The Capistrano Unified School District's Home B.A.S.E. classes are designed to meet the needs of secondary special education students whose behavior and social/emotional needs require a smaller, more structured and individualized environment. In addition to academics, the program focuses on social thinking and the emotional and behavioral needs of the students. Support for students in this program is provided by certificated special education teachers, itinerant staff, and trained instructional support staff members. The program is designed to meet the individual needs of each student according to their Individualized Education Program (IEP).

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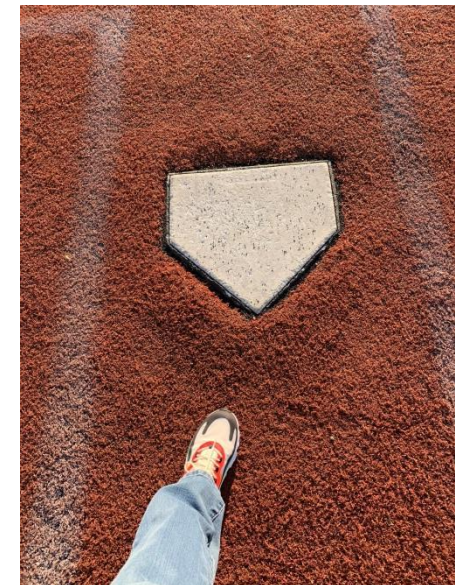

Home B.A.S.E. Classroom Standards

- Same general education curriculum as school site
- Class-wide and individual reinforcement systems

- Clear definition of criteria to mainstream
- Curriculum to build self-monitoring ability and behavior accountability

- Staff highly trained in evidence-based practices with a focus on an Applied Behavioral Analysis (ABA) approach.

Designated Instruction and Services (D.I.S.)/Related Services

These services, also known as related or supplementary services, may be required to assist a student with special needs to benefit from their education. These related services are agreed upon by a student's IEP team and may include:

- Transportation
- Speech/Language Therapy
- Adapted Physical Education
- Physical Therapy
- Occupational Therapy
- Assistive Technology Support

Goal of the Program

The goal of the Home B.A.S.E. class is to provide an academically challenging environment which is nurturing and supportive. This environment will support each student in developing the necessary coping skills needed to self-regulate their emotions and give them the necessary tools to transition to a least restrictive environment.

Positive Intervention Model

Students participate in a student driven reinforcement system that has clearly defined, achievable classroom expectations. School wide expectations are reinforced through the school site Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports (PBIS) model.
