1. SPECIAL EDUCATION COMMUNITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE ANNUAL REPORT:

California Education Code §\$56190-56194 specifies that each Special Education Local Plan Area must establish a Community Advisory Committee (CAC) with parents of students with special needs forming the majority of membership. Other members include parents of other students in the District, general education and special education teachers, school personnel, representatives of public and private agencies, and persons concerned with individuals with exceptional needs. CAC members are appointed by the Board of Trustees for a period of two years in an advisory capacity. CAC responsibilities include: advising the District on the plan for special education, recommending annual priorities, assisting in parent education, recruiting parents and other volunteers, encouraging community involvement in special education, supporting activities on behalf of individuals with special needs, and assisting in parent awareness of the importance of regular school attendance. This presentation will highlight the 2013-2014 CAC accomplishments.

2. SOUTH COAST REGIONAL OCCUPATION PROGRAM JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT AND RESTRUCTURE:

The South Coast Regional Occupation Program (ROP) and Joint Powers Agreement (JPA) between the District and Laguna Beach Unified School District have been in place since 1970. Over the years, the JPA has been amended with minor changes. The new State funding, Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), requires the ROP JPA be amended as a result of the language related to funding. The District would like to maintain and amend the ROP JPA in order to ensure an integrated high school program so all students are ready for college and career through better articulation with ROP, Saddleback, and Career Technical Education programs and services; addressing the duplicative infrastructure of ROP; and reducing the \$2.9 million funding allocated to ROP in order to develop additional pathways and courses for students, and provide additional counselors and academic advisors (guidance support). This item will provide background on the funding changes, information on what is required, and a summary of District's proposed plan based on the work with Laguna Beach Unified School District and South Coast ROP.

12. AWARD BID NO. 1415-17, MOVEMENT AND RECONFIGURATION OF RELOCATABLE BUILDINGS TO G.A. DOMINGUEZ:

Approval of Award of Bid No. 1415-17, Movement and Reconfiguration of Relocatable Buildings to G.A. Dominguez. Twelve entities registered and downloaded documents; three bids were received and opened on January 13, 2015. The three bidders include: G.A. Dominguez; Impact Construction Services, Incorporated; and Pacific MH Construction, Incorporated. G.A. Dominguez is the lowest responsive, responsible bidder. The bid award was determined by creating eight job scenarios of the most common District repairs using select line items at different quantities at weighted percentages. The term of the base contract is March 1, 2015, through February 29, 2016, with two one-year renewal terms, at the option of the Board of Trustees, for a total contract term not-to-exceed three years. Annual expenditures utilizing this contract are estimated to be \$250,000, funded by deferred maintenance funds, routine restricted maintenance funds, Developer Fees, and Community Facilities Districts.

13. SIMI VALLEY UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL RELATING TO MICROSOFT ENROLLMENT FOR EDUCATION SOLUTIONS SOFTWARE LICENSES WITH SHI INTERNATIONAL CORPORATION:

Approval to utilize the Simi Valley Unified School District Request for Proposal for the volume licensing agreement relating to Microsoft Enrollment for Education Solutions software licenses from SHI International, Corporation, under the same terms and conditions of the public agency's contract. This contract provides competitive set pricing for Microsoft Enrollment for Education Solutions software licenses, as needed by the District.

Annual expenditures utilizing this contract are estimated to be \$200,000, funded by the general fund. School boards have the authority to "piggyback" on another public agency's bid, per Public Contract Code \$20118, when it is in the best interest of a district. It is often advantageous to utilize piggyback contracts when items are identical to the District's specifications. Using piggyback contracts saves time and often provides lower prices than a single jurisdiction would be able to obtain. Due to the size of the contract and award, the documentation will be posted online on the District Board Agendas and Supporting Documentation page.

16. AUTHORIZATION OF COACHES TO PROVIDE SECOND SEMESTER PHYSICAL EDUCATION CREDIT:

Approval of teachers who are credentialed in subjects other than physical education (PE) to provide PE credit to students in that respective sport. Districts may assign a teacher with a credential in a subject area other than PE to coach a competitive sport and award PE credit to students. State law requires that such teachers be full-time employees of a district, complete a minimum of 20 hours of first-aid instruction, have training on the harmful effects of steroid use, and be approved by the Board of Trustees. It has been determined all teachers who do not hold a physical education credential, but are assigned coaching activities for which such credit is given, are full-time employees of the District, and have completed cardiopulmonary resuscitation and first-aid certification. Coaching stipends are budgeted and funded through the general fund or booster club donations.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR PRESENTATIONS TO THE BOARD BY PARENTS AND CITIZENS PRESENT AT THIS MEETING

We are pleased you can be with us at this meeting, and we hope you will return often. Your visit assures us of continuing community interest in our schools.

The members of the Board of Trustees of this District are locally elected state officials, who serve four-year terms of office, and who are responsible for the educational program of our community from grades kindergarten through twelve. They are required to conduct programs of the schools in accordance with the State of California Constitution, the State Education Code, and other laws relating to schools enacted by the Legislature, and policies and procedures which this Board adopts.

The Board is a policy-making body whose actions are guided by the school district's Mission and Goals. Administration of the District is delegated to a professional administrative staff headed by the Superintendent.

The agenda and its extensive background material are studied by each member of the Board for at least two days preceding the meeting. Board Members can call the administrative staff for clarification on any item, and many of the items on the agenda were discussed by the Board during previous meetings. These procedures enable the Board to act more effectively on agenda items than would otherwise be possible.

