# II. INSTRUCTIONS FOR PRESENTATIONS TO THE BOARD BY PARENTS AND CITIZENS PRESENT AT THIS MEETING

We are pleased you can be with us at this meeting, and we hope you will return often. Your visit assures us of continuing community interest in our schools.

The members of the Board of Trustees of this District are locally elected state officials, who serve four-year terms of office, and who are responsible for the educational program of our community from grades kindergarten through twelve. They are required to conduct programs of the schools in accordance with the State of California Constitution, the State Education Code, and other laws relating to schools enacted by the Legislature, and policies and procedures which this Board adopts.

The Board is a policy-making body whose actions are guided by the school district's Mission and Goals. Administration of the District is delegated to a professional administrative staff headed by the Superintendent.

The agenda and its extensive background material are studied by each member of the Board for at least two days preceding the meeting. Board Members can call the administrative staff for clarification on any item, and many of the items on the agenda were discussed by the Board during previous meetings. These procedures enable the Board to act more effectively on agenda items than would otherwise be possible.

#### WHAT TO DO IF YOU WISH TO ADDRESS THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

ITEMS ON THE AGENDA. Any person may address the Board concerning any item on the agenda and may, at the discretion of the Board, be granted three (3) minutes to make a presentation to the Board at the time a specific item is under discussion. However, the time assigned for individual presentations could be fewer than three (3) minutes depending upon the total number of speakers who wish to address a specific agenda topic. Prior to the opening of the meeting, a Request to Address the Board card (located in the foyer) should be completed and submitted to the Secretary of the Board. The total time devoted to presentations to the Board shall not exceed twenty (20) minutes, unless additional time is granted by the Board. All presentations shall be heard by the Board prior to the formal discussion of the agenda topic under consideration. Once an agenda item has been opened for public comment, no additional "Request to Address the Board of Trustees" cards shall be accepted for that topic.

ORAL COMMUNICATIONS (Non-Agenda Items). Citizens may address the Board on any item not appearing on the agenda. Individual presentations are limited to three (3) minutes per individual, with twenty (20) minutes in total being devoted for this purpose, but could be less if there are a large number of Oral Communication speakers. Legally, the Board may not take action on items raised by speakers under Oral Communications. However, at its discretion, the Board may refer items to the administration for follow-up or place topics on a future Board agenda.

PUBLIC HEARINGS. Anytime the Board schedules a separate public hearing on any given topic, it shall not hear speakers on that topic before the public hearing, except as to the scheduling of the hearing, nor shall it hear speakers after the hearing, except as to changes in the policy or recommended actions which are directed at the time of the hearing.

CLOSED SESSION. In accordance with Education Code Section 35146 and Government Code Section 54957, the Board may recess to Closed Session to discuss personnel matters which they consider inadvisable to take up in a public meeting.

#### REASONABLE ACCOMMODATION

In order to help ensure participation in the meeting of disabled individuals, appropriate disability-related accommodations or modifications shall be provided by the Board, upon request, in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). Persons with a disability who require a disability-related accommodation or modification, including auxiliary aids and services in order to participate in a Board meeting, shall contact the Superintendent or designee in writing by noon on the Friday before the scheduled meeting. Such notification shall provide school district personnel time to make reasonable arrangements to assure accessibility to the meeting.

# **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

Pursuant to Education Code Sections 56195, 56195.1, 56195.3 and 56195.5, the Orange County Department of Education (OCDE) may provide for the education of individual students in special education programs who reside in other districts or counties. The department's Division of Special Education Services operates a special schools program to provide special education programs and services to pupils with exceptional needs who require intensive educational services.

# **CURRENT CONSIDERATIONS**

This agenda item presents for Board approval the Memorandum of Understanding between the Orange County Superintendent of Schools and Capistrano Unified School District (Exhibit A). This agreement, which will be in effect for the period beginning July 1, 2010, and ending June, 30, 2011, will allow OCDE to conduct special education programs and services for eligible students of Capistrano Unified School District. These students are referred by their IEP teams when it is jointly determined by the district and OCDE that the student's educational needs, as specified in the IEP, can be appropriately met by the programs and services operated by OCDE.

# **FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS**

Approximately 97 district students are currently enrolled in OCDE programs. There are three cost categories for OCDE programs: classroom cost, transportation cost and special circumstance aide cost. The average classroom cost per student is \$40,149.00. Based on current enrollment, the estimated cost for district students attending OCDE classes for the 2010-2011 school year is approximately \$3,894,000.00. The estimated cost for district students being provided transportation by OCDE is approximately \$680,000.00. The estimated cost for district students attending OCDE programs that require special circumstance aides in classrooms or on buses is approximately \$830,000.00.

# **STAFF RECOMMENDATION**

# Memorandum of Understanding Between

The Orange County Superintendent of Schools

#### And

## Capistrano Unified School District

The Orange County Superintendent of Schools, which operates the Division of Special Education Services within the Orange County Department of Education, hereinafter referred to as "OCDE" and the Capistrano Unified School District, herein referred to as "District," and collectively referred to herein as the "Parties," mutually agree as follows (Agreement):

# 1. Basis of Agreement

Pursuant to the authority established in Education Code Sections 56195, 56195.1, 56195.3 and 56195.5, OCDE may provide for the education of individual pupils in special education programs who reside in other districts or counties. OCDE's Division of Special Education Services operates OCDE's Special Schools Program to provide special education programs and services to individuals with exceptional needs requiring intensive educational services, including a regional deaf and hard of hearing program.

# 2. Term of Agreement

This Agreement is effective for the period beginning July 1, 2010, and ending June 30, 2011.

# 3. Acknowledgment of Special Education Funding Formula

It is acknowledged that, in accordance with Part 30 of the Education Code, Chapter 7.2, Section 56836 et seq., the California State funding formula for special education programs, services and administration generates an entitlement based on the average daily attendance of pupils in the local education agencies that comprise a Special Education Local Plan Area (SELPA). It is further acknowledged that the SELPA base year calculations for special education funding under Assembly Bill 602 (AB 602) include a dollar amount that is transferred back to the SELPA of residence for pupils served in special education programs prior to implementation of AB 602. The Parties acknowledge that both the distribution of these special education funds and the District's fiscal responsibility for students served outside the SELPA of residence are determined by the Local Plan of the SELPA of residence.

#### 4. Scope

OCDE shall conduct special education programs and services for those eligible pupils of the District referred by their Individualized Education Program (IEP) Teams when it is jointly determined by the District and OCDE that the pupil's educational needs as specified in the pupil's IEP can be appropriately met by the programs and services operated by OCDE. Prior to offering placement in any OCDE Special Schools Program, the District shall contact the appropriate OCDE Special Schools Principal to discuss a possible referral and the appropriateness of the OCDE Special Schools Program placement. If the referral seems appropriate, the District shall obtain from the parent authorization to release information to OCDE and submit an OCDE referral packet to the appropriate OCDE Special Schools Principal

as well as schedule a visitation with the parent. OCDE referral packets are available on-line at http://sped.ocde.us/Special\_Schools\_Referral\_Packet.htm.

Upon review of the referral packet and site visit by parent, the OCDE Special Schools Principal and District representative will coordinate an IEP team meeting for purposes of discussing possible placement in an OCDE Special Schools Program. The District and OCDE acknowledge that the District, as the pupil's district of residence, maintains primary responsibility as the local education agency (LEA) to ensure the pupil receives a free appropriate public education. In the event a pupil participating in an OCDE Special Schools Program moves out of the District, the District shall immediately provide OCDE written notice of the pupil's change in residence, including the new school district of residence, if known. Similarly, OCDE shall immediately notify District in the event a parent reports a change in residence. OCDE shall maintain and provide special education programs for District pupils during the 2010-2011 school year within the administrative parameters established by the Special Education Fiscal Advisory Committee. Class size ranges and student-adult ratios shall be maintained in a manner which allows OCDE to meet the programmatic, health and safety needs of the pupils.

