Budget Impact

Budget Area(s): Funds vary - Year to date 2010-2011 expenditure is \$250,000.00.

Background

The District advertised for School and Office Furniture, Bid #105-12, on July 13 and July 20, 2011 per Public Contract Code 10180. The purpose of the bid is to provide classroom and office furniture at all sites throughout the District. Bid packages were downloaded by 27 prospective bidders.

Current Consideration

The District conducted the bid opening on August 18, 2011 at 10:00 am. Five bids were received and evaluated by purchasing staff to insure adherence to district specifications and responsiveness according to Public Contract Code 20112.

Pursuant to Public Contract Code 20652 and 20118, other school districts and public agencies in the State of California may purchase identical items under the price, terms and conditions of this bid for up to five (5) years, published by Newport-Mesa Unified School District, from the awarded vendors. Culver-Newlin Inc., Concepts School and Office Furnishings and School Speciality Inc. have granted the piggyback option to the counties of Imperial, Kern, Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside, San Bernardino, San Diego, San Luis Obispo, Santa Barbara and Ventura. This bid is considered piggybackable to all public entities throughout the counties listed above.

1. Bids are to be returned on or prior to 10:00 a.m. on Thursday, August 11, 2011.
2. The items listed on the pages following are intended for use in the Newport-Mesa Unified School District for District school sites, administrative offices, and central warehouse.
3. The bid is to be submitted in a sealed envelope, plainly marked on the outside with the specific BID NUMBER and BID DUE DATE. Bids shall be submitted in ink or typed. No pencil figures or erasures are permitted. Mistakes may be crossed out and corrections inserted adjacent thereto and must be initialed in ink by person signing the bid. GENERAL CONDITIONS

1. The term of the contract shall be for a one (1) year period from the date of the award, renewable annually, by mutual written consent, for an additional four (4) years. The option may be exercised by the District, providing thirty (30) days written notice is given and accepted by the vendor. Contract period not to exceed five (5) years per Ed. Code 17596.
2. All prices are to remain firm for a minimum of one year from the date of award of the contract by the District's Governing Board.
3. **PRICE ADJUSTMENTS:** No price changes are permitted during the first one (1) year of the contract, after which prices quoted may be subject to adjustment (increase or decrease) in accordance with corresponding changes in manufacturer's published prices. Prices shall not be increased more than the Consumers Price Index for the greater Los Angeles/Orange metropolitan area, as published by the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics at: <http://www.bls.gov/cpi/>, but not to exceed 4%.
