Whether you approach a provider in person, inquire over the phone, or by email, it may be helpful to explain that you are inquiring on behalf of someone who has special needs and you would like to ask a few questions about the program. We realize that not all of these questions may apply to your situation, but you may use them as a guideline to ask relevant questions for your family.

- Do you currently serve any individuals with physical or intellectual disabilities that you know of at this time?
- What is your adult to student ratio for classes and/or activities offered?
- How is your staff trained on providing services for individuals with disabilities?
- Can you provide the additional support my child needs, such as toileting, feeding? (Feel free to share examples of any specific assistance needed.)

The specific details of these programs may change periodically. Please contact the program directly to find out the current costs involved. In addition, you may want to contact the city you live in to request a current listing of recreation activities.

members who have special needs. To help make the process easier, the Transportation Security Administration (TSA) can provide a Passenger Support Specialist. Families concerned about the check point process or who need special accommodation can ask a TSA officer or supervisor for help from a Passenger Support Specialist. Parents may also call the TSA Cares hotline at 1-855-787-2227 ahead of time to ensure a Passenger Support Specialist can be onsite when needed. You may also request assistance through the TSA screening checkpoint by completing the form on the link <https://www.tsa.gov/contact-center/form/cares>.

Chairs are most commonly available from a lifeguard or the entrance kiosk at a beach, although a few are handled by concessionaires whose names appear on the list. Some may be reserved ahead of time, while others are available on a first-come, first-served basis. It is recommended to call ahead for availability. Blue Mobi-Mat

Huntington Beach has rolled out a Mobi-Mat to improve accessibility for visitors with disabilities, parents with strollers, and others with limited mobility. Located next to the parking lot at 6th Street and PCH, the mat serves as a stable walkway that safely leads guests across the sand and to the water's edge (during high tide).

California State Library Park Pass: You can now check out a FREE vehicle day-use pass at your local public library. State Parks are providing free vehicle day-use entry to over 200 participating state park units operated by State Parks to **library-card holders**. The California State Library Parks Pass is valid for entry of one passenger vehicle with capacity of nine people or less or one highway licensed motorcycle. California public library-card holders can check out the State Library Parks Pass via their local public library. If you don't have a library card, visit your local library to get one. CA State Park Pass: Any individual served by RCOC can apply for a discount pass which allows for use of all basic facilities (including day use parking, camping, and boat/day use parking fees) at any unit of the California State Park system operated by the State Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR) except for Hearst San Simeon SHM. The discount does not apply to fees under \$3. The lifetime pass is available for \$3.50. If the park charges per person, the individual with disabilities will get in free; if the park charges per vehicle, all passengers in the vehicle will enter free of charge. Please contact your RCOC Service Coordinator for additional information and/or application. *

* Park Passes: The pass will not be honored at state park units operated by federal or local government and private agencies or concessionaires. Also, the pass is not valid for per-person entry or tour fees (such as museums), boat use, camping, group use or sites, special events, additional/extra vehicle fees,