## 5. Annual and Triennial Reviews

The District shall be notified of annual reviews scheduled for its pupils participating in an OCDE Special Schools Program and may provide a representative who will participate in the development of the annual IEP. For initial placement, triennial review, recommendation for home instruction, or a change in eligibility or services specified on the current IEP, a District representative who is authorized to approve or disapprove the allocation of specified District resources necessary for the implementation of the pupil's IEP shall attend the IEP team meeting.

For pupils enrolled in an OCDE Special Schools Program who are participating in a general education program on the school site in the school district where the Special Schools Program is located ("Host District") OCDE will work with the Host District to provide a general education teacher at IEP team meetings. In the event the Host District is unable to provide a general education teacher for the IEP team meeting, the District agrees to provide a general education teacher unless otherwise waived in writing by the pupil's parent in accordance with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) and State law. For all other pupils enrolled in an OCDE Special Schools Program, the District agrees to provide a general education teacher at IEP team meetings unless otherwise waived in writing by pupil's parent in accordance with the IDEA and State law. Subject to approval by the pupil's parents, the general education teacher and/or other IEP team participants may use alternative means of meeting participation, such as video conferences and conference calls.

Progress reports relating to goals and objectives in a pupil's IEP shall be sent by OCDE to parents per the pupil's IEP schedule for progress reporting and to the Director of Special Education of the District upon request. When requested by District or parent, an updated report shall be provided if there is no current progress report whenever a pupil is scheduled for an IEP review or when pupil's enrollment in OCDE is terminated.

# 6. <u>Integration/Mainstreaming Opportunities</u>

The Host District where OCDE Special Schools Programs operate often provide opportunities for pupils enrolled in an OCDE Special Schools Program to integrate with non-disabled typical peers during the school day. These opportunities are typically in non-core curriculum areas such as physical education, art, music, assemblies, recess and lunch. Some

pupils enrolled in an OCDE Special Schools Program will participate in core curriculum activities for a portion of the school day in a program operated by the Host District, however, such pupils are supervised by OCDE staff at all times during such activities. In the event a pupil enrolled in an OCDE Special Schools Program is participating in core curriculum activities in a program operated by the Host District for more than 50% of the school day, the Host District will be reimbursed for any costs incurred resulting from such pupil's participation, upon OCDE's receipt of appropriate documentation of such costs.

# 7. Assessments/Independent Educational Evaluations

OCDE and District shall coordinate and collaborate in conducting assessments for pupils participating in an OCDE Special Schools Program. In the event OCDE staff is not available to conduct a requested assessment, OCDE shall notify the District and/or District's SELPA to assist in conducting such assessment(s).

In the event a request is made for an independent educational evaluation (IEE), OCDE shall immediately forward such request to the District and the District shall determine how to respond to the request for an IEE. OCDE and/or the District may also schedule an IEP team meeting to further discuss the requested IEE.

# 8. Pupil Count

A count shall be taken of the number of pupils enrolled in OCDE's Special Schools Program as of the first day of each calendar month, July 1, 2010 through June 1, 2011. A pupil shall be counted as "enrolled" in an OCDE Special Schools Program on the first day of attendance in the program or fourteen (14) days after the IEP team has met and an approved IEP

has been executed for the pupil's educational placement in an OCDE Special Schools Program, whichever occurs sooner. Pupils continuing in an OCDE Special Schools Program from the previous school year shall be counted as "enrolled" on the first school day in September unless written notification of withdrawal is received from either the parent or district of residence. If a continuing pupil has not attended school by the eleventh (11<sup>th</sup>) day of the first school month, OCDE shall notify the district of residence and a determination shall be made regarding continuing enrollment. In the event either OCDE or District are informed that a pupil has been withdrawn by the parent from an OCDE Special Schools Program, each agency shall immediately notify the other of such withdrawal. Any pupil withdrawn by the parent from an OCDE Special Schools Program is no longer counted as "enrolled" or considered a continuing pupil for the following school year.

# 9. Definitions

- a. "Special Education Fiscal Advisory Committee" shall be a committee comprised of the Orange County Special Education Local Plan Area Directors, Chief Business Officials representing each SELPA and OCDE representatives including the Chief of Special Education Services Division, Director of Special Schools and Programs, Business Administrator, and the Assistant Superintendent of Business Services, or designee.
- b. "Regional Special Education Programs" are the special education classes and support services operated by OCDE for severely disabled and medically fragile pupils, pupils with low incidence disabilities, pupils with autism spectrum disorders, pupils with emotional disturbances and other eligible pupils.

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- c. "Regional Deaf/Hard of Hearing (D/HH) Program" shall include classes and services operated by OCDE for Deaf and Hard of Hearing pupils who are learning through total communication, utilizing sign language, note-takers, oral speech and residual hearing.
- d. "Regional Oral Deaf Program" shall include classes and services operated by OCDE for Deaf and Hard of Hearing pupils who are learning through oral and written communication using oral speech, speech reading, residual hearing, auditory devices and cochlear implants.
- e. "Special Education Program Income" shall be defined as the sum of all State and Federal funds generated by or on behalf of pupils transferred to regional programs operated by OCDE Special School Programs under this Agreement. For the purposes of this Agreement:
- f. "Special Education Program Expenditures" shall include Direct Costs, Direct Support Costs and Indirect Cost of Special Schools Programs.
- g. "Average Cost Per Pupil" shall refer to the Special Education Program Expenditures attributable to the program divided by the average number of pupils enrolled during the year.
- h. "Average Number of Pupils" shall refer to the total of the number of pupils counted on the first school day of each calendar month divided by the number of calendar months in the period specified.

# 10. Funding

In consideration of the enrollment of pupils in special education programs conducted by OCDE, the SELPA and/or the school district transferring pupils to the regional programs operated by OCDE agree to pay the average cost per pupil based on expenditure categories and

ratios reviewed by the Special Education Fiscal Advisory Committee and shall provide for program funding as follows:

- a. The District shall be responsible for the Average Cost per Pupil in an OCDE Special Schools Program, including the Regional Deaf/Hard of Hearing Program, multiplied by the average number of pupils enrolled, minus Special Education Program income received by OCDE for the purpose of educating said pupils including, but not limited to Revenue Limit, AB 602 funds, and Federal I.D.E.A. Local Assistance Grant funds. The District shall be responsible for the Average Cost Per Pupil in the Regional Oral Deaf Program multiplied by the average number of pupils enrolled, minus Special Education Program income received by OCDE for the purpose of educating said pupils including, but not limited to Revenue Limit, AB 602 funds, and Federal I.D.E.A. Local Assistance Grant funds.
- b. Special Circumstance Paraeducators The District, as specified in its SELPA's Local Plan, shall be responsible for the full cost of additional personnel required for the benefit of and specified in the IEP for individual pupils who are residents of the District.
  - c. The following documents shall be used as a basis for all figures reported:
    - (1) Various Program Cost Reports
    - (2) State Form 01
    - (3) In-House Accounting Reports
- d. OCDE Special Schools Program income and expenditures shall be listed in accordance with The California School Accounting Manual Standardized Account Code Structure for Special Education as of April 19, 1999, with a summary page as shown in Appendix A, incorporated herein.

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- e. Indirect cost for Special Education Programs operated by OCDE shall be at the State approved rate not to exceed 7.5% of total Program expenditures.
- f. OCDE shall bill the District on a monthly basis and forward invoices to the District's accounting department.