WHAT TO DO IF YOU WISH TO ADDRESS THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

ITEMS ON THE AGENDA. Any person may address the Board concerning any item on the agenda and may, at the discretion of the Board, be granted three (3) minutes to make a presentation to the Board at the time a specific item is under discussion. However, the time assigned for individual presentations could be fewer than three (3) minutes depending upon the total number of speakers who wish to address a specific agenda topic. Prior to the opening of the meeting, a Request to Address the Board card (located in the foyer) should be completed and submitted to the Secretary of the Board. The total time devoted to presentations to the Board shall not exceed twenty (20) minutes, unless additional time is granted by the Board. All presentations shall be heard by the Board prior to the formal discussion of the agenda topic under consideration. Once an agenda item has been opened for public comment, no additional "Request to Address the Board of Trustees" cards shall be accepted for that topic.

ORAL COMMUNICATIONS (Non-Agenda Items). Citizens may address the Board on any item not appearing on the agenda. Individual presentations are limited to three (3) minutes per individual, with twenty (20) minutes in total being devoted for this purpose, but could be less if there are a large number of Oral Communication speakers. Legally, the Board may not take action on items raised by speakers under Oral Communications. However, at its discretion, the Board may refer items to the administration for follow-up or place topics on a future Board agenda.

PUBLIC HEARINGS. Anytime the Board schedules a separate public hearing on any given topic, it shall not hear speakers on that topic before the public hearing, except as to the scheduling of the hearing, nor shall it hear speakers after the hearing, except as to changes in the policy or recommended actions which are directed at the time of the hearing.

CLOSED SESSION. In accordance with Education Code §35146 and Government Code §54957, the Board may recess to Closed Session to discuss personnel matters which they consider inadvisable to take up in a public meeting.

REASONABLE ACCOMMODATION

In order to help ensure participation in the meeting of disabled individuals, appropriate disability-related accommodations or modifications shall be provided by the Board, upon request, in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). Persons with a disability who require a disability-related accommodation or modification, including auxiliary aids and services in order to participate in a Board meeting, shall contact the Superintendent or designee in writing by noon on the Friday before the scheduled meeting. Such notification shall provide school district personnel time to make reasonable arrangements to assure accessibility to the meeting.

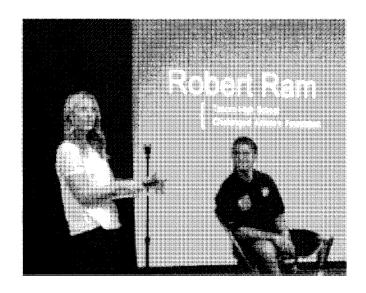
Provide parent education opportunities, give families an opportunity to communicate with District administrators, connect with other parents, and share resources and support.

Support activities on behalf of individuals with exceptional needs.



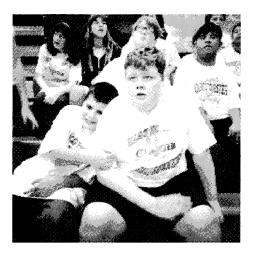
CAC and PTA

CAC also works in partnership with PTA. Each school has a Special Education parent representative for their site. The representative attends CAC meetings, reports back to their schools' PTA, works to connect parents of students with special needs, and helps bridge the gap between the general education and special education community.



CAC Mission

To foster positive connections and awareness of Special Education among students, parents, and the District while providing input in Special Education so all students become successful life-long learners.



Ability Awareness Programs

Special Education parent representatives continue to hold Ability Awareness programs at their school sites. These programs range from full-day, hands-on activities, to assembly speakers, lunch buddy groups, and even an after school book club who chose a selection focusing on a character with a disability. The purpose behind all of these activities is to help teach our general education students more about our special education students, and the importance of embracing all people regardless of differences.



Accomplishments from 2103 to Present

- Monthly meetings offering parent education, a chance to connect with other parents, and hear updates from Special Education administrators.
- Worked with the Special Education administration to complete a document, entitled "IEP Participation Tips" which offers to help parents prepare for IEP meetings. This document is now posted on the District website, Special Education section.



Ways To Support Your Participation In Your Child's Individualized Education Program (IEP) Meeting

Keep in mind, everyone is attending the IEP meeting for a common purpose, your child.

Prepare an "About my Child" document that includes your goals for your child, strengths and challenges, and parent concerns. You can send this to your child's teacher in advance of the meeting. This helps all the IEP team members prepare draft goals and complete paperwork.

If you would like, request copies of draft documents prior to the IEP meetings from the case carrier. This may include assessment reports and goals/objectives. Review these documents before the meeting so you are prepared to discuss them.

Please arrive on time and ready to start the meeting.

Don't be afraid to ask questions. Ask for clarification if something is unclear. Ask questions if you have a concern.

Make requests in writing so the District can follow-up as needed. Also, review IEP notes at the end of the meeting, before you leave, to ensure your requests are appropriately captured.

If necessary, you can agree to disagree in a respectful way.

Remember, you can take the IEP document home after the meeting to read it fully before signing in agreement to all or part of the IEP.

Accomplishments from 2013 to Present

Newly posted on the Special Education website are forms for parents who have children transitioning from elementary to middle school and from middle to high school. CAC helped share these valuable resources created by our Special Education administrators.



