At the June 13, 2011, Board meeting, the Board of Trustees awarded Bid No. 1011-11, Capistrano Valley High School Performing Arts Theater to Edge Development, Incorporated, in the amount of \$11,975,007. On Friday, September 14, 2012, Safeco Insurance Company of America and Liberty Mutual Insurance Company ("the Surety"), for the performing arts theater project, notified the District that Edge Development and its subcontractors would be demobilizing and no physical construction work would be performed after September 14, 2012. This was considered by the District a material breach of the original contract with Edge Development, Incorporated. This agenda item seeks Board approval to enter into a takeover agreement with the Surety to complete the original contract pursuant to all of its original terms, conditions, and provisions pursuant to its/their obligations under the Performance Bond and Original Contract.

Approval of teachers who are credentialed in subjects other than physical education to provide physical education credit to students in that respective sport. Districts may assign a teacher with a credential in a subject area other than physical education to coach a competitive sport and award physical education credit to students. State law requires that such teachers be full-time employees of a district, complete a minimum of 20 hours of first-aid instruction, have training on the harmful effects of steroid use, and be approved by the Board of Trustees. It has been determined that all teachers who do not hold a physical education credential, but are assigned coaching activities for which such credit is given, are full-time employees of the District and have completed cardio pulmonary resuscitation and first-aid instruction. Additionally, these coaches have attended or are in the process of attending a training program based on the Victory With Honor curriculum, which includes discussion on the dangerous effects of steroids. Coaching stipends are budgeted and funded through the general fund or through booster club donations.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR PRESENTATIONS TO THE BOARD BY PARENTS AND CITIZENS PRESENT AT THIS MEETING

We are pleased you can be with us at this meeting, and we hope you will return often. Your visit assures us of continuing community interest in our schools.

The members of the Board of Trustees of this District are locally elected state officials, who serve four-year terms of office, and who are responsible for the educational program of our community from grades kindergarten through twelve. They are required to conduct programs of the schools in accordance with the State of California Constitution, the State Education Code, and other laws relating to schools enacted by the Legislature, and policies and procedures which this Board adopts.

The Board is a policy-making body whose actions are guided by the school district's Mission and Goals. Administration of the District is delegated to a professional administrative staff headed by the Superintendent.

The agenda and its extensive background material are studied by each member of the Board for at least two days preceding the meeting. Board Members can call the administrative staff for clarification on any item, and many of the items on the agenda were discussed by the Board during previous meetings. These procedures enable the Board to act more effectively on agenda items than would otherwise be possible.

WHAT TO DO IF YOU WISH TO ADDRESS THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

ITEMS ON THE AGENDA. Any person may address the Board concerning any item on the agenda and may, at the discretion of the Board, be granted three (3) minutes to make a presentation to the Board at the time a specific item is under discussion. However, the time assigned for individual presentations could be fewer than three (3) minutes depending upon the total number of speakers who wish to address a specific agenda topic. Prior to the opening of the meeting, a Request to Address the Board card (located in the foyer) should be completed and submitted to the Secretary of the Board. The total time devoted to presentations to the Board shall not exceed twenty (20) minutes, unless additional time is granted by the Board. All presentations shall be heard by the Board prior to the formal discussion of the agenda topic under consideration. Once an agenda item has been opened for public comment, no additional "Request to Address the Board of Trustees" cards shall be accepted for that topic.

ORAL COMMUNICATIONS (Non-Agenda Items). Citizens may address the Board on any item not appearing on the agenda. Individual presentations are limited to three (3) minutes per individual, with twenty (20) minutes in total being devoted for this purpose, but could be less if there are a large number of Oral Communication speakers. Legally, the Board may not take action on items raised by speakers under Oral Communications. However, at its discretion, the Board may refer items to the administration for follow-up or place topics on a future Board agenda.

PUBLIC HEARINGS. Anytime the Board schedules a separate public hearing on any given topic, it shall not hear speakers on that topic before the public hearing, except as to the scheduling of the hearing, nor shall it hear speakers after the hearing, except as to changes in the policy or recommended actions which are directed at the time of the hearing.

CLOSED SESSION. In accordance with Education Code §35146 and Government Code §54957, the Board may recess to Closed Session to discuss personnel matters which they consider inadvisable to take up in a public meeting.

REASONABLE ACCOMMODATION

In order to help ensure participation in the meeting of disabled individuals, appropriate disability-related accommodations or modifications shall be provided by the Board, upon request, in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). Persons with a disability who require a disability-related accommodation or modification, including auxiliary aids and services in order to participate in a Board meeting, shall contact the Superintendent or designee in writing by noon on the Friday before the scheduled meeting. Such notification shall provide school district personnel time to make reasonable arrangements to assure accessibility to the meeting.





Dear Mr. Hughes:

The District has received the attached email from Mike Tomeo of Benchmark Consulting, LLC to Walt Eden, Edenco, Inc., stating that "... as of Friday, September 14, 2012, Liberty Mutual will no longer be funding ongoing construction operations at the Capo Valley High School project and Edge Development and its subcontractors will be demobilizing. ...the projects [will be] demobilized and secured beyond September 14, 2012; however, no physical construction work will be performed after September 14, 2012." The District considers this a material breach of the original Contract.