# 11. Related Services/Designated Instructional Services (DIS)

OCDE provides the following related services as part of its Special Schools Programs: Speech-Language Pathology Services, Adapted Physical Education, Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Health and Nursing, Specialized Physical Health Care, Vocational Counseling, Adult Transition, Assistive Technology, Vision Training, Orientation and Mobility, Behavior Management/Intervention and Psychological Counseling. In addition to the above, as part of its Regional D/HH Program and Regional Oral Deaf Program, OCDE provides Audiological services and Sign Language Interpreters. Any other related services necessary for the pupil to benefit from the special education program shall be provided by the District or as otherwise agreed to by OCDE and the District, including translator services at IEP team meetings and/or translation of documents. In addition, OCDE shall separately bill the District for the services provided by a 1:1 paraeducator as required by the pupil's IEP.

# 12. Home Instruction

When a pupil is absent from school for more than five (5) consecutive school days as a result of a medical condition and is expected to have an extended health related absence, the pupil's IEP team shall review the IEP and determine appropriate educational services. A District

representative who is authorized to approve or disapprove the allocation of specified District resources necessary for the implementation of the pupil's IEP shall participate in the IEP team meeting when considering a placement for home or hospital instruction. When recommending placement for home or hospital instruction, the IEP team shall consider documentation from the pupil's treating physician indicating the pupil's condition, verifying that the condition prevents the pupil from attending school and providing a projected date for the pupil's return to school. Any in–home or hospital instruction, including other related services, shall be provided by the District or as otherwise agreed to by OCDE and the District. In such event, it may be necessary to exit the pupil from OCDE in order for the District to provide the necessary in-home or hospital instruction. In the event OCDE and the District agree that OCDE will provide such in-home or hospital instruction to the pupil, OCDE shall separately bill the District for such services.

# 13. Transportation

# a. Transportation by the Orange County Department of Education

The District shall provide transportation for its pupils participating in an OCDE Special Schools Program unless otherwise agreed between the District and OCDE. In the event OCDE agrees to transport a pupil, the District shall be responsible for the difference between the Direct and Direct Support Cost of home-to-school transportation as shown on the annual State Transportation Report plus one percent (1%) indirect support costs and the State transportation allocation received by the OCDE on a per pupil basis pursuant to Appendix B, incorporated herein. The District shall pay for the full cost of one-on-one transportation assistants as specified in the pupil's IEP. In the event OCDE is transporting five or more District pupils from one

Special Schools Program site, the District shall provide OCDE written notice on or before December 1 of each year of any proposed changes in the number of students requiring OCDE transportation for the following school year. Absent appropriate notice from the District of any proposed change in transportation for the following school year, the District may be solely responsible for funding the costs related to such change in transportation. Similarly, OCDE shall provide the District written notice on or before December 1 of each year of any proposed changes in OCDE's transportation services, not including cost projections, for the following school year.

## b. Transportation by District

Districts transporting pupils to an OCDE Special Schools Program shall ensure that buses arrive at the school site with sufficient time to unload students prior to the beginning of the instructional day and to load them at the end of the instructional day. Delays requiring either overtime supervision or causing portions of the instructional program to be missed and subsequently made up may result in charges to the District for additional costs incurred by OCDE related to such delays.

## 14. Due Process and Complaints

OCDE and District agree to collaborate and fully cooperate in any due process proceeding involving a pupil currently attending or formerly enrolled in an OCDE Special Schools Program, including resolution sessions, mediations and hearings, as well as coordinating witness availability and producing documents regarding the pupil.

In the event OCDE is named as the sole LEA in a due process complaint, OCDE and District agree that District, as the pupil's school district of residence, is a necessary party to the due process proceedings.

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OCDE and District shall also fully participate in the investigation and provision of documentation related to any complaint filed with the State of California, the Office for Civil Rights, or any other State and/or federal governmental body or agency.

### 15. Estimated Billing

The estimated billing for 2010-2011 will be based on actual information for 2009-2010 plus COLA as set forth in the most current State Budget plus any budgeting projections for step and column, and salary and benefit increases.

### 16. Final Accounting

An accounting accompanied by completed Appendices A and B with appropriate supporting documentation shall be sent to each District by September 15 of the following year. In addition, OCDE shall provide a quarterly expenditure report to the District's Director of Special Education. Corrections to prior year OCDE Special Schools Program costs resulting from adjustments to income or expenditure calculations shall be credited or billed to the District affected by the correction or adjustments.

### 17. <u>Projected Enrollment/Facilities and Staffing Needs</u>

In order to assist OCDE in planning for both facilities and staffing needs for its programs, each District shall submit to OCDE, in writing, on or before December 1 of each year, the projected number of pupils expected to be transferred to OCDE programs for special education and support services in the following school year. Absent a projection, the number of District pupils reported in the current year December 1 Federal Pupil Count shall be used for facilities,

staffing and budget planning by OCDE for the following school year. In the event the District intends to withdraw five (5) or more pupils from a specific OCDE Special Schools Program or enroll five (5) or more pupils in a specific OCDE Special Schools Program for the following school year, the District shall notify OCDE in writing of such intention on or before December 1 of each year. OCDE shall forward such written notice to the Special Education Fiscal Advisory Committee for its review and consideration. Absent appropriate notice from the District of any proposed change in enrollment in an OCDE Special Schools Program for the following school year, the District may be solely responsible for funding the costs related to such change in enrollment.

If the District is a Host District for any OCDE Special Schools Program, the District shall submit to OCDE, in writing, on or before December 1 of each year, notice of any proposed facilities projects, including but not limited to modernization or new construction projects at the school site where the OCDE Special Schools Program is located, as well as any potential impact such projects may have on the operation of an OCDE Special Schools Program, including opportunities for integration with typical peers at the Host District school site. In the event any such project would require relocation of an OCDE Special Schools Program, the District shall provide OCDE with at least one (1) year prior written notice to allow OCDE sufficient time to plan accordingly. OCDE shall forward such written notice to the Special Education Fiscal Advisory Committee for its review and consideration.

In the event OCDE intends to close a Special Schools Program in which District pupils are enrolled, OCDE shall notify the District in writing of such intention on or before December 1 of each year.

18. <u>Program Cost for 2010-2011</u>

On or before fifteen (15) days after the release of the May revise each year, the Orange

County Superintendent of Schools shall compute the projected Special Education Program

Income and Special Education Program Expenditures for the following year with an Average

Cost per Pupil for pupils enrolled in Special Schools Programs based on the Projected

Enrollment data, and provide it to District Student Services and Business Directors.

19. Notices

All notices to be given pursuant to this Agreement, by either party to the other, shall be in

writing and (a) delivered in person; (b) deposited in the United States Mail duly certified or

registered, return receipt requested with postage prepaid; or (c) sent by Federal Express or other

similar overnight delivery service. Notice is deemed to have be duly given and received upon

(a) personal delivery; (b) as of the third business day after deposit in the Unities States Mail; or

(c) the immediately succeeding business day after deposit with an overnight delivery service.

### BACKGROUND INFORMATION

State and federal laws require that all English learners be assessed upon initial entry into the United States and on an annual basis. In the State of California, the required assessment is the California English Language Development Test (CELDT). The test is administered during the official window of July 1—October 31 each year. When a student moves during or after the testing window into another district, often their records do not follow them in a timely fashion. It is vital that the intake district have current information, such as the results from previous tests, in order to determine placement and to avoid over-testing students. Testing unnecessarily leads to inaccurate data, potentially misidentifying students, and increases the burden on staff and district resources.