Frequently Asked Questions – Parent Resource Transition from Elementary to Middle School

- 1. Will my child have a new case carrier/manager?
- A case carrier will be assigned prior to the first day of school. As in elementary school, your
 case carrier will support instruction, monitor student progress, ensure accommodations are
 provided, coordinate related services, communicate with you, your child and staff and hold IEP
 meetings.
- 2. Will my child still get the services he/she had in elementary school?
- Your child's IEP designates the support and services to be received. Related services (for example: speech, adapted PE, occupational therapy) are available at all sites and provided per the IEP. Goals will be worked on in all settings specified on the IEP.
- 3. What does special education support and instruction look like in the middle school?
- Instructional options are based on student need. Each middle school site adjusts course
 offerings annually based on the needs of the students. All middle schools are able to provide
 appropriate instruction and support for students with mild/moderate disabilities.
- **These are just a few of the questions and answers on this form.

Accomplishments from 2013 to Present

- Parent Education night focusing on parent rights in the IEP process.
- Parent Education night on how to organize your child's IEP binder.
- Involvement in the planning and volunteering at three Special Olympic events.
- Participation in Special Education Literacy Task Force. The purpose of this task force was to define literacy as it relates to curriculum and instruction for Secondary STEPS students. Staff has been provided:
 - · a broader definition of literacy
 - · new materials have been adopted for use
 - · in-service training
 - · structured literacy blocks have been embedded in the instructional day
 - · opportunities for reinforcement throughout the day.
- The task force will continue to monitor the implementation of this program.
- Two CAC members accompanied District administrative staff to the annual Legislative Information Day in Sacramento.



Looking Forward

- Continue to provide monthly meetings which include parent education on topics such as, inclusion, applied behavioral analysis, and behavior management.
- Host a Parent Education night on what parents need to understand about common core for students with special needs.
- Continue to offer support to all District site PTA presidents and work together with their schools' Special Education parent representatives.
- Foster an already positive relationship with the District Special Education administration.



Finally,

The hope is for CAC to be a positive force by building connections for all families of children with special needs, participation by District staff, Trustees, and community members in CAC meetings and events, and have CAC be a place of support without judgment.

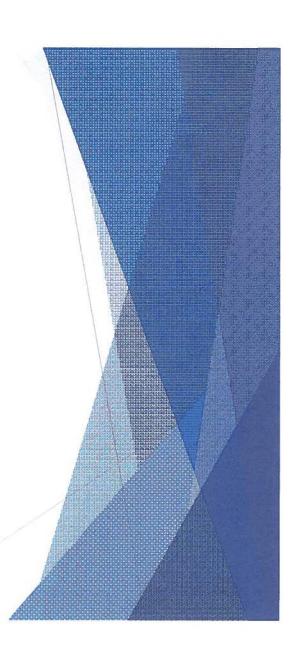

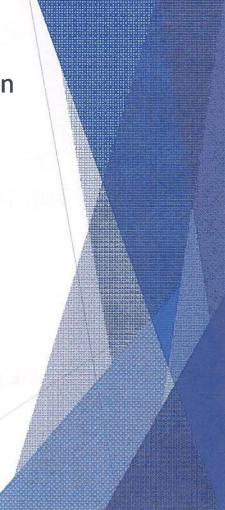
CUSD's Vision

Background on JPA

- The ROP and Joint Powers Agreement (JPA) have been in place since 1970 between CUSD & LBUSD
- Over the years, the JPA has been amended with minor changes
- Education Code for ROPs with a dedicated funding source has changed
- The new State funding, Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), requires that the ROP JPA be amended as a result of the language related to funding by June 30, 2015

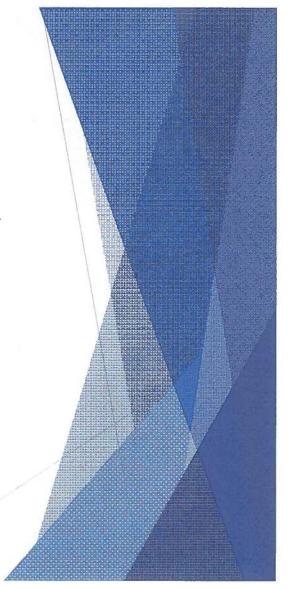
Background on Funding

- Under Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), CUSD received 7 million dollars in additional funding
- 2.9 million had to be spent on ROP during the required
 2013-14 and 2014-15 school years
- The ROP Maintenance of Effort (MOE) sunsets on June 30, 2015
- CUSD now has the decision as to how we want to spend the \$2,934,000; LBUSD continues to spend \$138,908 on ROP

SCHOOL OF CHOICE

Purpose and Intent

The Board of Trustees endorses the neighborhood public school concept. However, the Board recognizes that some parents/guardians may wish to choose a school of attendance other than their school of residence. Thus, the School of Choice program shall be included as an integral feature of the District's instructional offerings.

School of residence attendance areas, sSchool capacities and class size mandates/guidelines are established to optimize the use of existing facilities and to maintain relatively balanced enrollments. All District schools offer high quality instructional programs addressing the District's mission, goals, and adopted curricula. However, parents/guardians may wish to apply to other District schools in order to take advantage of specialized or innovative programs, or to meet other family needs.

