

ACCIDENTS

Although the district makes every reasonable effort to prevent student accidents and injuries, accidents occur from time-to-time. The Executive Director, Compliance/Health Services, shall, in cooperation with the District nurse, principals, and health technicians, develop procedures to ensure that first aid and/or medical attention is provided as quickly as possible in such events and that parents/guardians are notified of accidents.

Universal precautions shall be observed whenever it is possible that students, employees or others may have contact with blood or body fluids as a result of the accident.

At each school site, at least one administrator and/or one classified employee, as well as all secondary level athletic coaches, shall receive training in CPR and emergency first aid techniques.

District staff shall appropriately report and document student accidents.