In order to remedy the situation, the San Diego County of Education (SDCOE) created a service called *CELDT SEARCH*. The internet-based service provides a database of CELDT test results from participating districts in the State of California. Using a secure password, designated district representatives can access the database for student CELDT records.

The Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with SDCOE is an agreement that may be cancelled for any reason with a 60-day written notice. The confidentiality of all data will be maintained and no information will be provided to third parties, unless authorized by federal and California law.

The SDCOE coordinates the process of collecting CELDT results from districts, developing and maintaining the searchable database, providing technical service, and ensuring the confidentiality of records as required by the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act, (20 U.S.C 1232g; FERPA).

### **CURRENT CONSIDERATIONS**

During the past school year, approximately two hundred English learners moved within the Capistrano Unified School District boundaries after the CELDT testing window closed. Since, at times, test records for the students are not available at the time of registration, the use of the CELDT SEARCH database could have provided an opportunity to find out if the student was an English learner, whether they had already been tested and their proficiency level prior to placing the student.

### FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

There is no impact to the general fund for the cost associated with the CELDT SEARCH.

The annual fee is \$0.17 per English learner enrolled in the District as documented on the most recent R-30 report to the State of California. The R-30 reported that the total number of English learners in CUSD is 5,628 students. The total annual cost will be \$956.76, which will be charged to the categorical fund for English learners.

Utilization of CELDT SEARCH will yield a savings to the District relative to staff time. With an average administration time of 1.5 hours per test, it is estimated that the savings to the District will exceed the cost of the program and result in accurate placement of students with minimal disruption to instruction.

### **STAFF RECOMMENDATION**

It is respectfully recommended that Capistrano Unified School District enter into the CELDT SEARCH MOU (Exhibit A) for the 2010-2011 school year.

### Memorandum of Understanding Between SAN DIEGO COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

### and

### Capistrano Unified School District

(District Name)

### for CELDT SEARCH

This Memorandum of Understanding, hereinafter referred to as MOU, is made and entered into by the <u>Capistrano Unified SD</u>, hereinafter referred to as **DISTRICT**, and San Diego County Superintendent of Schools, hereinafter referred to as **SDCOE**.

State and federal laws require that all English learners must initially and annually be assessed in English language development via the California English Language Development Test (CELDT). It is imperative for schools to have reliable, current English proficiency results available as part of criteria for appropriate program placement of English learners. Despite best efforts, CELDT data is sometimes not provided by students' prior schools on a timely basis; thus, intake districts are forced to assess again prior to placement. This can result in English learners being misidentified and/or inaccurately assessed by over-testing.

To remedy this situation, *CELDT SEARCH* was developed as a service of the **SDCOE** to collect and share CELDT results in a timely and accurate manner. Fast and efficient access to these test results reduces the burden on district staff and resources. **SDCOE** will coordinate the process of collecting CELDT results from participating districts, develop and maintain a searchable database, ensure the confidentiality of records and their consistency with FERPA (Family Education Rights and Privacy Act, 20 U.S.C. 1232g), provide technical assistance to participating districts, and monitor the frequency of the use of the service.

The school districts who choose to participate in this MOU desire to share timely and accurate CELDT results to improve the delivery of instructional services to English learners and reduce the costs of unnecessary testing.

WHEREAS, <u>Capistrano Unified SD</u> has requested to participate in CELDT SEARCH

THEREFORE, **DISTRICT** AND **SDCOE** mutually agree as follows:

### 1. MOU Term

This **MOU** shall be in effect commencing February 15, 2006 until terminated as provided in this MOU.

### 2. In Providing CELDT SEARCH services, SDCOE shall:

- A. Collect CELDT results from participating school districts and make these results available via a secure, password-protected, on-line, searchable database.
- B. Offer an orientation of the *CELDT SEARCH* to the designated **DISTRICT** representatives **NOT TO EXCEED FIVE INDIVIDUALS** at an agreed upon location and date for a period not to exceed two hours.

EXHIBIT A (Page 1 of 4)

- C. Maintain a back-up data file in a secure location.
- A. Develop and implement procedures and systems that shall require the use of secured passwords to access the computer database used to process, store, or transmit data provided under this **MOU**.
- B. Develop and implement procedures and systems, such as good practices for assigning passwords, to maintain the integrity of the systems used to secure the computer databases used to process, store, or transmit data provided under this **MOU**.

### In receiving CELDT SEARCH services, DISTRICT shall

- A. Pay **SDCOE** an annual fee equivalent to \$0.17 per English learner enrolled in **DISTRICT** as published in the most recent California Department of Education Annual Language Census Report. (R-30). **SDCOE** shall submit an invoice to **DISTRICT** annually, and **DISTRICT** shall pay **SDCOE** within 60 days of receipt of such invoice. In the case of a partial first year, **DISTRICT** shall be obligated to pay a prorated amount of the annual fee, based on a 12-month year.
- B. Provide **SDCOE** a copy of the Annual and Initial **CELDT STUDENT DATA DISCS** provided by the California Department of Education and the current CELDT contractor.
- C. Identify the AUTHORIZED DISTRICT REPRESENTATIVE who will be the sole contact person for all *CELDT SEARCH* related correspondence with the **SDCOE**.
- D. Consult with **SDCOE** to provide ongoing feedback in the continuous improvement of *CELDT SEARCH*.
- E. Allow the **SDCOE** to maintain a secure back-up data file for the purposes of safeguarding the database.
- F. Acknowledge that the data is provided 'as is' and that no warranty is explicitly or implicitly provided by the **SDCOE** as to the accuracy or usability of the data.
- G. Not hold the **SDCOE** responsible for the **DISTRICT'S** understanding, use, support, or interpretation of data.

### 3. Cancellation of MOU

This MOU may be cancelled for any reason whatsoever upon 60-day written notice from **DISTRICT** or **SDCOE** to the other party. In the event of cancellation of this MOU, any back-up data files will be purged from the **SDCOE** and **DISTRICT** will be reimbursed a pro-rated amount of the annual fee, based on a 12-month year, which was paid to **SDCOE** for the purposes of maintaining *CELDT SEARCH*.

### 4. Confidentiality

**SDCOE** and **DISTRICT** will maintain the confidentiality of any and all student data exchanged by each as a part of this **MOU** and will not provide CELDT information to third parties, unless such parties are authorized to receive such information under federal and California law. The confidentiality requirements under this paragraph shall survive the termination or expiration of this **MOU** or any subsequent agreement intended to supersede this **MOU**. To ensure the continued confidentiality and security of the student data processed, stored, or transmitted under this **MOU**, participating school districts shall establish a system of safeguards that will at minimum include the following:

- A. Procedures and systems that ensure all student records are kept in secured facilities and access to such records is limited to personnel who are authorized to have access to said data under this section of the **MOU**.
- B. Procedures and safeguards that ensure that all designated district staff participating school districts involved in the handling, transmittal, and/or processing of data provided under this **MOU** will maintain the confidentiality of all student-related personally identifiable information.
- C. Procedures and systems that ensure that all confidential student data processed, stored, and/or transmitted under the provisions of this **MOU** shall be maintained in a secure manner that prevents the interception, diversion, or other unauthorized access to said data.
- D. Procedures and systems developed and implemented to process, store, or transmit data provided under this **MOU** to ensure that any and all disclosures of confidential student data comply with all provisions of the FERPA and California law relating to the privacy rights of students, such as but not limited to, Education Code section 49060 et seq., the Information Practices Act (Civ. Code § 1798 et seq.) and the California Public Records Act (Gov. Code § 6250 et seq.) insofar as such laws are applicable to the parties to this **MOU**.
- 5. This is not a joint venture. The parties understand that each of the parties and its employees, agents, officers, and associates are an independent public entities and not an employee, agent, officer, or associate of the other party. Neither party will provide fringe benefits, including health insurance, holidays, paid vacation, workers compensation or any other employee benefit, for the benefit of the other party or its employees, agents, officers, and associates.
- officers, agents and employees, harmless from any claim, demand, loss or damage (including attorney fees) to SDCOE or to other persons or property arising out of this MOU to the extent that the claim, demand, loss, or damage is caused by DISTRICT's breach of any obligation contained in this MOU or the intentional or negligent act of DISTRICT or its officers, agents, and/or employees. This indemnity shall survive termination of this MOU.

### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

Each year the Capistrano Unified School District applies for and receives a contract through the California Department of Education Child Development Division for the continued funding of preschool services. State preschools are a comprehensive developmental program for three to five-year-old children from low-income families. The program emphasizes parent education and involvement. In addition to preschool education activities, other components include health, nutrition, social services, and staff development.

To achieve its goal of making early childhood education accessible to disadvantaged children, the district is scheduled to continue the operation of state funded preschool programs for the 2010/11 school year at Concordia, Crown Valley, Don Juan Avila, R.H. Dana, Hankey, Hidden Hills, Kinoshita, Las Palmas, Lobo, Palisades, San Juan, Viejo, and Wood Canyon Elementary Schools. Within these schools, approximately 700 children will receive early education/intervention services through our state funded preschool programs.

### **CURRENT CONSIDERATIONS**

This item requests Board approval of Resolution No. 1011-03 to accept state preschool funds, which permit the continued operation of the program, Exhibit A.

### **FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS**

The state funded preschool contract provides a maximum reimbursable amount of \$2,795,705 for a minimum of 245 days of operation during the 2010/11 school year. There is no adverse impact on the general fund.

### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

It is respectfully recommended that the Board of Trustees approve Resolution No. 1011-03 to accept contract funding for Capistrano Unified School District's state funded preschool program for the 2010/2011 school year, Exhibit A.

### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

The Consolidated Application for Funding Categorical Aid Programs is a two-part application and reporting process for multiple state and federal, formula-driven categorical program funds submitted annually to the California Department of Education (CDE). The Consolidated Application is used by the CDE to distribute categorical funds from various state and federal programs. By June 30<sup>th</sup> of each year, districts submit Part 1 of the application to document program participation in categorical programs and provide assurances that they will comply with the legal requirements of each program. Part II of the application, submitted by January 30<sup>th</sup> of the following year, contains the district's entitlements for each funded program.

The programs coordinated through the Consolidated Application include:

### FEDERAL PROGRAMS

- 1. Title I, Part A: Education for Disadvantaged Students
- 2. Title II, Part A: Teacher and Principal Training
- 3. Title III, Part A: English Language Learner Program

### STATE PROGRAMS

4. Economic Impact Aid (EIA)

### **CURRENT CONSIDERATIONS**

This agenda item requests approval of the 2010/11 Consolidated Application for Funding Categorical Aid Programs, Part I. The complete Consolidated Application, Part I, is on file for review in the State and Federal Program office. As required by the California

Department of Education, the District English Language Advisory Committee (DELAC) also approved this document.

Within the Consolidated Application, the number of students with an unexcused absence of more than 30 minutes on three or more days is reported along with the corresponding truancy rate. In past years, CUSD has reported students who have an unexcused absence for the day. According to the California Department of Education, students who have an unexcused absence in a class/period also need to be reported. This has caused CUSD's truancy rate on this Consolidated Application to increase significantly from the previous year. It important to note that when comparing the daily and period truancy rates from 2008-09 to 2009-10, 31.5% of the secondary schools actually had a decrease in truancy count. In analyzing the truancy data, it has prompted a need for a closer look into how student absences are coded to ensure that data reported is accurate. Education Services staff members are addressing this need.

### **FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS**

The 2009/10 Consolidated Application represented an income of \$8,264,821. The 2010/11 Consolidated Application reflects an estimated income of \$7,826,228. Actual entitlements will be calculated when the budget appropriations are final. The anticipated reduction is due to a decrease in the number of English Learners and the elimination of Title IV Safe and Drug Free Schools funding.

### STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS

It is respectfully recommended the Board approve the 2010/11 Consolidated Application for Funding Categorical Aid Programs, Part I, (available for review in the State and Federal Program office) to fund supplemental programs.

## BACKGROUND INFORMATION

On November 6, 1989, the Board of Trustees adopted Ordinance No. 87-1 which authorized the levy and collection of "Special Taxes" within Community Facilities District No. 87-1 (Mission Viejo/Aliso Viejo).

One local capital revenue source available to the District is the establishment of a community facilities district (Mello-Roos) which has an annual obligation to pay debt services on "Bonds" issued and as applicable to provide funds for additional facilities.

The California Government Code Section 53311 ("Act") provides for the annual levy of Mello-Roos special taxes in community facilities districts formed under the terms of the Act. The "Resolution" establishing Community Facilities District No. 87-1 of the Capistrano Unified School District (Mission Viejo/Aliso Viejo) ("CFD No. 87-1") provides that the legislative body shall, by annual resolution, levy the Special Tax for CFD No. 87-1 at the rates applicable to each parcel. David Taussig & Associates ("DTA"), the District's "Special Tax Consultant," has calculated the annual levy and prepared the report ("DTA 2010-11 Administration Report for CFD No. 87-1") setting forth the Special Taxes required and authorized to be levied on each parcel in CFD No. 87-1 including amounts to pay the "Special Tax Requirement." The DTA 2010-11 Administration Report for CFD No. 87-1 is on file at the District Office and is by this reference herein incorporated for the purpose of levying such Special Taxes for fiscal year 2010-11. The Special Tax Requirement includes the amount needed to pay the debt service on the Bonds in the current fiscal year, costs of administering CFD No. 87-1, any other facilities, and replenishment of the "Reserve Fund," or incidental costs authorized.

#### **CURRENT CONSIDERATIONS**

This agenda item pertains to the approval of Resolution No. 1011-05, authorizing the levy of a Special Tax within CFD No. 87-1 (Mission Viejo/Aliso Viejo) for fiscal year 2010-11, Exhibit A.

In order to secure the tax roll for CFD No. 87-1 in fiscal year 2010-11, the District must notify the County of Orange Auditor/Controller no later than August 17, 2010, with a certified copy of Resolution No. 1011-05, along with a copy of the annual levy of Special Taxes for the fiscal year 2010-11. DTA will deliver the required documents on the District's behalf to the County of Orange.

## FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

This Special Tax will be used to pay debt service on Bonds of CFD No. 87-1, administrative expenses, and facilities costs of CFD No. 87-1 for the fiscal year 2010-11. In order to collect Special Taxes to satisfy the debt service required to pay for the principal, interest on Bonds of CFD No. 87-1, administrative expenses, and facilities costs with respect to CFD No. 87-1, the District must apply for the levy and collection of Special Taxes for fiscal year 2010-11 through the Orange County Treasurer-Tax Collector's Office.

### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

It is respectfully recommended that the Board approve Resolution No. 1011-05, authorizing and providing for the levy and collection of Special Taxes within CFD No. 87-1 (Mission Viejo/Aliso Viejo) for fiscal year 2010-11, Exhibit A.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CAPISTRANO UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT ACTING AS THE LEGISLATIVE BODY OF COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO. 87-1 OF THE CAPISTRANO UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT (MISSION VIEJO/ALISO VIEJO) AUTHORIZING THE LEVY OF SPECIAL TAXES WITHIN COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO. 87-1 (MISSION VIEJO/ALISO VIEJO) FOR FISCAL YEAR 2010-11

WHEREAS, the Capistrano Unified School District ("District") previously established Community Facilities District No. 87-1 of the Capistrano Unified School District (Mission Viejo/Aliso Viejo) ("CFD No. 87-1"), annexed additional territory thereto and designated Improvement Area No. 1 of CFD No. 87-1 ("Improvement Area"), all pursuant to the terms and provisions of the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982, as amended ("Act"); and

WHEREAS, CFD No. 87-1 issued its Series 1989 Special Tax Bonds in the amount of \$44,370,000 pursuant to Resolution No. 89-56, adopted by the Board of Trustees ("Board") of the District acting as the legislative body of CFD No. 87-1 ("Series 1989 Special Tax Bonds") and its Series 1990 Special Tax Bonds in the amount of \$36,170,000 pursuant to Resolution No. 90-103, adopted by the Board acting as the legislative body of CFD No. 87-1 ("Series 1990 Special Tax Bonds") and issued its Series 1996A and Series 1996B Special Tax Refunding Bonds in the respective principal amounts of \$42,640,000 and \$38,910,000 pursuant to Resolution No. 9697-06, adopted by the Board acting as the legislative body of CFD No. 87-1 (collectively, "Series 1996 Bonds") to refund the Series 1989 Special Tax Bonds and the Series 1990 Special Tax Bonds; and

WHEREAS, on June 8, 2006, CFD No. 87-1 issued its Series 2006 Special Tax Refunding Bonds in the amount of \$71,810,000 pursuant to Resolution No. 0506-74, adopted by the Board acting as the legislative body of CFD No. 87-1 ("Series 2006 Bonds") to refund the Series 1996 Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Board, acting as the legislative body of CFD No. 87-1 and the Improvement Area, pursuant to the Act has adopted its Resolution No. 94-82 calling for a public hearing and such public hearing was duly held on November 21, 1994, to consider the annexation of certain territory to the District and to the Improvement Area, as described in Resolution No. 94-82 and the maps of such territory recorded on November 4, 1994, as Instrument Nos. 94-0649221 and 94-0649222, respectively, in the "Book of Maps and Assessments and Community Facilities Districts" maintained in the office of the County Recorder for the County of Orange ("Annexed Territory"); and

WHEREAS, the Board called and duly held an election on November 21, 1994, in CFD No. 87-1 and the Improvement Area for the purpose of presenting to the qualified electors within

the Annexed Territory Propositions A and B authorizing the levy of a "Special Tax" within the Annexed Territory, which Propositions were approved by more than two-thirds of the votes cast at said election, thereby authorizing the Board to levy the Special Taxes described in Propositions A and B, respectively, for the purposes described therein and to take the necessary steps to levy the Special Taxes authorized by Propositions A and B; and

The DTA 2010-11 Administration Report for CFD No. 87-1 is on file at the District Office, and is by this reference herein incorporated, which sets forth rates that do not exceed the maximum rates set forth in the Ordinance. After adoption of this Resolution, the Deputy Superintendent, Business and Support Services, of the District, or designee, may make any necessary modifications to these Special Taxes to correct any errors, omissions or inconsistencies in the listing or categorization of parcels to be taxed or in the amount to be charged to any category of parcels; provided, however, that any such modifications

shall not result in an increase in the Special Taxes applicable to any category of parcels and can only be made prior to the submission of the tax rolls to the Orange County Auditor.

- <u>Section 4</u>. All of the collections of the Special Tax shall be used only as provided for in the Act and Resolution No. 87-38. The Special Tax shall be levied only so long as needed to accomplish the purposes described in Resolution No. 87-38.
- <u>Section 5</u>. The Special Tax shall be collected in the same manner as ordinary ad valorem taxes are collected and shall be subject to the same penalties and the same procedure and sale in cases of delinquency as provided for ad valorem taxes as such procedure may be modified by law or this Board from time to time.
- Section 6. If and when Bonds are issued or such Special Taxes are pledged as to Bonds issued as a cumulative remedy, if any amount levied as a Special Tax for payment of Bond interest or principal, together with any penalties and other charges accruing under this Resolution, are not paid when due, the Board may, not later than four years after the due date of the last installment of principal on the Series 2006 Bonds, order that the same be collected by an action brought in the superior court to foreclose the lien of such Special Tax. The Deputy Superintendent, Business and Support Services of the District, is authorized to pursue collection thereof and to commence such proceedings consistent with the Act and the applicable provisions of any Bonds issued on behalf of CFD No. 87-1.

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Section 7. The actions of District staff heretofore taken in order to obtain consent from the Orange County Auditor-Controller to a later filing date are hereby ratified and the Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to transmit a certified copy of this Resolution to the Orange County Auditor-Controller, together with other supporting documentation as may be required to place said Special Taxes on the secured property tax roll for Fiscal Year 2010-11 on or before August17, 2010, and to perform all other acts which are required by the Act, the Ordinance, or by law in order to accomplish the purpose of this Resolution.

David Taussig & Associates ("DTA"), the District's "Special Tax Consultant," has calculated the annual levy and prepared the report ("DTA 2010-11 Administration Report for CFD No. 88-1") setting forth the Special Taxes required and authorized to be levied on each parcel in CFD No. 88-1 including amounts to pay the "Special Tax Requirement." The DTA 2010-11 Administration Report for CFD No. 88-1 is on file at the District Office and is by this reference herein incorporated for the purpose of levying such Special Taxes for fiscal year 2010-11. The Special Tax Requirement includes the amount needed to pay the debt service on the Bonds in the current fiscal year, costs of administering CFD No. 88-1, any other facilities, and replenishment of the "Reserve Fund," or incidental costs authorized.

#### **CURRENT CONSIDERATIONS**

This agenda item pertains to the approval of Resolution No. 1011-06 authorizing the levy of a Special Tax within CFD No. 88-1 (Rancho Santa Margarita) for fiscal year 2010-11, Exhibit A.

DTA will deliver the required documents on the District's behalf to the County of Orange.

#### FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

This Special Tax will be used to pay debt service on Bonds of CFD No. 88-1, administrative expenses, and facilities costs of CFD No. 88-1 for the fiscal year 2010-11. In order to collect Special Taxes to satisfy the debt service required to pay for the principal, interest on Bonds of CFD No. 88-1, administrative expenses, and facilities costs with respect to CFD No. 88-1, the District must apply for the levy of Special Taxes for fiscal year 2010-11 through the Orange County Treasurer-Tax Collector's Office.

After adoption of this Resolution, the Deputy Superintendent, Business and Support Services of the District, or designee, may make any necessary modifications to these Special Taxes to correct any errors, omissions or inconsistencies in the listing or categorization of parcels to be taxed or in the amount to be charged to any category of parcels; provided, however, that any such modifications shall not result in an increase in the Special Taxes applicable to any category of parcels and can only be made prior to the submission of the tax rolls to the Orange County Auditor.

The actions of District staff heretofore taken in order to obtain consent from the Orange County Auditor-Controller to a later filing date are hereby ratified and the Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to transmit a certified copy of this Resolution to the Orange County Auditor-Controller, together with other supporting documentation as may be required to place said Special Taxes on the secured property tax roll for Fiscal Year 2010-11 on or before August 17, 2010, and to perform all other acts which are required by the Act, the Ordinance, or by law in order to accomplish the purpose of this Resolution.

One local capital revenue source available to the District is the establishment of a community facilities district (Mello-Roos) which has an annual obligation to pay debt services on bonds, if any, and to levy and collect Special Taxes of such community facilities district to provide funds for additional facilities.