The parents/guardians of any student who resides within District boundaries may apply to enroll their child in any District school, regardless of the location of residence within the District. (Education Code 35160.5)

Priority Criteria for School Placement

District students residing in any Board approved school attendance area shall first be provided the option of attending their school of residence. After a determination of the number of open seats in each school, all students within each school's attendance area have been accommodated within established class-size mandates, and after all students in categories. A and B below have been placed, requests for School of Choice placement will be honored according to the following priority until all openings in a given school are filled:

- A. District students who want to return to their school of residence
- B. District students who:
 - 1. Have continuously attended the school for at least one full year, but have moved into another District school's attendance area
 - 2. Reside in an area affected by an attendance boundary change who wish to remain attheir existing school
 - 3. Are siblings of any student currently in attendance who will continue to be enrolled at the same school the next year
- C. District students whose residence is not within the school's attendance area but whose parents/guardians pay a Mello-Roos tax that helped support construction of the school.
- D. District students who reside in a feeder pattern that divides students to different school sites upon promotion to the next school level (elementary school to middle school or middle school to high school) will be provided the opportunity to attend the same school as the majority of students in their feeder pattern
- E. All other District students requesting School of Choice placement

SCHOOL OF CHOICE (continued)

A. <u>First priority will be given to students who are enrolled in a Program Improvement School under the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001.</u>

- B. Second priority will be given to students who continuously attended the school in the prior year, either through School of Choice or their parents moved to the attendance area of another District school, and wish to remain at the same school.
- C. Third priority will be given to a K-11 student whose sibling is already enrolled in a school and will be co-enrolled during the coming school year. Sibling means brother/sister, step-brother/sister, or foster brother/sister. Co-enrolled means both siblings will be at the same school for the year. This applies to kindergarten through twelfth grade students.
- D. Fourth priority will be given to program participation in two-way immersion.
- E. <u>Fifth priority will be given to students from a Community Facilities District which contributes Mello-Roos funds to that school, as described in Board Policy 5116.</u>
- F. Sixth priority will be given to all other students based on an unbiased, random lottery.

Determination of Openings

District staff shall project the initial number of School of Choice classroom seats which will be available for the fall of the following school year. In this analysis, staff shall consider each of the following elements:

- 1. Current enrollment as it rolls forward and provides a basis for the following year's enrollment.
- 2. Projected new enrollments for the school's entry grade level (K, 6, or 9).
- 3. Projected new enrollments due to the construction of new housing facilities in the attendance area District boundaries during the next year.
- 4. The ratio of enrollment to capacity as compared with the enrollment to capacity ratio of other schools in the surrounding area.
- 5. Plans for the construction of new school facilities, which would provide future relief from current overcrowded conditions.
- 6. Special programs which may have particular enrollment requirements or limitations.

When the School of Choice process is implemented each year, the initial number of openings assigned to each school may be augmented as students who are currently enrolled in a given school transfer to another school site during the School of Choice process.

SCHOOL OF CHOICE (continued)

Schools with Openings

Each year the Superintendent or designee shall utilize all available information to determine which schools have openings. Schools identified without additional openings may accept students in Priority A and Priority B categories only. Schools with openings will begin the School of Choice process with a designated number of openings. Students will be placed in order of the placement priority criteria referenced in this policy.

Placement Procedures

The openings will be filled in the order of the above-listed placement priority criteria, until all open seats in that priority area are filled or all requests have been met, whichever occurs first. If the number of remaining available spaces at that school does not accommodate all students within a single Priority Category, then the District shall conduct a lottery among the students within that Priority Category and grant applications in the order of the names drawn within that category, followed by a lottery among the students within the next Priority Category (if any) within this grouping.

The School of Choice timeline will be published on the District website.

School of Choice applications shall be initiated by a student's parent/guardian. Applications must be submitted on the District-designated form, which is available at the District office, in each school office, and on the District website. Parents/guardians seeking placement for multiple children must submit a separate application for each student.

Applications for enrollment to language immersion programs will only be available at language immersion sites. Parents/guardians desiring to enroll students in a language immersion site must submit applications directly to the site(s) of choice within the designated School of Choice timeline. Students matriculating from elementary to middle or middle to high school language immersion programs will have the right to continue to attend the language immersion program within the same feeder pattern, provided space is available.

Parents/guardians who have applied for a School of Choice transfer by the published application deadline shall be notified of the status of their transfer request by late spring. School of Choice approval is school specific and does not guarantee placement in the feeder school(s) for the school of choice.

After the number of openings has been determined and applications processed, a determination will be made as to whether sufficient openings exist to accommodate all applications. In the event there are more applications for School of Choice into any given school than openings in a given school, a lottery procedure for placement will be implemented which takes into account the priority criteria referenced in this policy and considers the openings which are available according to grade level.

Students in priority B may continue to apply beyond the published application deadline. Applications for School of Choice will not be accepted after the School of Choice window in an effort for schools to accurately determine staffing needs and student placement for the following school year.

SCHOOL OF CHOICE (continued)

Eligibility for Interscholastic Athletic Participation

When a student enrolls as a freshman (Grade 9) in any District high school, he/she will have that school identified as the school of attendance for athletic eligibility. Once eligibility has been established, a transfer to a different high school under School of Choice may result in a declaration of ineligibility to participate. Students considering a transfer to another District high school should contact California Interscholastic Federation (CIF) for eligibility guidelines.

Recruitment of students by school personnel to attend a high school other than the school of residence for the purpose of athletic participation is prohibited in accordance with CIF rules and regulations.

Home-to-School Bus Transportation

Transportation of students who have been placed through the School of Choice process is the responsibility of the parent/guardian.