As such, the District calls upon Safeco Insurance Company of America and Liberty Mutual Insurance Company (hereinafter collectively referred to as "Surety") to complete the Original Contract pursuant to all of its original terms, conditions and provisions pursuant to its/their obligations under the Performance Bond and Original Contract.

The District acknowledges that Surety will complete the Original Contract as a completing surety and hire a licensed general contractor to complete the Original Contract as a subcontractor to the surety. The District has the right to reject the general contractor selected by the Surety.

The general contractor shall:

- (1) be the representative and agent of the Surety with the power to bind the Surety regarding completion of all obligations owed to the District under the Original Contract;
- (2) procure and pay for (without such costs being charged to the District) new insurance policies as required by the Original Contract and have the District, the Surety, and Benchmark Consulting Services, LLC. named as additional insureds thereon;
- (3) not mobilize on the Project site or perform work of any kind for the Project until the new insurance policies and endorsements (naming the additional insureds) are delivered to the District;
- (4) communicate directly with District personnel and District representatives regarding all aspects of completing the Original Contract; and
- (5) complete the Original Contract pursuant to all of its original terms, conditions and provisions.

The District shall have no contractual relationship with the general contractor.

Mr. Mike Tomeo, of Benchmark Consulting Services, LLC., shall also act as a representative and agent of the Surety regarding the completion of the Original Contract for billing and change order purposes, over which, on behalf of the Surety, he has full authority to act on behalf of and bind the Surety.

The Original Contract shall remain in full force and effect except as supplemented and/or modified by the express terms of this letter agreement. The Payment Bond and Performance Bond, each of which had a penal sum limit equal to 100% of the Original Contract Amount when issued, shall both remain in full force and effect as required by the Original Contract; the express terms, conditions, and provisions of each bond; and as required under applicable law. The Surety's exposure under each bond shall be capped at and shall not exceed the penal sum limit of each bond.

The Original Contract amount was \$11,975,007.00. The Original Contract has been amended via the contractual change process using Change Orders and Work Orders. Work Orders have been issued pursuant to the delegated authority of the Board of Trustees and have later been consolidated into Change Orders which have been ratified by the Board of Trustees. Work Orders numbered 1 through 58 have been mutually approved and signed. Change Orders numbered 1 through 11 have been mutually approved and signed. Change Order #12, containing Work Orders 52 through 57 is scheduled for Board of Trustees ratification on September 24, 2012. Work Order #58 is scheduled to be ratified by the Board of Trustees on October 8, 2012 as Change Order #13. The aggregate amount of the mutually approved Work Orders and Change Orders to date is \$496,692.00. Therefore, the Revised Original Contract Amount is \$12,471,699.00. As of Payment Application #11, the total of work completed and stored-to-date was \$6,224,365.65 of which \$622,436.57 is currently being retained. The balance of \$5,601,929.08 has been paid to Edge. Payment Application #12 has been received by the district and is currently in the process of review. Payment Application #12 states a total of work completed and stored-to-date of \$7,060,286.79 of which \$706,028.68 will be retained. The current payment amount due of \$752,329.03 will be paid when all certified payrolls for the claimed construction period have been logged. As of Payment Application #12, the Balance to Finish including Retainage is \$6,088,724.89. Payment Application #12 does not include the value of Work Orders # 56 through 58 in the Balance to Finish.

Upon the take over by the Surety as provided for herein, the District pledges to apply the Remaining Original Contract Balance for the completion of the Project by making progress payments to the Surety as the work progresses per the terms, conditions and provisions of the Original Contract and applicable law. Should the Remaining Original Contract Balance be insufficient to complete the original scope of work, and any change orders and/or Work Orders approved as of the effective date of this letter agreement under the Original Contract, funds from the Performance Bond shall be used by the Surety to do so.

The Original Contract Completion date was February 5, 2013. The date has been extended by one or more mutually approved and signed Work Order(s) and/or Change Order(s). The Revised Completion Date is now April 30, 2013.

The District, on the one hand, and the Surety, on the other hand, each reserve, as against one another and as against any and all third parties, any and all rights, remedies, claims, defenses and offsets that the District and the Surety may have regarding the Original Contract and anything required thereby, the Payment Bond, the Performance Bond, Edge, and the Project generally. This letter agreement is made for the benefit of the District and the Surety only and is not intended to benefit, and shall not run to the benefit of, any third parties.

Should the general contractor be in default of and/or materially breach any term, condition or provision of the Original Contract, the District shall provide notice to the Surety as required therein, except that such notice will be sent to:

The Surety shall cause any such default and/or breach to be cured promptly.

