How do Traffickers Target Kids?



- Traffickers use Social Media
 - Instagram, Snapchat, Twitter, TikTok, Facebook
- Target the Victim
 - Study the victim's posts across all media outlets
- Gain Trust
 - They spend time earning their trust
- Meet Their Needs
 - They pretend to understand and care about them
 - They make them feel loved, beautiful, cared for

Vulnerable Youth

- Kids whose posts express:
 - o Fear
 - o Emptiness
 - Disappointment
- Indicators of:
 - Substance Abuse
 - Runaway Activity
 - Home Instability

What's Happening with Our Kids? We Asked Them!

• 14% of students said they have been a victim of "catfishing" someone lying about who they are.

• 21% of students told us that they met up with someone in person after meeting them online.

• 56% of students told us that someone they don't know IRL has commented on their post. What were some of those comments?

What was the most inappropriate thing that has happened to you on social media?

- I have been reached out to by random accounts to "model" for their brand in return for free clothing or other products from the brand, but I always block the account when it happens.
- Older people adding you and doing weird stuff on their live.
- Got sent a dick pick by a grown man.
- An old man was wanting me to send him pictures for money (he is blocked now though).
- I have had multiple "sugar daddies," "sugar mommas," and other older figures contact me through my DMs/chats on both Instagram and Snapchat. Normally, they start by calling me "cute" or telling me that I'm "pretty," and they offer me money/nude pictures.

What's Happening with Our Kids? We Asked Them!

 35% stated that they don't know about default settings publicly sharing their location.

• 24.2% Said they never even thought of this.


Prevention Increasing the Well-Being of the Whole Child

MTSS Focus: Appropriate Use of Social Media



Prevention School Counselors addressing The Whole Child (Tier one)

Social and Emotional Domain - manage emotions, positive relationships, responsible decisions

- 1. Social Media Safety
- 2. Signs of Suicide
- 3. Stress and Anxiety Prevention/Management
- 4. Social and Emotional Learning

Academic Domain - knowledge, skills, and attitudes to be successful

- 1. Academic Planning
- 2. Academic Intervention Services

College and Career Readiness-strength based all students have ability to be successful

- 1. Classroom College and Career lessons
- 2. Post-Secondary Planning

Research shows that these populations are at higher risk

- Runaway Youth.
- Homeless youth Mckenny-Vento.
- Children in Foster Care/ child welfare system.
- Young people who have been in the juvenile justice system.
- Students who drop out of school.
- Student with developmental and intellectual disabilities
- LGBTQ+ Community

How do schools help those students who are more "at-risk"? (Tier 2 and 3)

- Our <u>School Resource Officer</u> intervenes in crisis situations.
- Our <u>Bilingual Community Liaison</u> works closely with our McKenny-Vento (homeless) and other at-risk populations.
- Our School Counselors:
 - 1. Re-entry meetings for students in the Juvenile justice system
 - 2. Work directly with social workers to help foster youth.
 - 3. Have strict protocol for handling student crises. For example: suspected sexual or physical abuse, criminal activity and suicidal ideations etc.




