 35144, Government Code 54956)

Every notice of a special meeting shall provide an opportunity for members of the public to directly address the Board concerning any item that has been described in the meeting notice, before or during the item's consideration. (Government Code 54954.3)

Emergency Special Meeting

The Board may hold a special meeting without complying with the 24-hour notice requirement in the case of an emergency situation. An emergency situation means:

1. A work stoppage or other activity which severely impairs public health, safety, or both, as determined by a majority of the members of the Board.

MEETINGS (continued)

2. A crippling disaster which severely impairs public health, safety, or both, as determined by a majority of the members of the Board.

The Board President or designee shall give notice of the emergency special meeting to the local media by telephone one hour before the meeting. If telephone services are not functioning, the notice requirement of one hour is waived. As soon after the meeting as possible, the Board shall notify the local media that the meeting was held and shall describe the purpose of the meeting and any action taken by the Board.

No closed session may be held during an emergency special meeting. All other rules governing special meetings shall be observed, with the exception of the 24-hour notice requirement.

The minutes of the meeting, a list of persons the president or designee notified or attempted to notify, a copy of the roll call vote, and any actions taken at the meeting shall be posted for at least 10 days in a public place as soon after the meeting as possible. (Government Code 54956.5)

Adjourned Meetings

A majority vote by the Board may adjourn/continue any regular or special meeting to a later time and place which shall be specified in the order of adjournment. Within 24 hours after a meeting has been adjourned to a later time, a copy of the order of adjournment shall be posted at the meeting site.

If no members are present at any regular or adjourned regular meeting, the secretary or the clerk may declare the meeting adjourned to a later time and shall give notice in the same manner required for special meetings. (Government Code 54955)

Study Sessions and Public Forums

The Board may occasionally convene a study session or public forum to study an issue in more detail or to receive information from staff or feedback from members of the public.

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Public notice shall be given in accordance with law when a quorum of the Board is attending a study session or public forum. Also such meetings shall comply with the Brown Act and shall be held in open session and within district boundaries. Action items shall not be included on the agenda for these meetings.

MEETINGS (continued)

Location of Meetings

Meetings shall not be held in a facility that prohibits the admittance of any person on the basis of ancestry or any characteristic listed in Government Code 11135, including, but not limited to, religion, sex, or sexual orientation. In addition, meetings shall not be held in a facility which is inaccessible to disabled persons or where members of the public must make a payment or purchase in order to be admitted. (Government Code 54961)

Teleconferencing

A teleconference is a meeting of the Board in which Board members are in different locations, connected by electronic means, through either audio, video or both. (Government Code 54953)

The Board may use teleconferences for all purposes in connection with any meeting within the Board's subject matter jurisdiction. All votes taken during a teleconference meeting shall be by roll call. (Government Code 54953)

During the teleconference, at least a quorum of the members of the Board shall participate from locations within district boundaries. (Government Code 54953)

All teleconferenced meetings shall be conducted in a manner that protects the statutory and constitutional rights of the parties or the public appearing before the Board, including the right of the public to address the Board directly at each teleconference location. (Government Code 54953)

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Over the past few months, a number of district-level administrators have resigned from or have been re-assigned within CUSD. Of those positions the following are currently unfilled: Deputy Superintendent, Education; Assistant Superintendent, Special Education; Assistant Superintendent, Secondary Education; Executive Director, Consolidated Programs & Special Projects; Special Education Resolution Specialist; Executive Director, Secondary Special Education; and Coordinator, Literacy & Instructional Materials.

Due to the pending reorganization of district positions the above mentioned job duties and responsibilities may be changed resulting in revised functions and titles.

CURRENT CONSIDERATIONS

At this time, with the imminent opening of schools, it is crucial that positions be filled to provide support and assistance to schools. Until the positions are filled with permanent employees it is believed that the best venue to fill the positions is through the use of consultant professionals. Most often the consultants for these positions are recent retirees who possess a significant level of experience and will provide necessary expertise. The purpose of this agenda item is to seek Board approval to give the Interim Superintendent the authority to offer employment contracts for consultants within the following parameters:

- The number of days of service will be determined by the needs of the department and the superintendent. They may vary monthly.
- Positions will pay \$500-\$650 per diem.
- Reimbursement of travel expenses for travel only within the district and necessary meetings outside of the district.
- The contract will not include Health and Welfare Benefits, nor paid holidays, nor sick days.
- The consultant is not required to participate in the State Teachers Retirement System; accordingly, neither the district nor consultant shall make STRS payments.