The California Government Code Section 53311 ("Act") provides for the annual levy of Mello-Roos special taxes in community facilities districts formed under the terms of the Act if "Bonds" have been issued and authorizes the levy and collection of Special Taxes for facilities and costs of administering CFD No. 94-1 (hereinafter defined). The "Resolution" establishing Community Facilities District No. 94-1 of the Capistrano Unified School District (Santa Margarita) ("CFD No. 94-1") provides that the legislative body shall, by annual Resolution, levy the Special Tax for CFD No. 94-1 at the rates applicable to each parcel when Bonds have been issued and may do so to fund facilities and costs of administering CFD No. 94-1. David Taussig & Associates ("DTA"), the District's "Special Tax Consultant," has calculated the annual levy and prepared the report ("DTA 2010-11 Administration Report for CFD No. 94-1") setting forth the Special Taxes required and authorized to be levied on each parcel in CFD No. 94-1 that is sufficient, together with the Special Taxes of CFD No. 88-1, in order to pay the "Special Tax Requirement." The DTA 2010-11 Administration Report for CFD No. 94-1 is on file at the District Office and is by this reference herein incorporated for the purpose of levying such Special Taxes for fiscal year 2010-11. The Special Tax Requirement includes the amount needed to pay the debt service on the Bonds in the current fiscal year of CFD No. 88-1, and any Bonds and/or certificates of participation for which such Special Taxes have been committed, to

pay certain costs of facilities, costs of administering CFD No. 94-1, any other facilities, and replenishment of the "Reserve Fund," or incidental costs authorized.

## **CURRENT CONSIDERATIONS**

This agenda item pertains to the approval of Resolution No. 1011-10, authorizing the levy of a Special Tax within CFD No. 94-1 (Rancho Santa Margarita) for fiscal year 2010-11, Exhibit A.

In order to secure the tax roll for CFD No. 94-1 in fiscal year 2010-11, the District must notify the County of Orange Auditor-Controller no later than August 17, 2010, with a certified copy of Resolution No. 1011-10, along with a copy of the annual levy of Special Taxes for the fiscal year 2010-11. DTA will deliver the required documents on the District's behalf to the County of Orange.

### FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

This Special Tax will be used to pay debt service for CFD No. 94-1 on Bonds of CFD No. 94-1, if any, or on Bonds for which such Special Taxes have been committed, administrative expenses, and facilities costs for the fiscal year 2010-11. In order to collect Special Taxes to satisfy such debt service, if any, administrative expenses, and facilities costs with respect to CFD No. 94-1, the District must apply for the levy of Special Taxes for fiscal year 2010-11 through the Orange County Treasurer-Tax Collector's Office.

### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

# **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

One local capital revenue source available to the District is the establishment of a community facilities district (Mello-Roos) which has an annual obligation to pay debt services on "Bonds" issued and as applicable provide funds for additional facilities.

The California Government Code Section 53311 ("Act") provides for the annual levy of Mello-Roos special taxes in community facilities districts formed under the terms of the Act. The "Resolution" establishing Community Facilities District No. 98-2 of the Capistrano Unified School District (Ladera) ("CFD No. 98-2") provides that the legislative body shall, by annual resolution, levy the Special Tax for CFD No. 98-2 at the rates applicable to each parcel. David Taussig & Associates ("DTA"), the District's "Special Tax Consultant," has calculated the annual levy and prepared the report ("DTA 2010-11 Administration Report for CFD No. 98-2") setting forth the Special Taxes required and authorized to be levied on each parcel in CFD No. 98-2 including amounts to pay the "Special Tax Requirement." The DTA 2010-11 Administration Report for CFD No. 98-2 is on file at the District Office and is by this reference herein incorporated for the purpose of levying such Special Taxes for fiscal year 2010-11. The Special Tax Requirement includes the amount needed to pay the debt service on the Bonds in the current fiscal year, costs of administering CFD No. 98-2, any other facilities, and replenishment of the "Reserve Fund," or incidental costs authorized.

### **CURRENT CONSIDERATIONS**

DTA will deliver the required documents on the District's behalf to the County of Orange.

#### **FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS**

In order to collect Special Taxes to satisfy the debt service required to pay for the principal, interest on Bonds of CFD No. 98-2, administrative expenses, and facilities costs with respect to CFD No. 98-2, the District must apply for the levy of Special Taxes for fiscal year 2010-11 through the Orange County Treasurer-Tax Collector's Office.

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

At the May 12, 2008, Board meeting, the Board of Trustees authorized advertising for bids for pizza service to provide fresh delivered pizza to the District's secondary schools as an additional menu item offered. This bid was properly advertised and six bids were received. At the August 11, 2008, Board meeting, the Board of Trustees awarded Bid No. 0809-03 Pizza Service to PJ of Orange County One dba Papa John's Pizza.

The bid called for the agreement to commence August 12, 2008, through August 11, 2009, with two (2) one-year renewal periods, at the option of the Board of Trustees. At the August 10, 2009, Board meeting, the Board of Trustees approved the first bid extension option to commence August 12, 2009, through August 11, 2010.

The District purchases approximately \$450,000 annually in pizza service with PJ of Orange County One dba Papa John's Pizza. PJ of Orange County One dba Papa John's Pizza has supplied the District with excellent customer service and quality products.

#### **CURRENT CONSIDERATIONS**

This agenda item seeks approval to extend Bid No. 0809-03 Pizza Service for the period August 12, 2010, through August 11, 2011. PJ of Orange County One dba Papa John's Pizza will extend the contract for the next 12 months holding prices on all the products purchased by the District as shown in Exhibit B.

Upon Board approval, Exhibit A shows the Extension Agreement between Capistrano Unified School District and PJ of Orange County One dba Papa John's Pizza for the second renewal period August 12, 2010, through August 11, 2011.

#### **FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS**

Food and Nutrition Services remains self-funded with no direct impact to the District's General Fund.

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

In December 2008, the District solicited proposals for snack vending services districtwide to provide nutritious SB12-conforming snacks for students at the secondary school level. In January 2009, RFP No. 4-0809 Snack Vending Services Districtwide was awarded to Vending+Plus. The contract called for the agreement to commence January 8, 2009, through August 31, 2009, with four (4) one year renewal periods, for an option period not to exceed 48 months. On August 31, 2009, the contract was extended for the first renewal term commencing September 1, 2009, through August 31, 2010.

The contract documents are on file in the Purchasing Department. Contact Terry Fluent, Director, Purchasing.

#### **CURRENT CONSIDERATIONS**

This agenda item seeks the approval to extend RFP No. 4-0809 Snack Vending Services Districtwide with Vending+Plus.

In light of the current fiscal crisis, a letter was sent to Vending+Plus requesting their assistance in ensuring that the district is earning the highest commission rates possible for the 2010/11 renewal period, as shown in Exhibit B.

Vending+Plus will extend their contract for the next 12 months at the same commission rates since the inception of the contract. Exhibit C shows the proposed commission rates for the 2010/11 school year. The terms and conditions remain the same as the original agreement.

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

On January 12, 2010, the Board, as the Governing Body of CFD 2005-1 (Whispering Hills) ("CFD No. 2005-1"), adopted Resolution No. 0910-46, calling a Public Hearing on March 12, 2010, as to the request by the owner and "Developer" of the property in CFD No. 2005-1 to consider reducing the Special Taxes of CFD No. 2005-1. The above-described Public Hearing was opened on March 12, 2010, and any interested parties were afforded an opportunity to speak as to such matter. Thereupon the Board, on behalf of CFD No. 2005-1 adopted Resolution No. 0910-56, continuing the above-described Public Hearing to April 13, 2010. On April 13, 2010, such Public Hearing was further continued to May 11, 2010, then again to June 15, 2010, then again to July 13, 2010, and then again to August 10, 2010. Further discussion with the Developer in regard to such request is anticipated in August and staff anticipates a final resolution by August 24, 2010.