Non-requirements to the District

In implementing the School of Choice program, the District is not required to:

- 1. Make alterations in the structure or grounds of any schools or make alterations to the arrangement or function of rooms within District schools.
- 2. Establish and offer any particular program in a school if such program is not offered currently in each school in the District.
- 3. Alter or waive any established eligibility criteria for participation in a particular program including age requirements, course prerequisites, and required levels of performance.

Transfer Back to the School of Residence

Students approved for School of Choice placement in accordance with the priority placement criteria spelled out in this policy shall abide by all school rules and procedures. Principals may recommend to Student Services the involuntary transfer of students back to their school of residence or another school deemed appropriate for any of the following reasons:

- 1. Unsatisfactory attendance
- 2. Continual tardiness
- 3. Failure of the parent/guardian to make adequate transportation arrangements
- 4. Unsatisfactory academic performance
- 5. Unsatisfactory behavior
- 6. No longer residing within District boundaries

SCHOOL OF CHOICE (continued)

Students being transferred back to their school of residence or another school deemed appropriate have the right to an Admission and Discharge hearing relative to the infraction which caused the involuntary transfer.

Students determined to have enrolled in a school by falsifying attendance or residency records shall be returned to their school of residence immediately. These students will not qualify as Priority \underline{F} A or B students even if they otherwise meet the stated priority criteria.

Students requesting a transfer to their school of residence, after having been accepted into another school through the School of Choice process, will not be guaranteed a place in their school of residence, until after the next School of Choice cycle, unless space is available. Students must reapply in writing for School of Choice placement at their school of residence within the designated School of Choice timeline.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE BOUNDARIES

The Governing Board of Trustees shall regularly review school attendance boundaries, taking into account school capacities and enrollment data, geographic features, student safety and transportation, specialized educational programs, academies, site capacities, future residential development, future school construction, and community input.

In order to make efficient use of facilities and to plan for the organization, operation, and administration of the schools, the Capistrano Unified School District Board of Trustees establishes attendance boundaries for each elementary, middle, and high school within the District in compliance with the Education Code.

Attendance boundaries are established to maximize efficient use of existing District facilities and avoid crowded conditions. Factors which may influence boundary decisions include: growth or decline of school-aged population, density of population, traffic conditions, topography, capacities of existing buildings, projected future residential development, and future school construction.

When analyzing attendance boundary adjustments the following factors should be taken under consideration.

Guidelines for Developing Attendance Boundary Options and Recommendations-

To the extent possible and feasible, the following factors will be considered when developing attendance boundary options and recommendations:

- 1. Balance student populations and enrollment numbers among existing schools.
- 2. Optimize the use of existing facilities.
- 3. Consider the potential long-term impact of:
 - Residential developments either planned or under construction in a given specific school attendance area.
 - The extent a given specific school's attendance area is built-out and experiencing either an influx of new, young families or families without plans for school age children the "empty nest" phenomenon.
- 4. Consider the impact which proposed elementary boundary changes will have on middle school attendance boundaries and the impact middle school attendance boundaries will have on high school attendance boundaries.
- 5. Maintain the "neighborhood school concept."
- 6. Avoid multiple school moves for students.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE BOUNDARIES (continued)

7. Consider which communities have directly contributed to the construction of a school through Mello-Roos taxes or the allocation of developer fee funding which helped pay for a school, to the extent that any priority reflect the proportionality of each school's financing provided through the community facilities district, in accordance with the Government Code, §53312.7(b). Proportionality shall mean that Community Facilities Districts will be given priority to a percentage of open seats proportional to the community's contributions.

- 7. Avoid boundary adjustments resulting in schools becoming socio-economically identifiable.
- 8. Consider various options to house students, including the:
 - Reassignment of selected study areas to other schools.
 - Addition of relocatable classrooms.
 - Use of multi-purpose gathering rooms and other non-classroom areas.
 - Criteria designation for encouraging or discouraging and even prohibiting outside student enrollment using the District's "Open Enrollment School of Choice" option.
 - Reassignment of special education (special day) classes to other schools.
 - Reassignment of other programs (preschool; community education) to other schools.
 - Temporary reassignment of grade level or levels to another school site.
 - Implementation of multi-track year-round school schedules.
 - Implementation of double sessions or extension of day schedules.

Since attendance boundaries are established on a long-term basis, any <u>K-12</u> student affected by an attendance boundary change in a given year, to the extent possible and feasible, may be provided the opportunity to be "grandfathered," thereby remaining at the existing school of attendance rather than moving to the new school. In the interest of maintaining family ties, this option may, to the extent possible and feasible, also include any sibling of an originally grandfathered student, so long as that sibling is in attendance at the school at the same time as the originally grandfathered student. Originally grandfathered students and their siblings would not, however, have the availability of fee-based home to school transportation to the formerly assigned school.

In recognition that some middle school students may reside within a study area which is within easy walking distance of a closer middle school, the Board will allow such affected students to attend either the middle school of the study area or the middle school which is within easy walking distance. For purposes of this policy, easy walking distance is defined as one-half mile or less.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE BOUNDARIES (continued)

The Superintendent or designee may make an administrative placement of a student in a school outside of his/her attendance area. Such administrative placements will be made only under-unusual circumstances dangerous conditions at the Superintendent's or designee's discretion, and will remain in effect for one school year or for as long as the student's attendance, behavior, and scholarship are satisfactory.

Students residing in a community facilities district shall have priority, to the extent provided by law, for attendance at schools financed in whole or in part by the community facilities district.

