<u>Desired Results Developmental Profile</u> (DRDP)

The DRDP is a statewide accountability and progress assessment system that measures the progress of California's Preschool and Transitional Kindergarten aged children with Individualized Education Programs. (IEPs)



A combination of the curricular approaches incorporates the following:

- Learning areas or centers for small groups
- A balance between child-directed play and exploration and teacher-led small groups and large groups
- Content that is determined by individual student needs
- Recognition that learning occurs even in daily routines such as arrival and departure, snacks and meals, hand washing, toileting, cleanup, and transitions from activity to activity.

Activities are presented through rich play based practices guided by the California Learning Foundations, California Preschool Curriculum Framework, Thematic Based Curriculum, and the DRDP.