#### **CURRENT CONSIDERATIONS**

District staff and legal counsel recommend a further continuance of the Public Hearing to the Board meeting scheduled for August 24, 2010, at 7:00 p.m. Exhibit A (attached) is Resolution No. 1011-04, as prepared by legal counsel, calling for the continuance. This action will provide additional time for the parties to reach a resolution.

#### FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

This matter will have no impact on the General Fund of the District. The cost of the proceedings to modify the Special Taxes, if any, is required by the Mello-Roos Act to be borne by the Developer.

DISTRICTS OF CAPISTRANO UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

In 1982, the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982 (Act) was passed, which authorizes local governments, including school districts, to establish Community Facilities Districts (CFDs) for the purpose of selling tax-exempt bonds to fund public improvements. Specifically for CUSD, the Act allows the District to establish CFDs, sell tax-exempt bonds therein, and levy annual taxes, for the purpose of financing public services and new facilities acquisition and construction.

The District currently has nine (9) CFDs established. The CFDs established are:

CFD No. 87-1	Aliso Viejo / Mission Viejo
CFD No. 88-1	Ranch Santa Margarita
CFD No. 90-1	Coto de Caza
CFD No. 90-2	Talega
CFD No. 90-2 IA	Talega – Improvement Area No. 2002-1)
CFD No. 92-1	Las Flores
CFD No. 94-1	Rancho Santa Margarita
CFD No. 98-1A	Pacifica San Juan
CFD No. 98-2	Ladera
CFD No. 2004-1	Rancho Madrina

Each CFD has several funds and accounts within it, for both revenue and expenditures that are the responsibility of the respective CFD. The fund and account types, and their uses and restrictions, are included below.

#### Special Tax Fund

- Taxes collected are deposited here. CUSD is unable to access these funds directly, as the revenue is collected and transferred to other funds and accounts within the CFD.
- Principal Account
  - o This account holds funds used to make the required principal component of debt service payments. CUSD does not have discretionary access to these funds.

#### 2010-11 FISCAL YEAR BUDGETS: COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICTS

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#### • Interest Account

o This account holds funds used to make the required interest component of debt service payments. CUSD does not have discretionary access to these funds.

#### Reserve Fund

- o This represents a calculated amount that is required as a contingency fund within the CFD. CUSD does not have discretionary access to these funds.
- Construction & Acquisition Fund
  - This account holds the funds that are designated for construction of the authorized facilities. CUSD does have discretionary access to these funds, within the authorized uses of the CFD.
- Administrative Expense Account
  - This account holds the funds that are designated for administrative costs of facilitating the CFD and construction projects. CUSD does have discretionary access to these funds, within the authorized uses of the CFD
- Special Reserve Fund
  - o In September of each year, once the required transfers have been made from the Special Tax Fund to make debt service payments, any amount remaining in the Special Tax Fund is transferred to the Special Reserve Fund. These funds may for purposes uses described in the Official Statement. CUSD does have access to these funds and uses them to pay administrative and project costs, within the authorized uses of the CFD.

#### **CURRENT CONSIDERATIONS**

The purpose of this agenda item is to request Board approval of the 2010-11 Fiscal Year Budget for Community Facilities District Nos. 87-1, 88-1, 90-2, 90-2 IA, 92-1, 94-1, 98-1A, 98-2, and 2004-1. A summary budget for each CFD is attached, as Exhibit A. Within these summary budgets are the following key components.

**Revenue Budgets** – David Taussig & Associates (DTA), the District's "Special Tax Consultant," has calculated the annual levy setting forth the Special Taxes required and authorized to be levied on each parcel in CFD. The resolutions authorizing the annual levy of special taxes are included under the consent calendar at the August 10, 2010 meeting. The revenues projected to be received for each respective CFD have been included in the revenue budget(s).

**Expenditure Budgets** – The 2010-11 expenditure budget(s) have been compiled to assume the following components.

- Books & Supplies
  - o This includes any miscellaneous supplies that may be required to supplement administrative activities.
- Services & Other Operating Expenses
  - o This includes administrative costs of facilitating the CFD and construction projects undertaken in the current fiscal year.

#### 2010-11 FISCAL YEAR BUDGETS: COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICTS

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- Capital Outlay
  - o This includes the costs of ongoing and currently known new construction projects that will be undertaken during the fiscal year.
- Debt Service Payment
  - o This includes the amounts that will be paid for principal and interest components of debt service payments during the fiscal year.

The District may make modifications to the 2010-11 fiscal year CFD budgets at any time, should the board authorize new, or changes to current, construction initiatives.

#### **FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS**

The financial implications of this agenda item have been detailed in Exhibits A, attached.

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

It is respectfully requested that the Board President recognize Ron Lebs, Deputy Superintendent, Business & Support Services who, along with Kristofer Pitman, Executive Director, Fiscal Services, will make a presentation to the Board regarding the 2010-11 Fiscal Year Budgets for the Community Facilities Districts of CUSD, and be available for Trustee questions.

Upon the conclusion of the presentation, it is respectfully recommended the Board adopt the 2010-11 Fiscal Year Budgets for Community Facilities District Nos. 87-1, 88-1, 90-2, 90-2 IA, 92-1, 94-1, 98-1A, 98-2, and 2004-1, attached as Exhibit A.

HIGH SCHOOL PILOT COURSE APPROVAL: FINANCIAL ALGEBRA

#### BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Aliso Niguel and Capistrano Valley High Schools would like to pilot a new math elective called Financial Algebra. Financial Algebra is a one-semester course designed to show students how algebraic, geometric, and statistical concepts are used in finance and business. Students will be exposed to topics involving the stock market, banking, consumer credit, income taxes, insurance, and retirement planning. Students will also have the opportunity to address modeling a business, owning a car, and preparing a budget. This course will demonstrate how algebra, geometry, and statistics are applied in real-world, meaningful contexts. The course outline is included in Exhibit A.

#### **CURRENT CONSIDERATIONS**

This item presents for Board consideration the approval of Financial Algebra to be piloted in the 2010-2011 school year.

#### **FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS**

There is no additional financial impact to the general fund concerning the piloting of this course.

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS

It is respectfully requested that Board President Anna Bryson recognize Gail Richards, Interim Executive Director, Education Division, who will present this item. It is recommended the Board approve the Financial Algebra course to be piloted in the 2010-2011 school year.

DISCUSSION/ ACTION

#### FINANCIAL ALGEBRA

#### **Overview:**

Financial Algebra directly answers the "When am I ever going to use this in real life?" question often asked by students in high school math classes. All math concepts are taught within a real-life context. The information is relevant and current, and will help students with their ability to manage money. There is a strong review of basic algebra, geometry, advanced algebra, and statistics. The development and interpretation of a variety of graphs, and the use of technology, including calculators, spreadsheets, and the Internet to gather current financial data, are imbedded throughout the course. Upon completion of the class, students will be able to make sound financial decisions based on mathematical models.

#### **Course Outline**

The topics covered in the course are directly aligned with the textbook, <u>Financial Algebra</u>. There are going to be ten major units of study throughout the year, where each unit of study corresponds to chapters from the textbook.

- 1. Students will begin with an overview of the stock market.
- 2. Students will learn how one models a business.
- 3. Students will learn about banking services.
- 4. Students will learn about consumer credit.
- 5. Students will learn about the many facets of automobile ownership.
- 6. Students will learn employment basics, including how to effectively look for employment and issues related to one's paycheck.
- 7. Students will learn how to pay income taxes.
- 8. Students will gain knowledge of how to live independently, including the details of purchasing a home.
- 9. Students will review retirement planning.
- 10. Students will learn how to prepare a budget.