Staff is working to align all plans to provide coherence and focus, including the alignment of the District's LEA Plan to the District's LCAP. Dr. Hatchel concluded her presentation by describing the actions that LEAs will take to ensure they meet certain programmatic requirements, including student academic services designed to increase student performance, coordination of services, needs assessments, consultations, services to homeless students, school choice, supplemental services, and others as required.

INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT

This AGREEMENT is hereby entered into between Capistrano Unified School District, hereinafter referred to as "District", and Barrios and Associates, LLC, dba Communications LAB, hereinafter referred to as "Contractor".

WHEREAS, District is authorized by Section 53060 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of special services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal or administrative matters, if such persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required;

WHEREAS, District is in need of such special services and advice; and

WHEREAS, Contractor is specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required by the District, and such services are needed on a limited basis;

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

1. Services to be provided by Contractor: provide information to news media and develop press releases; arrange interviews and conferences for representatives of newspapers and other media for dissemination of public information; maintain a professional relationship with newspapers and other media representatives; seek out and cultivate news and information resources for the development of positive stories; develop and promote interest amount groups supportive of the district's education objectives to expand the organization's positive reputation; arrange for reproduction or printing and distribution of public relations materials within prescribed timelines; act as a liaison between site and/or district administrators in gathering and sharing factual information with

the media and public-at-large; acknowledge, coordinate and respond to Public Records Act requests and other similar inquiries in the legally prescribed deadlines; attend Board of Trustees of the Capistrano Unified School District meetings in order to observe and disseminate information relating to the proceedings; and perform other general public relations and communications functions and assignments as required by District.

- 2. Term: Contractor shall commence providing services under this Agreement beginning February 2, 2015, and will diligently perform as required and complete performance ending February 28, 2015, with one (1) one-month extensions, at the option of the Board of Trustees of District or authorized designee.
- 3. Compensation: District agrees to pay Contractor for services rendered pursuant to this Agreement a total fee not to exceed seven thousand five hundred Dollars (\$7,500). Contractor shall bill District at the end of each month that the contract is in effect.
- 4. Expenses: District shall not be liable to Contractor for any costs or expenses paid or incurred by Contractor in performing services for District.
- 5. Independent Contractor: Contractor, in the performance of this Agreement, shall be and act as an independent contractor. Contractor understands and agrees that it and all employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of District, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of District, and/or to which District employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Workers' Compensation. Contractor assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of employees or agents as they relate to the services to be provided under this Agreement. Contractor shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to Contractor's employees.
- 6. Materials: Contractor shall furnish, at its own expense, all labor, materials, equipment, supplies and other items necessary to complete the services to be provided pursuant to this Agreement, except as follows: any printing, postage or other production costs for materials produced are not included within the scope or budget of this contract.

Contractor's services will be performed, findings obtained, reports and recommendations prepared in accordance with generally and currently accepted principles and practices of its profession.

- 7. Originality of Services: [Reserved].
- 8. Copyright/Trademark/Patent: Contractor understands and agrees that all matters produced under this Agreement shall become the property of District and cannot be used without District's express written permission. District shall have all right, title and interest in said matters, including the right to secure and maintain the copyright, trademark and/or patent of said matter in the name of District. Contractor consents to use of Contractor's name in conjunction with the sale, use, performance and distribution of the matters, for any purpose and in any medium.
- 9. Termination: District may, at any time, with or without reason, terminate this Agreement and compensate Contractor only for services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by District shall be sufficient to stop further performance of services by Contractor. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the Contractor or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

District may also terminate this Agreement for cause, which includes, but is not limited to: (a) material violation of this Agreement by Contractor; or (b) any act by Contractor exposing District to liability to others for personal injury or property damage; or (c) Contractor is adjudged bankrupt, Contractor makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors or a receiver is appointed on account of Contractor's insolvency with written notice of intention to terminate. Written notice by District may contain the reasons for such intention to terminate and unless within five (5) days after service of such notice the condition or violation shall cease, or satisfactory arrangements for the correction thereof be made, this Agreement shall, upon the expiration of the fifth (5th) day, cease and terminate. In the event of such termination, District may secure the required services from another contractor. If the cost to District exceeds the cost of providing the service pursuant to this Agreement, the excess cost shall be charged to and collected from Contractor. The foregoing provisions are in addition to and not a limitation of any other rights or remedies available to District. Written notice by District shall be deemed given when received by the other party or no later than three (3) days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

10. Hold Harmless: Contractor agrees to and does herby indemnify, hold harmless and defend District and its governing board, officers, employees and agents from every claim or demand

made and every liability, loss damage or expense, of any nature whatsoever, which may be incurred by reason of:

- (a) Liability for damages for: (1) death or bodily injury to person; (2) injury to, loss or theft of property; or (3) any other loss, damage or expense arising out of (1) or (2) above, sustained by Contractor or any person, firm or corporation employed by Contractor, either directly or by independent contract, upon or in connection with the services called for in this Agreement, however caused, except for liability for damages referred to above which result from the negligence or willful misconduct of District or its officers, employees or agents.
- (b) Any injury to or death of any person(s), including District's officers, employees and agents, or damage to or loss of any property caused by any act, neglect, default, or omission of Contractor, or any person, firm or corporation employed by Contractor, either directly or by independent contract arising out of, or in any way connected with, the services covered by this Agreement, whether said injury or damage occurs either on or off District property, except for liability for damages which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of District or its officers, employees or agents.
- (c) Any liability for damages which may arise from the furnishing or use of any copyrighted or uncopyrighted matter or patented or unpatented invention under this Agreement.
- and automobile liability insurance with limits of One Million Dollars (1,000,000) per occurrence combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage in a form mutually acceptable to both parties to protect Contractor and District against liability or claims of liability which may arise out of this Agreement. In addition, Contractor agrees to provide an endorsement to this policy stating, "Such insurance as is afforded by this policy shall be primary, and any insurance carried by District shall be excess and noncontributory." No later than the actual start date, Contractor shall provide District with certificates of insurance evidencing all coverages and endorsements required hereunder including a thirty (30) day written notice of cancellation or reduction in coverage. Contractor agrees to name District and its governing board, officers, agents and employees as additional insureds under said policy.
- 12. Assignment: The obligations of Contractor pursuant to this Agreement shall not be assigned by Contractor.