The district shall pay the consultant(s) between \$500-\$650 per diem.

AGENDA/MEETING MATERIALS

Construction of Agenda

The Superintendent, as secretary of the Board of Trustees, shall be responsible to prepare the agenda for all meetings of the Board.

All agendas shall include the meeting time and place and a description of each business item to be transacted or discussed. All agendas shall be posted as required by law. (Government Code 54954.2)

(cf. 9320 - Meetings)

When constructing the agenda, the Superintendent will decide whether a request is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board and whether the agenda item is appropriate for discussion in open or closed session.

Any member of the public may request that a matter within the jurisdiction of the Board be placed on the agenda of a regular meeting. The request must be in writing and submitted to the Superintendent with supporting documents and information, if any. The Superintendent shall place the matter on a future regular Board meeting agenda within 45 days of receipt of the request, taking into account orderly conduct of the District's business.

There is no requirement in state law that the Board take action on, or even deliberate about such an item. It must, however, be placed on the agenda and persons requesting to address the Board to a published agenda item will do so in accordance with the provisions set forth in Board Policy 9323, **Meeting Conduct**.

Board members may place any item on the agenda no later than 10 days before the scheduled meeting date. Board members may request that a topic be placed on the agenda which has been recently considered and acted upon by the Board, providing there is new and relevant information on the topic, but only for the purpose of Board members deciding whether or not to reconsider the topic. If the Board decides to reconsider the agenda topic, it shall do so at a future regular Board meeting.

Procedurally, a Board member intending to place an item on a future agenda will announce such an intention during the "Board Communications" portion of the Board meeting. Any Board member may request that staff time be committed to conducting research and/or providing appropriate background material to the Board related to the subject to be considered. A majority vote of the Board will direct that staff provide such background information. Any Board member may also request that the Board seek the Superintendent's recommendation regarding this item. A majority vote of the board will provide direction to the Superintendent as to whether a recommendation will be forthcoming.

AGENDA/MEETING MATERIALS (continued)

In accordance with the provisions of Board Policy 9323, Meeting Conduct, the Board shall also give members of the public the opportunity to testify at regular meetings on matters which are not on the agenda but which are within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board. An agenda item for such input shall be included on the agenda of regular Board meetings, but not on the agenda of special meetings or special emergency meeting Board agendas. The Board shall not take action on such matters at the meeting where the testimony is given. (Government Code 54954.3)

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Board Member Preparation

A copy of the agenda shall be forwarded to each Board member at least 72 hours before each regular meeting and special conference session meeting date, together with the Superintendent or designee's report, minutes to be approved, copies of communications, reports from committees, staff, citizens and others, and other available documents pertinent to the meeting. The Superintendent is responsible for the distribution of Board packets (which include the official agenda and all supporting information) on the Thursday preceding the Monday Board meeting.

When special meetings are called, the secretary shall make every effort to get the agenda and support materials to Board members at least 24 hours prior to the meeting.

Board members shall review agenda materials before each meeting. Individual members may confer directly with the Superintendent or designee to obtain specific information on agenda items.

San Juan Hills High School is entering its third year with several hundred new students arriving in September adding to the over 1,000 high school students already enrolled. These students are no different than any of the other high school student s in CUSD in that they all desire to have the best high school experience possible. While things are going quite well at San Juan Hills, we are still not a fully completed high school.

We need to complete the athletics facilities most notably the stadium. The home-side bleachers are currently being housed in the student parking lot taking away valuable parking that will be needed as more students begin to drive to school this year as well as posing a significant safety hazard. The artificial turf on the field is taking excessive wear and tear as the "decomposed granite" track is being kicked up into the turf each time a runner uses the track or an athlete walks across the track to get to the field. Both of these things will lead to a shorter economic life and more money that we will need to spend in the long run to maintain the facility.

We need to finalize the lot line adjustment so that the stadium can be completed this winter. Waiting until next summer will render the stadium unusable which harms all of the summer camps, leagues and the ability for the district to rent the stadium out for tournaments, leagues, and games. Only having a small amount of seating is harming all of the teams as well as the band because there can be no tournaments or competitions that can be held there to raise the much-needed money to keep these programs alive.

Now that the budget process is over, please make this a priority. As of now, these are the only students who cannot attend Friday night football games in their home stadium. We realize that the issues surrounding the school are not your fault however as trustees, it is your responsibility to resolve these issues in a timely manner without costing us more money in the long run.

Please place this item on the next meeting agenda in order to resolve these issues, go back out to bid and get these improvements on the calendar for the sake of all the students and the fiscal stability of the district.