The District and the Surety also agree:

- (1) to cooperate in good faith with one another so that the Original Contract can be completed as efficiently and quickly as possible;
- (2) that this letter agreement shall:
 - (i) be binding upon the District and the Surety and their respective successors and assigns, once approved by the District's Governing Board;
 - (ii) be executed in several counterparts each of which when taken together shall constitute a single written instrument;

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- (iii) as an option, have signatures sent via electronic pdf format, but which nevertheless shall be treated as originals;
- (iv) not be construed, if there should be any ambiguity, in favor of or against either the District or the Surety on the basis of who drafted it or any of its terms, conditions, or provisions;
- (v) not constitute an admission or waive of any rights, claims or defenses available to either the District or the Surety;
- (vi) upon the Surety signing below and returning same to the District, be placed on the Board of Education's agenda for review and approval or rejection; and
- (vii) have no force or effect of any kind until the District's Board of Education approves it.

Please be advised that as of Friday, September 14, 2012, Liberty Mutual will no longer be funding ongoing construction operations at the Capo Valley High School project and Edge Development and its subcontractors will be demobilizing. Liberty Mutual will continue to pay certain Edge project people through September 21, 2012 (or longer as needed), and Liberty Mutual may engage one or more of those individuals to assist Benchmark in ensuring that the projects are properly demobilized and secured beyond September 14, 2012; however, no physical construction work will be performed after September 14, 2012. Be advised that Liberty Mutual will be changing the locks on the construction fences and Edge trailers. Mr. Hampton stated these checks are unrelated to the fees paid to Corvel for their services; however, when Corvel renegotiated its five year contract this year, the District and Corvel changed the way their services were provided, which is expected to save \$100,000 each year for five years.

Trustee Bryson asked staff to provide an explanation code or a report for vendor amounts exceeding \$250,000 on the Purchase Orders, Commercial Warrants, and Previously Board-Approved Bids and Contracts Board items in the future. Mr. Hampton stated he would research with staff the ability to prepare a report.



A) Yes. Seismic anchorage of the theater rigging counterweight system is required.

There may be acceptable alternate systems of restraining the counterweight system per CAC 4-303 (see the rationale). If weights will be stored on a raised level such as a catwalk used as a loading bridge, then the there must be provisions to prevent the weights from falling off the loading bridge, such as a curb, and the loading bridge must be designed for the additional lateral load due to the weights (use an effective seismic weight of 25% of the weights similar to storage use). Battens need not be restrained.

B) The counterweight system may be designed for an effective seismic weight Wp as follows:

1 Elements that resist the seismic lateral loads of a single arbor such as a guide shoe or guide rail must be designed for an effective seismic weight of 100% of the design capacity of the arbor.

2 If there are members that distribute the seismic lateral loads of multiple arbors to the support framing, then those members and the support framing may used a reduced effective seismic weight as follows:

-The anchorage elements located where the arbor is at the lowest level may be designed for an effective seismic weight of 50% of the design capacity of the arbors.

The anchorage elements located above the lowest level of the arbors may be designed for an effective seismic weight of 25% of the design capacity of the arbors.

, - Rationale

Provide justification for the decision/interpretation:

There is no exception in ASCE7 for the anchorage of the theater counterweight system.

One alternate system to restraining the counterweight system may be to corral the arbors between structural freming/walls on each side for the full travel height of the arbors, capable of resisting the arbor lateral loading. This might be a system of horizontal beams spaced at approximately 1/2 the arbor height to contain the arbors.

A reduction of effective mass is based on the probability of how much of the design capacity of the counterweight system may occur at a given location. Individual elements must be designed for the full design load of an arbor. Members that distribute the lateral loads of multiple arbors to the support framing must have adequate strength and stiffness to distribute the load to the support framing. Most of the arbors will be located in the down position most of the time. It is not likely that all arbors will be located and those that are loaded may not be at their full capacity.

Partial list of definitions from ANSI E1-4:

Batten: A pipe, tube, or other singular structural shape that is secured to the lift lines. Battens are used for flying scenery, curtains, lighting and audio equipment, adjustable architectural/acoustical decor, or combination thereof. Battens are typically installed parallel to the proscenium, horizontal, and extend beyond the width of the proscenium opening.

Counterweight: A weight used to balance the load on a line that is being raised, lowered, or held in position.

Counterweight arbor guide: A component of a counterweight arbor assembly that engages the guide rails in order to maintain vertical alignment over the length of the arbor travel.

Guide shoe: A device that connects a counterweight arbor or tension block to the guide rails in order to control the path of its travel.

Guide ralls: A means of guiding the counterweight arbor throughout its travel in the vertical plane, but which also prevents horizontal or twisting motions of the arbor.

Head block: The stationary sheave or block assembly directly above the counterweight arbor or pin rall. The head block permits lift lines to change direction.

Loading bridge: An elevated area, located to permit counterweight loading and unloading at the arbor,

The Project Documents are complementary, and what is called for by any one shall be as binding as if called for by all.
- 2. CONTRACTOR shall perform within the time set forth in Paragraph 4 of this Agreement everything required to be performed, and shall provide, furnish and pay for all the labor, materials, necessary tools, expendable equipment, and all taxes, utility and transportation services required for construction of the Project. - The work shall be commenced on or before the seventh (7th) day after receiving the DISTRICT'S Purchase Order and shall be completed within the time specified by Director of Maintenance/Operations and Construction or Designee on behalf of the DISTRICT.