- 13. Compliance with Applicable Laws: The services completed herein must meet the approval of District and shall be subject to District's general right of inspection to secure the satisfactory completion thereof. Contractor agrees to comply with all federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances that are now or may in the future become applicable to Contractor, Contractor's business, equipment and personnel engaged in services covered by this Agreement or accruing out of the performance of such services.
- 14. Permits/Licenses: Contractor and all employees or agents shall secure and maintain in force such permits and licenses as are required by law, if any, in connection with the furnishing of services pursuant to this Agreement.
- 15. Employment with Public Agency: Contractor, if an employee of another public agency, agrees that Contractor will not receive salary or remuneration, other than vacation pay, as an employee of another public agency for the actual time in which services are actually being performed pursuant to this Agreement.
- 16. Entire Agreement/Amendment: This Agreement and any exhibits attached hereto constitute the entire Agreement among the parties to it and supersede any prior or contemporaneous understanding or agreement with respect to the services contemplated, and may be amended only by a written amendment executed by both parties to the Agreement.
- 17. Nondiscrimination: Contractor agrees that it will not engage in unlawful discrimination in employment of persons because of race, ethnicity, religion, nationality, disability, gender, marital status or age of such persons.
- 18. Non Waiver: The failure of District or Contractor to seek redress for violation of, or to insist upon, the strict performance of any term or condition of this Agreement shall not be deemed a waiver by that party of such term or condition, or prevent a subsequent similar act from again constituting a violation of such term or condition.

Notice: All notices or demands to be given under this Agreement by either party to the other shall be in writing and given either by: (a) personal service or (b) by U.S. Mail, mailed either by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage prepaid. Service shall be considered

given when received if personally served or if mailed on the third day after deposit in any U.S. Post Office. The address to which notices or demands may be given by either party may be changed by written notice given in accordance with the notice provisions of this section. Conduct a total compensation and management organization review analyzing current management job descriptions to ensure current scope of work is accurately reflected in identified job descriptions. In addition, current work calendars will be reviewed to ensure the number of days identified appropriately corresponds to accomplishing the duties and responsibilities of job classifications. Provide recommendations to revise and update management job descriptions, work calendars, and comparative compensation information as well as pertinent District policies.

Issues considered during the review will include, but are not limited to:

- Review of Management Organizational Structure and Comparison to Comparable Districts
- Teaching Assistant Principals, Counselors, and School Psychologists Positions
- Recommendations

Step 5: Final Presentation and Follow Up

A draft report will be provided to the Superintendent or designee for comment upon completion of the analysis. Following delivery of the final report, members of our team will also be available to present an overview of the report at a Board meeting.

XIV. AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, dated March 1, 2015	, in the County of Orange, State of
California, is by and between Capistrano Unified School	District, (hereinafter referred to as
"District"), and <u>G. A. Dominguez</u>	, (hereinafter referred to as
"CONTRACTOR").	

The District and the CONTRACTOR, for the consideration stated herein, agree as follows:

- 1. CONTRACTOR agrees to complete the Project known as BID NO. 1415-17, MOVEMENT AND RECONFIGURATION OF RELOCATABLE BUILDINGS according to all the terms and conditions set forth in the Project Documents, including but not limited to the Notice Calling For Bids, Information for Bidders, Bid Form, Bid Security, Designation of Subcontractors, Information Required of Bidder, all prequalification forms submitted pursuant to Public Contract Code Section 20111.5, if any, Noncollusion Affidavit, Workers' Compensation Certificate, Faithful Performance Bond, Payment Bond, Drug-Free Workplace Certification, Criminal Records Check Certification, Insurance Certificates and Endorsements, Guarantees, Contractor's Certificate Regarding Non-Asbestos Containing Materials, Disabled Veteran Business Enterprises Certification, if applicable, General Conditions, Supplemental Conditions, if any, Special Conditions, if any, Drawings, Specifications, and all modifications, addenda and amendments thereto by this reference incorporated herein. The Project Documents are complementary, and what is called for by any one shall be as binding as if called for by all.
- CONTRACTOR shall perform within the time set forth in Paragraph 4 of this Agreement everything required to be performed, and shall provide, furnish and pay for all the labor, materials, necessary tools, expendable equipment, and all taxes, utility and transportation services required for construction of the Project. All of said work shall be performed and completed in a good workmanlike manner in strict accordance with the drawings, specifications and all provisions of this Agreement as hereinabove defined and in accordance with applicable laws, codes, regulations, ordinances and any other legal requirements governing the Project. The CONTRACTOR shall be liable to the District for any damages arising as a result of a failure to fully comply with this obligation, and the CONTRACTOR shall not be excused with respect to any failure to so comply by any act or omission of the Architect, Engineer, Inspector, Division of State Architect, or representative of any of them, unless such act or omission actually prevents the CONTRACTOR from fully complying with the requirements of the Project Documents, and unless the CONTRACTOR protests at the time of such alleged prevention that the act or omission is preventing the CONTRACTOR from fully complying with the Project Documents. Such protest shall not be effective unless reduced to writing and filed with the District within three (3) working days of the date of occurrence of the act or omission preventing the CONTRACTOR from fully complying with the Project Documents.
- 3. District shall pay to the CONTRACTOR, as full consideration for the faithful performance of this Agreement, subject to any additions or deductions as provided in the Project Documents, the unit prices as specified in attached bid price sheet.

