

MAINTENANCE PAINTER

DEFINITION

Under supervision, to perform skilled work in painting and surface preparation; and to assist in semiskilled and skilled duties in other maintenance trades.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES

The following duties are typical for this classification. Incumbents may not perform all of the listed duties and/or may be required to perform additional or different duties from those set forth below to address business needs and changing business practices.

1. Uses a brush, roller, conventional and airless spray equipment to apply paint, varnish, stains, and lacquers to the interior and exteriors of buildings, furniture and equipment.
2. Prepares surfaces by sandblasting, scraping, sanding, sealing or washing; fills holes, cracks, and joints with putty, plaster, or other filler.
3. Sizes and tints new plaster walls and other surfaces; tapes joints, textures, primes, and paints walls; applies undercoats and finish coats to a variety of surfaces.
4. Mixes paints and matches colors; may prepare walls and hang wall coverings.
5. Erects, moves, and works from scaffolding, platforms, and ladders; operates and works from hydraulic lifts.
6. Cleans brushes and tools, and maintains painting equipment and shop area in a clean and organized condition.
7. Fabricates and paints wood signs and attaches to structures or posts; drives posts into the ground to hang signs.
8. Engraves plastic signs, such as name plates.
9. Applies line stripes to parking lots and athletic courts; lays out stencils and paints logos and symbols on concrete and asphalt surfaces.
10. Operates sandblasting and paint removal equipment; plans and organizes assignments effectively.
11. Estimates labor and material needed; maintains records of work performed and materials used.
12. May measure, cut, and install glass to specifications.
13. Drives a District vehicle to and from work sites.
14. Loads and unloads trucks; transports, lifts, and carries painting supplies, tools, and equipment.
15. Handles toxic and caustic materials safely.
16. Moves furniture and equipment to complete painting jobs; may provide direction to maintenance assistants.
17. Performs other related duties as required.

QUALIFICATIONS

Knowledge of:

Methods, materials, tools, and equipment used in painting; methods of preparing a variety of surfaces for painting or repainting; safe working methods and procedures.

Ability to:

Skillfully mix paint, match colors, prepare and paint a variety of surfaces; use and care for painting equipment, tools and supplies; use hazardous materials safely; work from scaffolding, platforms, ladders and hydraulic lifts; perform heavy manual labor; maintain simple records; communicate effectively; understand and carry out oral and written instructions; establish and maintain cooperative working relationships; comply with the District's customer service standards, as outlined in Board policy.

Education/Experience:

Any combination equivalent to: Formal or informal education or training that ensures the ability to read and write at a level necessary for successful job performance; three years experience as a skilled painter. Three years as a CUSD Maintenance Worker or two years as a CUSD employee with one year of painting experience will be considered qualifying for Maintenance Painter Trainee.

License/Certificate Requirement:

Possession of a valid California Driver's License.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS AND WORKING ENVIRONMENT

The conditions herein are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential functions of this job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential job functions.

Environment: Work is performed in an indoor and outdoor setting; with travel from site to site, working from heights and within confined spaces, potential exposure to all types of weather and temperature conditions, noise, dust, grease, fumes, heights, and potentially hazardous chemicals, solvents, and oils.

Physical: Primary functions require sufficient physical ability and mobility to work in an indoor and outdoor school campus setting; lift, carry, push, pull or otherwise move moderately heavy to heavy loads; walk long distances around campus; bend, stoop, squat, and reach; climb ladders; verbally communicate to exchange information.

Vision: See in the normal visual range with or without correction.

Hearing: Hear in the normal audio range with or without correction.
