The Capistrano Unified School District's TBIC classes are designed to meet the needs of secondary special education students whose social/emotional needs require a smaller, more structured and individualized environment. Classes are located at several middle school and high school campuses. In addition to academics, the program focuses on the emotional and behavioral needs of the students. Support for students in this program is provided by certificated special education teachers, itinerant staff, and trained instructional support staff members. The program is designed to meet the individual needs of each student according to their Individualized Education Program (IEP).

Students participate in a student driven reinforcement system that has clearly defined, achievable classroom expectations. Schoolwide expectations are reinforced through the school site Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports (PBIS) model.