MOVEMENT AND RECONFIGURATION OF RELOCATABLE BUILDINGS

- 4. The work shall be commenced on or before the seventh (7th) day after receiving the District'S Notice to Proceed and shall be completed within **thirty (30)** consecutive calendar days from the date specified in the Notice to Proceed. The initial term of this agreement will be for one year, with two (2) one year renewal periods, at the option of the Board of Trustees, for a total contract term not to exceed 36 months.
- 5. Time is of the essence. If the work is not completed in accordance with Paragraph 4 above, it is understood that the District will suffer damage. It being impractical and infeasible to determine the amount of actual damage, in accordance with Government Code Section 53069.85, it is agreed that CONTRACTOR shall pay to District as fixed and liquidated damages, and not as a penalty, the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for each calendar day of delay until work is completed and accepted. Time extensions may be granted by the District as provided in Article 63 of the General Conditions. Liquidated damages shall be imposed as set forth in Article 63 of the General Conditions.
- 6. Termination for Cause or Nonappropriation. In the event CONTRACTOR defaults in the performance of the Agreement as set forth in General Conditions Article 13(a) or if there is a nonappropriation of funds or insufficient funds as set forth in General Conditions Article 13(d), then this Agreement shall terminate or be suspended as set forth in General Conditions Article 13.

Termination for Convenience. District has discretion to terminate this Agreement at any time and require CONTRACTOR to cease all work on the Project by providing CONTRACTOR written notice of termination specifying the desired date of termination. Upon receipt of written notice from District of such termination for District'S convenience, CONTRACTOR shall:

- (i) Cease operations as directed by District in the notice;
- (ii) Take any actions necessary, or that District may direct, for the protection and preservation of the work; and
- (iii) Not terminate any insurance provisions required by the Project Documents.

In case of such termination for District'S convenience, CONTRACTOR shall be entitled to receive payment from District for work satisfactorily executed and for proven loss with respect to materials, equipment, and tools, including overhead and profit for that portion of the work completed. In the case of Termination for Convenience, District shall have the right to accept assignment of subcontractors. The foregoing provisions are in addition to and not in limitation of any other rights or remedies available to the District.

7. The CONTRACTOR agrees to and does hereby indemnify and hold harmless the District, its Governing Board, officers, agents, and employees from every claim or demand made, and every liability, loss, damage, or expense, of any nature whatsoever, which may be incurred by reason of:

- (a) Any injury to or death of any person(s) or damage to, loss or theft of any property sustained by the CONTRACTOR or any person, firm or corporation employed by the CONTRACTOR, either directly or by independent contract, upon or in connection with the work called for in this AGREEMENT, except for liability resulting from the sole active negligence, or willful misconduct of the District.
- (b) Any injury to or death of any person(s) or damage, loss or theft of any property caused by any act, neglect, default or omission of the CONTRACTOR, or any person, firm, or corporation employed by the CONTRACTOR, either directly or by independent contract, arising out of, or in any way connected with the work covered by this Agreement, whether said injury or damage occurs either on or off District property, if the liability arose due to the negligence or willful misconduct of anyone employed by the CONTRACTOR, either directly or by independent contract,

The CONTRACTOR, at CONTRACTOR'S own expense, cost, and risk shall defend any and all actions, suits, or other proceedings that may be brought or instituted against the District, its Governing Board, officers, agents or employees, on any such claim, demand or liability, and shall pay or satisfy any judgment that may be rendered against the District, its Governing Board, officers, agents or employees in any action, suit or other proceedings as a result thereof.

- 8. Hold Harmless and Indemnification. - (f) any failure to act in such a manner as to protect the District and the Project from loss, cost, expense or liability; or
- (g) any failure to protect the property of any utility company or property owner.

This indemnity shall survive termination of the contract or final payment thereunder. This indemnity is in addition to any other rights or remedies which the District may have under the law or under the Project Documents. In the event of any claim or demand made against any party which is entitled to be indemnified hereunder, the District may in its sole discretion reserve, retain or apply any monies due to the CONTRACTOR under the Project Documents for the purpose of resolving such claims; provided, however, that the District may release such funds if the CONTRACTOR provides the District with reasonable assurance of protection of the District'S interests. The District shall in its sole discretion determine whether such assurances are reasonable.

CONTRACTOR shall take out, prior to commencing the work, and maintain, during the life of this Agreement, and shall require all subcontractors, if any, whether primary or secondary, to take out and maintain the insurance coverages set forth below and in Articles 16, 17, 18 and 19 of the General Conditions. CONTRACTOR agrees to provide all evidences of coverage required by District including certificates of insurance and endorsements.

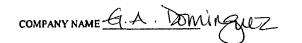

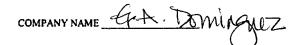

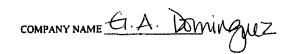
